<p>1. Juan Emilio NUNEZ Portuondo, Cuban politician and diplomat during the regime of Fulgencio BATISTA, who is now in exile and regarded as a leader of the opposition to the revolutionary government of Fidel CASTRO Ruiz, came to Panama from Lima on 10 October 1959 and left for Guatemala on 19 October 1959.</p> <p>2. The sensationalist press notices (Attachment A) that appeared in La Nacion, a Panama City daily tabloid whose oppositionist policies carry over to pro-CASTRO/Cuban revolution editorial comment and reporting, constitute the extent of local publicity for NUNEZ Portuondo's visit here. However, the local ODIBEX intelligence reporting unit acquired, and reported on 27 October 1959 to its superior office, this office, and local ODACID, information (Attachment B) attributed directly to NUNEZ Portuondo.</p> <p>3. It undoubtedly was NUNEZ Portuondo's sojourn in Panama and his meeting with government officials that contributed to expressions of concern by [Station liaison] sources over Cuban policy toward Panama. One manifestation of that concern was a report (Attachment C) that the head of the [HYFRACE] addressed to the Minister of Government and Justice.</p> <p>4. When [HYPOTHESIS-8] passed [the Station] a copy of [his chief's] report, he said that the source of the information was SANCHEZ (fnu) whom he described as a BATISTA exile living in Panama City; and SANCHEZ' source was a person who travels between Panama and Cuba. When passing the report, [HYPOTHESIS-8] said also that SANCHEZ had a connection with NUNEZ Portuondo whom the [HYFRACE] organization regarded as the head of the Cuban opposition, and that NUNEZ Portuondo had informed President Ernesto DE LA GUARDIA Jr. and Hector VALDES Ferrabone, Minister of Government and Justice, that strong action against Panama was being planned in Cuba. After an initial and several follow-up queries to [HYPOTHESIS-8] for identification of SANCHEZ, [HYPOTHESIS-8] after several days of checking, affirmed that he had learned that the person in question was Jose SANCHEZ Ramirez, whom [Station] records show is a former lieutenant in the Cuban National Police, who came to Panama on 19 January 1959 (reported in PACY 4303).</p>

# **Contrarrevolución CONTRA FIDEL CASTRO**

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**Núñez Portuondo Organizó Aquí  
El Movimiento Contra F. Castro**

La ciudad de Panamá ha sido escogida como eje o centro de la contrarrevolución cubana, dirigida por el conocido líder batallero Emilio Núñez Portuondo, según datos logrados y confirmados hoy por "La Nación".

El señor Núñez Portuondo, ampliamente conocido en Panamá, donde actuó como Embajador de Cuba durante varios años, permaneció siete días como huésped del Hotel El Panamá, dentro del más riguroso incógnito, aunque tuvo oportunidad de establecer contacto con cierto sector de la prensa nacional que nunca ha demostrado simpatía hacia la revolución del Dr. Fidel Castro en la república antillana.

Personas conocedoras de la situación política cubana consideran que la presión del Gobierno de Washington ha logrado eliminar a la ciudad de Miami como centro de conspiración contra el actual Gobierno de Cuba por lo que en su lugar se escogió a Panamá.

Como es natural, se supone que nuestro Gobierno y sobre todo los servicios de inteligencia y la Guardia Nacional y la Secretaría estuvieron enterados de la presencia en nuestra capital y de las actividades desarrolladas por el señor Núñez Portuondo.

SE INSTALARAN EN PANAMA PARA

Por otra parte, se resaltó que contactos llegados anteriormente a Panamá, iniciaron gestiones para la compra de dos fincas, una de las cuales estaría ubicada en Chiriquí y la otra en la región de Sora, población situada en el régimen de Bracam.

Las fuentes informantes dijeron que filtraciones emanadas de los recién llegados, indican que hay la intención de dedicar esas fincas, aparentemente al cultivo de tabaco, pero que la intención real es la de ubicar dos potentes emisoras desde la cual iniciar la campaña trazada por Núñez Portuondo contra el gobierno revolucionario de Cuba.

