

FACTORS INFLUENCING

1. A KLAIBERL informed us he was related to [Chief of Mission] <sup>27</sup>  
Bielinski, indicating he was a representative of U. S. Inter-  
ests.
2. He requested asylum in the United States and did so in  
writing. In so doing and as a result of his detection, he  
demanded that he receive protection, which he was granted.
3. He has been proved beyond reasonable doubt to be a genuine  
defector and has provided actual and reliable types of valuable  
intelligence information, principally of a CI nature.
4. He is in the United States paroled to CIA; he has not yet  
been legally established for residence.
5. He apparently is convinced that both he and the informants  
he has is of most exceptional value to the USG, has in-  
sisted on disseminating info with the highest levels of the  
U. S. Government, and has insisted on a very large sum of  
money and virtual carte blanche to use it for propaganda  
and political action operations directed against the USSR.
6. He has reacted with indignation to the suggestion that he  
be put on a salary of approximately \$1000.00 per month

and his case officer believes he would react similarly to  
an offer of a payment of \$10,000, with additional sums and  
benefits dependent upon his further cooperation.

9. He has suggested that if his demands are not met, he be made  
available to some other government which would appreciate  
his property and recognize his value, apparently, by accept-  
ing the same kind of demands he has made of the United States  
Government.
