1. Here is a samuel to the information given in the reference. On Nednosday morains, D December, about (S.O hours, VII INE/a salled Pooding at Proding's home and said that he would like to use us on an ungreat matter. We met him helf am bour later, and he told as the following story. Grigoriy To COLE had resorted to VALIMAL that a western agent 07 had been arrested in the Soviet Union near Batrs, but on the Soviet side of the border. GOIDS had said that the egent had been recruited in Switzerland and dispatched across the border on 18 May of this year. The agent had come to Relainti on 17 May and had been met by a man described as between 55 and 58 years old, about 180 cm. tall; the man smoked a pipe, epoke good Roglish and passable Firmish. This man had driven the agent to the Finnish border in a Dodge automobile, bearing the license plate BF-158, on the 16th of May.

- 2. Whom VALINK/8 began the investigation of this report, he found that the Bodge our was owned by VADAW/1 s firm and thought therefore that we might be involved. Since he wanted to wern us, he took it upon himself to call Roodine to tip Roodine off in case it night be necessary to get the driver of the car out of the country before the investigation closed Of in around him. Rooding thanker of the for his tip and said he would shock into the matter to find on if there was any substance to it. Roodine promised to call VALTER/S by 1830 hours that afternoon.
- 3. Accordingly, we checked with our three military attaches offices with negative results and then decided to go to VIIIVIA himself to find out if he had even loaned his car for any such trips or was somehow involved indirectly. The answer with him was also negative, and it now appears likely that this whole story is a provocation, concocted by the Soviets and set afoot through COLUE to serve as a counter-balance to recent revelations of Soviet espionage in Finland. (See the Embassy Joint Weeks for 11 December 1959.) It is interesting that the Communist newspaper Kansen Putlect carried an aditorial on the 10th of December accusing the Security Police of not investigating cases of western espionage. The editorial makes pointed reference to a trip made by the assistant American neval attache last sussar, which was written up in the Communist press and reported at the time to eachington via Embassy channels.