Alrededor de dieciséis personas —prominentes figuras durante la dictadura de Batista— arribaron antier a Panamá. Fuentes extranjeras informaron que entre esas personas se encuentra el famoso torturador Ventura, quien se dejó enterver es el jefe del grupo recién llegado.

La llegada del grupo en referencia tiene, según los informantes, relación con la campaña trazada por el exembajador Núñez Portuondo para combatir el régimen de Fidel Castro, labor que dejara lista durante su incógnita permanencia como huésped del Hotel Panamá Hilton.

(c) On 20 October 1959, confidential sources of U's office held an interview with Dr. Emilio MUNIZ Martínez, leader of the Cuban political exiles. Also present was Mr. Rafael García Bejarro, Cuban son-in-law of Murez and Honorary Consul of Panama in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. The following information was furnished by MUNIZ during the interview:

Dr. MUNIZ initiated the conversation by stating that HE had just completed a tour of Peru, Chile, Argentina, Uruguay and Brazil during which HE established personal contact with the Presidents, Armed Forces' leaders, and other personalities of the aforementioned countries in an effort to enlist their moral and material support in his endeavors.

In Peru, President Manuel Prado informed Dr. MUNIZ that his Government is very perturbed by the activities of the Cuban diplomats in Peru. The Peruvian Government was able to determine that a recent strike staged by bank workers received financial support from the Cuban Embassy in Lima.

In Chile, President Jorge Alessandri complained of meddling by Cuban diplomats in the labor and peasant movements of that country.

President Arturo Frondizi of Argentina advised Dr. MUNIZ that the repercussions of the Cuban revolution are already being felt in that country, especially among students, peasants and workers. The Argentine Secretary of War, General (Art.) Alberto Larcher, told Dr. MUNIZ that, in his opinion, the United States has but two choices in Cuba: To get rid of the Fidel Castro regime now, by force if necessary; or fight Soviet troops on Cuban soil in the future.

The Brazilian President, Juscelino Kubitschek, expressed alarm for the inability of the United States Government to dispose of the present Cuban regime, which is the main source of unrest in the Western Hemisphere.

Dr. MUNIZ stated that the Presidents of the abovementioned countries and their military and diplomatic leaders indicated that they are willing to support the United States in any move, whether it be military, diplomatic or economic, that would eradicate forever the threat of Communism as represented by the Fidel Castro regime.

Dr. MUNIZ continued by saying that he has an appointment with the President of Panama, Ernesto de la Guardia, Jr., in which he would inform the President that preparations are being made in Cuba for a new invasion of Panama. This time the invaders will be better equipped and organized than during the ill-fated landing at Playa Galoada in April 1959.

In regard to the internal situation in Cuba, Dr. MUÑEZ stated that the country is under the tightest of dictatorships. Free enterprise is fast disappearing and state-controlled economy is taking its place. Anti-United States propaganda is evident everywhere. Soviet agents are operating freely throughout the country and are openly infiltrating the Armed Forces, Government agencies and the propaganda media. The Cuban capital has become the new headquarters of the Soviet apparatus whose aim is to subvert all of Latin America.

Dr. MUÑEZ further stated that he is continuously furnishing information pertaining to the Communist activities in Cuba to ~~CIA~~, but this agency does not seem to realize the gravity of the situation. HE expressed disappointment for the lack of assistance HE is receiving from ODACD. However, HE contacts with representatives of KUBARK, ODENVY and ODEARL have been more encouraging.

The anti-Castro organization which Dr. MUÑEZ heads has 20,000 partisans inside Cuba waiting for weapons with which to start a revolt. The great majority of these partisans are former members of the disbanded Cuban Regular Armed Forces. Dr. MUÑEZ' organization has sufficient funds to purchase enough weapons in Spain to arm these groups; however, the Spanish Government will not release the weapons until the United States Government gives its approval.

