STATUS

Despite reports and accusations to the contrary (MWV 177), the Student Revolutionary Directorate is responding to KGBARK guidance and control with increasing flexibility. Their withdrawal from the AUSA's control (MWV 176) and subsequent condemnation of prisoner releases (MWV 179) has been a morale boost for their clandestine organization within PRAGMA as well as serve to their frustration of KGBARK qualified support: namely, closer scrutiny of funding, limited and professional infiltration of their agents, and denial of support for their independent maritime effort. While some 10 of their fully trained KGBARK infiltration agents are still entering the clock and being, the PRAGMA Executive Committee has turned to the ARKARK project for some imaginative and effective operations.

1. PRAGMA PROJECT:

1. Support and Progress:

- a. Total number of candidates processed to date: 75
- b. Total number assigned: 40 (See attached Status List)
- c. Total assigned during April 1962: 3
- d. Total Financial Expenditures: Substances: \$12,109.00
Operations: 1,515.00

2. Operations:

- a. By 9 April 1962, the radio network by ARKARK directed against the Cuban area had been improved to 11 countries and totalled about 100 programs per month. (MWV 3733)
- b. About 13 April, ARKARK delegates to 15 countries were sent about 60,000 leaflets with a 35-minute and address list for coastal area mailing operation. (MWV 3811)
- c. Excerpts from Underwood Press and reports from ARKARK to US and Guyana: have indicated that much of the public interest and agitation for Guyana's break in diplomatic relations with PRAGMA was generated by ARKARK agit/prop operations which began with the dissemination of 10,000 leaflets the presidential palace in January. (MWV 4011)

- d. On 21 April 1962, AMBASSADORS and 6D reported their theft of a Soviet cell phone at the National Airport in Washington. This was turned over to the Washington Station contact and WATS is checking on this currently.
- e. Acting on headquarters proposal (AIR 0425) to send a student agit/prop through night committee in Africa in preparation for forthcoming student congresses, an AMBASSADOR team of four is preparing materials, documentation, itinerary, action plan and contacts for this tour. (WATS 2474, WATS 3057)
- f. During April, in Venezuela, [redacted] (an AMBASSADOR styled by Station) and AMBASSADORS (requested by station) continued training and organization of Action Democratic youth in guerrilla warfare and anti-communist tactics. This activity is reported under station direction.
- g. In Ecuador, the "Action Anti-Communist Roadblock" organized by AMBASSADORS and 6D is now estimated to total about 5,000 persons with detachments in each major city in Ecuador. The struggle into the hinterlands has reached the stage that FBI and WATS group is being trained and prepared in the "Medicine" Indian district.
- h. In Uruguay, the "Revolution de Recuperacion Moral" university is organized by AMBASSADORS, its leadership now generated all faculties of the University in their struggle against the Communist dominated FUR (Federacion Universitaria Revolucionaria Uruguay).

3. Pins and Potential:

- a. Financial support to the AMBASSADORS project must be accelerated for operational. There is an obvious lack of proportion between salaries and operational funds, especially in view of their potential as recognized by CIA, Task Force W and AMBASSADORS.
- b. AMBASSADORS as a station has not recognized the urgency of assignment of case officers for AMBASSADORS development alone. All station activities at present are centered to the processing and the operational potential is neglected.
- c. When WATS is properly staffed and AMBASSADORS are full strength, the following potential exists:
 - 1-Third country operations against the denied area for intelligence
 - 2-Third country operations against the denied area for agit/prop, and generation of international reputation to the CIA.
 - 3-Internal student and youth organizations with overt and covert activities designed to counteract and combat communist penetration in schools and universities of all Latin America.

II. AMINTS

1. Support and Processing:

- a. Financial support for AMINT operations in PERAZIA for April consisted of \$7,000.00 sent in through the black market exchange. \$25,000.00 bonds have been vouchers and are awaiting infiltration of AMINT scheduled for 10 May 1952. During April \$725.00 was sent in \$25.00 money orders for funding families of AMINT members in their departure.
- b. AMINT courier a message to Miami requesting a list of electronic supplies for two small radio sets and preparation of electronic detecting devices. AMINT is working on procurement of these items which are to be sent in partly in diplomatic pouch and partly in infiltration operations.
- c. WAVE was processed AMINT-52 as their Zedop who is expected to begin training by the end of April. Subject is in the process of evaluation and LCPUTTER.

2. Operations:

- a. AMINT clandestine teams spent the first week in April pasting black GAE signs in Xirone, Yucabo, Fortanco, to walls and cars.
- b. Also during the first week, a bomb was exploded in a Casagney college setting fire to the auditorium.
- c. During early April a bomb was exploded in front of the Marishee Municipal government offices.
- d. A report from their Action team in Havana Province indicates their last cache of 400 lbs of G-3 plastic is almost exhausted.
- e. During the entire month of April, AMINT clandestine have worked along the north coast of Matanzas collecting operational intelligence for forthcoming supply operations. This information should be available sometime during May and June.
- f. During the third week in April, agit/prog teams pasted GAE signs on automobiles throughout the general greater Havana area.
- g. During the first two weeks, more than 10,000 copies of "Trilete" the official GAE organ, were printed and distributed in Havana, Matanzas, Pinar del Rio and Oriente.

- h. AGINT prog teams are preparing "Comos" (funding certificates) in small concentrations for internal support.
- i. A courier message requalifying electronic supplies for small radio plants and electronic decoders is currently being studied for procurement by AGINT and will be shipped in by diplomatic pouches and infiltration when procured.
- j. AGINT action teams in northern Matanzas are buying cane and henequen fields using small canoes as time delay ignitars.

A. Training:

- a. AGINT-53 entered clandestine tradecraft training in preparation for his PABLOX infiltration scheduled for about 10 May 1962.
- b. 14 Trained AGINTS awaiting infiltration in Miami have been procuring weapons locally and going out into the overgrown area for small arms practice, and holding classes on general theory review of their training on sabotage, demolition and guerrilla warfare.
- c. AGINT insertion section has a secure base at Miller's dock in Marathon where they have their JMWAVE II berthed. They have crew quarters and have fully equipped the vessel with the exception of radar at their own expense. On 26 April a shakedown run was made from base to Gibco Key through Varadero and Cardenas area and return to base. All equipment operated well and AGINT-40, 41, 42, and 43 were on the crew. If WAVE support for their operations is not approved it can be expected that they will make every effort to operate independently and without the vital coordination for such operations.
