1. At a Consular Corps lunch on 10 April 1957 COLUB made the following comments about himself to Pentti RAJARI, Columbian Consul, who repeated them to Wallmark:

a. He was a Colonel in the Soviet Army during the war and saw action in Leningrad and Moscow. He was wounded six times during the war.

b. Helsinki is his first foreign assignment. He speaks only Russian and Finnish.

2. <sup>22</sup> Kichline comment: Note that COLUB had told (Professor) David NECHT (OFHA-2413, para 7) that he had served in Vienna, Warsaw, Budapest, Bucharest and Sophia. It is possible that he meant his "first foreign assignment" outside the Soviet Bloc (if he had served in Vienna during the occupation) or that this was a deliberate attempt to confuse.
