- 1. Origory Te. OCLUB came to Finland as a Vice Consul in 1955. In late December 1956 he was promoted to Second Secretary and Chief of the Consular Section, Soviet Babasay. From information given by several sources, we have compiled the following description of COLUB and some background data.
- 2. He was born about 1925 in the environs of either Chassa or Kharkov. He proudly asserted that he was a Ukrainian. During World War II he was a colonel in the Soviet Army, saw action in Leningrad and Moscow and was wounded six times. He elaimed to be a child psychologist. Although be looked like a product of peasant stock, his conversation implied that he was well-educated and knowledgeable on diplomatic affairs, Marxism and current events which involve the USSR. Contrarily, his knowledge of life outside the USSR was meager. He was married to Hima Fedorovna. Esther sorrowfully he explained that he end his wife would like to have children but so far have not been so blessed. His main interest in sports was skiing. He was very jovial, congenial and seemed to enjoy playing host. It has been very obvious that he always picks up the check when he dines with Mesterners - even if he is not the host.
- . J. To one source COLUB stated he had served in Vienna, Warsaw, Budapest, Percharest and Sophia; while to another he stated that Belsinki was his first foreign assignment. It is possible that G"US meant Belsinki was his "first foreign assignment" outside the Soviet Bloc (if he had served in Vienna during the occupation), or he could have been deliberately attempting to confuse. He has conversed only in Ressian and Finnish; however, he stated that he had attended the Language Institute. We suspect that he also knows some English but may feel reluctant to converse in English.
- h. COLUB's predecessor was a known RIS officer, probably RB. We suspect that OCLUB is now the top MDB officer in Helsinki. Although we have no cencrete evidence for this suspicion, we feel that GCLUB's interest in Westerners generally and in perticularly in his opposite numbers in Western installations in Helsinki is more than would be called for by his position.
- 5. DS 2074, when shows a newspaper photo of GCCUB, stated that GCCUB's race was familiar. When DS 207h was told GOLDS's name, Source replied that there was a lieutenant colonel with this name in the MCB. Source could not remember the directorate but thought possibly it might have been a technical section. Source knew that Lt. Col. SCLUB was a "fairly high boss." DS 2074 could not recall whether he had ever seen Lt. Cal. Columb to know him so he did not know if the COLUMB in the nowsphoto was identical with the Lt. Col. OCLUB of the MDB.
- 6. We would appreciate any further information on OCLUB which might substantiate our suspicions of his intalligance activities.
- To ye are trying to identify positively the H. MAKREY. We have written to the [4-1] and US-1] stations for more information on the MAKREYS who have been assurmed to these areas. FOR YOUR INFORMATION ONLY: The description of the M. MAXIMY, how assigned to Finland, nore nearly fits that of Mikalay Gerasimovich MAXEST who was formerly assigned as a TASS correspondent to London from 1950 to 1953 and as Cultural Attache to the Soviet Embasey, Bonn from February 1956 to short May 1957. In both London and Bonn be was suspected of waysaging in intelligence settvities. We would appreciate receiving information on the N. MAXINY, now in Melsinki, which might belp us to identify him.
