ICRANOV's a wife came up to COSTILLE near the end of the party when COSTILLS was talking to Iden-11ty 7. LIPSKIN subortly left, and LUSANOV's's wife and COSTILLE continued talking for about 20 minutes. She looks to be in her late twenties, is quite attractive and was nicely dresped. She is a little shy but is quite well poised and does not seem ill at ease in talking with westerners. She also made a good impression on the others present, including the wives. She will obviously be an asset to LOBANCV I in his diplomatic career. She speaks some English, but her vocabulary is quite limited. She seems to be fairly well educated, and she referred once or twice to "the institute in Moscow" which she had attended. She said she was born in the north Caucasus. Politics were not discussed at all. She made no derogatory comments about their lest post in I Oslo , nor about Dermark or toe United States. She said she liked living in Cslo j and thought it a beautiful country.

3. We do not know LOBANCV's a motive in tringing up A LADLE's mane. COSTILLE and LOBANCV , were standing alone at the time but the room was crowded and several groups of people sere talking nearby. I LORANOV's question about wilkall was very atter-of-fact, and he did not lower his voice or ask the question in a furtive manner. However, the room was fairly noisy, and LOBANOV would have probably realised that the conversation could not be overheard. It is somewhat strange he referred to AHLADLE by "GOLUBTSIN" 6 name rather than the actual name A: LADL's used in Helsinki. If LOBAROV had mentioned the name AcidDic used in Helsinkil, COSTILLE would have probably admitted knowing AMLADLA. To have done otherwise would have been an obvious lie. we can only guess at this stage of the contact that ! LOBANOV was simply interested in finding out what happened to ANIADLE. It would seem logical that LOBANOV had known previously that COUTLINE has had some contact with AEL-DLR in Helsinki. Ferhaps LORANOV's's motive will become evident in subsequent contacts. As of this writing he has not attempted to recontact COSTILLE. We will keep Headquarters informed.
