a. He knows 2814, 21 September 195 are in Haaparanta. Fu documents and knows th paranta.

b. An Americ said, while he was drunk, that the (probably Ragnar Torsten WESTERBERG) is his friend and has the job of keeping track of the Soviets in Helsinki.

c. He knows that there was a meeting of Scandinavian Security chiefs in Helsinki in November and that EHULIN (Sweden), JENSEN (Denmark) and the Norwegian chief attended. [VACCINE/1] said, this was so

d. The American military has 15 persons working for them in Helsinki although only 7 appear in the Corps Diplomatique.

e. Col. Bjork, the American military attache, is the man who calls the shots for American espionage in Finland.

2. As [VACCINE/1] mentioned each item, we talked about them. On (a) Granley asked [VACCINE/1] whether he intended to tip off the Swedes. He said he certainly did intend to because it appears that the Soviets have an agent in Haaparanta. Regarding item (b) GULB had automatically eliminated Capt. Felix Saichanen who is the only man of that rank here who speaks Swedish well enough to converse with WESTERBERG. (WESTERBERG speaks only Finnish and Swedish). Capt. Justin Kender, the only other Captain, speaks neither Finnish nor Swedish. [VACCINE/1] said he had asked

WENTHROG whether he had any American friends and the latter said that he did not. Here [VACCINE/A] remarked, "I feel quite sure that my men would tell me if they had any western contacts, but this is a free country and I told GLOB so. GLOB was somewhat surprised because he thought any such contact would have to be approved in advance. Still I'm pretty sure I would know if my men were engaged in any steady contacts." Comment: He has considered the possibility that GLOB may have gotten wind of the VACCINE/A - VACCINE/A acquaintance and this is his way of trying to put the point across the VACCINE/A without being more specific. He intend to advise VACCINE/B to go very slowly with VACCINE/A.

3. In talking about item (c), [VACCINE/A] said GLOB had asked him whether he knew the other Scandinavian chief's wall. To this [VACCINE/A] had replied, "Of course" and added that he has known them for 15 years. [VACCINE/A] went on to say that last spring when Soviet officials in Finland were receiving NTB literature via the mails from Sweden, GLOB had come to him and asked whether he could do anything with the Swedes about stopping it. [VACCINE/A] had replied he might try. GLOB now returned to this subject and reported the mailings had ceased. He asked whether [VACCINE/A] had talked to anyone in Sweden about the matter. [VACCINE/A] responded that he had; in fact he had talked to two persons. GLOB was profuse in his thanks and said that it is a great step for his career that he will be able to report to Moscow that he has enough influence with [VACCINE/A] to get a job like this taken care of. Also, GLOB added and [VACCINE/A] related to Branley with a laugh, it will raise [VACCINE/A] to a high level of esteem in Moscow.

4. We failed to mention that at one point in the talk [VACCINE/A] said he took GLOB to task for having interests not consistent with a diplomat's job. "Are you," he said, "the highest intelligence officer the Soviet Union has in Finland?" GLOB protested that his interests were purely diplomatic and that he had no other than normal consular duties. [VACCINE/A] smiled and said to Branley, "Of course, that is baloney" (free translation).

5. In an additional comment to the conversation on the NTB matter, GLOB appeared highly pleased and remarked that Moscow had recently told him that his reporting was far better than anything [VACCINE/A] had done.