The French Government has offered Dr. MUÑEZ facilities to train personnel in the islands of Martinique or Guadaloupe in the French West Indies. The Governments of Guatemala and Panama have also made similar offers. However, Dr. MUÑEZ believes that any armed invasion of Cuba at the present time is bound to fail because the Cuban people are being thoroughly indoctrinated and subjected to a very intensive propaganda program by the Castro regime, while the opposition has been completely gagged. Dr. MUÑEZ further stated that he also believes that any revolt will fail unless the Cuban people are made cognizant of what is going on behind the scenes and the threat that the Communist infiltration means to Cuba and her future. Dr. MUÑEZ said that, prior to any military operation, the Cuban people must be subjected to a continuous counter-propaganda barrage, in which the activities of the Soviet agents and their protectors and collaborators are exposed. This propaganda must also attempt to destroy the myth which has been created around Fidel Castro's personality. In order to accomplish this project, Dr. MUÑEZ' organization needs urgently a radio station powerful enough to cover the entire Cuban territory. The Government of the Dominican Republic, through its radio stations, is already conducting that type of propaganda. However, the Dominican efforts are ineffective because of the contempt in which the Cubans hold anything Dominican and, therefore, the propaganda originating in the Dominican Republic is self-defeating.

The Governments of Guatemala and Panama have offered Dr. MUÑEZ their assistance in operating this radio station from their territory. However, Panama has been ruled out because of its proximity to the United States positions in the Canal Zone. Dr. MUÑEZ does not desire to use radio facilities within the continental United States to preclude HIS organization being branded as a tool of the United States or any international embarrassment to the United States Government. The ideal solution to this problem would be a 50,000 watt short wave radio transmitter installed aboard a ship similar to those used by the Voice of America in its broadcast beams to the Iron Curtain countries.

(C) This meeting was effected at the suggestion of Dr. Bernardo Carmenes, Minister of Justice during the administration of deposed Cuban President Fulgencio Batista. Dr. Carmenes is residing as an exile in Panama. (A-1)

(U) 02, USAMERIC COMINT: Dr. Emilio MUREZ Portuondo is a son of the late General Emilio Ríos, one of the heroes of the Cuban revolutionary wars against Spain. Dr. MUREZ has been a Congressman and a Senator in Cuba several times, Ambassador to Panama, and Chief of the Cuban Delegation to the United Nations from 1952 to 1956. He was President of the Security Council during the Hungarian revolt.

CONFIDENTIAL REPORT

We have learned from a good and reliable source that the Cuban government is thinking of discharging 5,000 members of the revolutionary army at the end of November or beginning of December 1959. The end purpose of this is to have the discharged men take part in invasions of Panama and the Dominican Republic; the Cuban government could not be blamed for such actions, since the men would not be members of the regular Cuban Army. The invasions will be carried out simultaneously, in order to obstruct any quick action by the Organisation of American States (OAS). The same source indicates that 3,000 well-armed men will take part in the invasion of Panama, and that the men will come here under the command of Commander Ernesto ("Che") GUEVARA, who it appears received precise instructions while on his trip to Egypt. It appears that intentions are first to take over Panama, and, after that, to undertake an international campaign for NATIONALIZING the Panama Canal. For the latter campaign, they will have the support of several Latin American and several European countries, as well as of several Panamanian political groups, including the Tercer Partido Nacionalista which already has declared itself in that regard. The same source indicates that, before the invasions come about, there will be an open publicity campaign to pave the way and to produce internal upheavals in Panama and the Dominican Republic. It appears that the invasions will receive material, financial, and other support from the Venezuelan government.

NOTE: This information can be verified by FSPRIME intelligence services and FEACID offices in the countries concerned. In time, it will be seen if the actions noted at the beginning of this report have happened, and, if so, it will indicate that the rest will come about in due course. The informant tells us that Cuba, Venezuelan, and Panamanian Communists will take a very active part in everything.
