- 1. This memorandum contains a recommendation submitted for the Director's approval. Such recommendation is contained in paragraph 3.
- 2. Subject is a former senior operational case officer of the Soviet Committee the State Security (AGH) with the rank of risjor, who defected to the west on 15 December 1961 and requested political asylum in the United States. Subject was accompanied by his wife and daughter, Subject has already made an outstanding contribution to the intelligence and counterintelligence mission of the United States Covernment by furnishing valuable information of first priority concern to the National Security. This Agency and the Federal Bureau of Investigation continue to exploit his knowledgestality on Soviet intelligence operations in many parts of the world. Attachment "A" contains a detailed justification for use of the previsions of Section 7, Public Law 110, as amended, to grant permanent residence in the United States to Subject, his wife, and daughting.
- 3. I introduce recommend that Subject, his wife, and daughter be granted hermanent residence in the United States under the provisions of Section 7, Public Law 110, as amended.

Subject is a former senior operational case officer, a major in the Soviet Consistee for State Security (NUB), who defected to the West on 15 December 1961 with his wife Swetlana and his daughter Tatyana. Prior to his defection, Subject was stationed in the Soviet Embassy in Melsinki under the cover of Third Secretary and under the name of Anatoliy Mikhailovich NLDOV. He had arrived at this post in July 1960, secompanied by his wife and drughter, and had been engaged since that time in counterintelligence operations against American, Reitish, French, Italian and Japanese targets. On 15 December 1961, Subject contacted the CIA representative in Helsinki at the latter's home and requested asylum in the United States. On 16 December 1961, Subject and his family flow

2. Subject first entered Soviet State Security work in August 1945, at which time he was enrolled in the First Moscow School, GUER/HKD/SMERSER, a school for counterintelligance officers in the Soviet armed forces. Upon graduation from this school in June 1946, he was assigned to the Eastern Section of the SK Department (security of Soviet citizens abroad) of the First Chief Directorate (foreign directorate)of the MIB as an Assistant Operational Case Officer. When the Committee of Information (KI) was established in 1947, incorporating the intelligence functions of State Security, Soviet military intelligence (GEU) and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Subject continued in his former activity in the newly formed Wifth Department of the Third Directorate of the Ki. Between September 1948 and August 1950, Subject attended the two-year Higher Intelligence School of the KI (formarly and presently the State Security Higher Intelligence School), completing the Counterintelligence curriculum. Upon the conclusion of his schooling, Subject returned as an operational

Case Officer to his former function, which by that time was performed by the SK Section of the Eastern Department of the First Directorate of the MTB. In September, 1951, Subject transferred to the Anglo-American Section of the Counterintelligence Department of the First Directorate, He became a Senior Operational Case Officer in Hovember 1961. Subject continued in this capacity through an MIB structural reorganimation in December 1951, and was appointed Chief of the American Desk of the Counterintelligence Department of the Chief Intelligence Directorate (foreign directorate) of the MGB following another reorganization in December 1952. In April 1953, he was assigned as Deputy Chief of the Enigre Desk of the Counterintelligence Department of the Se cond Chief Directorate (Foreign Directorate) of the MVD, following still another recognization in about April 1953 after the death of Joseph Stellin. In October 1953, Subject was assigned to the State Security Residency in Visnos, becoming an Operational Case Officer in the Emigre Group, under cover of Senior Referent of the Information Department of the High Commission in Austria. He was accompanied by his wife. In August 1954,

be was transferred in Vienna to the British Sub-Group of the Antlo-American-French Group of the KUB Residency where he worked on counterintelligence matters. Subject returned to the USSR in August 1955 and entered the Juridical Institute of the four-year Higher School of the MIB, where he studied counterintelligence work. Upon graduation in September 1959, Subject was assigned to the "Western Treaty Organimations" Direction of the Information Department of the First Chief Directorate (Foreign Firectorate) of the KUB. In April 1960, he was transferred to the imprican Section of the Counterintelligence Department of the First Chief Directorate, and from there, sent to Helsinki in July 1960. Subject was a Komsomol member from May 1942 until April 1945, a candidate member of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union from April 1945 until April 1947, and a member of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union from April 1947 until his defection. Subject has provided a considerable amount of information on Soviet State Security operations, methods and per somalities which has been accurate and consistent with the estimated knowledgeability of an individual with his position and

3. The bona fides of Subject was established as of 18 hand 1962.

Subject has been interrogated on his biographic data and has been debriefed upon substantive matters within the areas of his knowledge and experience.

Subject's wife has been debriefed upon her biographic data. Subject was given a technical examination on a form of 1962 with formall results.

So evidence has been uncovered that indicates Subject was instructed by the KUB to defect for short or long term operational purposes or that his story of himself or his defection is not true. Actually, the value of the information to the U.S. Subject has already given and the corresponding damage to the KUB is evidence tending to support the bona files of Subject.

4. Subjects have been examined by CIA medical and psychiatric officers and have been found to be qualified for Agency-sponsored invagration to the United States under Section 7, Public Iaw 110, as amended.

Utilization. Subject has acquired considerable knowledge and experience from his service since 1946 as a Staff Officer of the KUB and has already given CIA certain counterintelligence information which has been of considerable value and upon the basis of which immediate action has been taken by CIA and other elements of the U.S. Covernment. SUMBET mm professes to other areas of knowledgeability concerning counterintelligence and, to a far lesser extent, military, economic and political matters, and claims to be able to plan and execute a political action program to negate Soviet operations abroad and discredit the Soviet regime generally. Subject will continue to be debriefed by the SR Division for the purpose of obtaining additional information on the aforementioned subjects and will then be made available at the appropriate time to other components of CIA and the WHB community in conjunction with the CDC for further purposeful debriefing. In addition, it may be possible to exploit Subject directly in CA or CE activities. Subsequent to this exploitation of Subject, he will be resettled in the U.S. This resettlement will impose no further financial burden on CIA inesmuch as

Subject has been given tax free \$200,000.00/6 will be requested to participate in these resettlement plans after certain sensitive aspects of his debriefing have been completed.

6. The SR Division recommends that Subject, his wife, and his daughter be granted permanent residence in the United States under Section 7, Public Law 110, as smended. Subject's membership in the Homeome's during the period May 1942 to April 1945, his candidate membership in the Communist Party from April 1945 until April 1947, and his membership in the Communist party from Aril 1947 until his defection on 15 December 1961 precludes the legalization of his edmission into the United States for permanent residence under other existing immigration lass. Subjects are presently in the United States under parole proecdures. The SR Division has agreed to assume primary responsibility for Subjects during the exploitation phase and 00/C will be requested to acrist in the resettlement of Subject thereafter. Subjects' motivation, background, and progress to date in adjusting to life in the American economy leads us to believe that their further assimilation into American seciety will be successfully socceplished.
