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- 1. Twan NICELCY escaped from all artages to reace on 21 June 1951.

  He was interrogated by CARATTA AIRTA JIT, UKINEN, JASP, and LASP/S.

  NIKUCY served from 1982 to 1985 as a telegraph operator in the Dulgarian Army.
- 2. On the urgings of one Angel MRISTCOV, MILLOV joined an underground organisation in the Plovdiv area on C arch 1951. His first task in the organization was to obtain accountion from a soldier in the 9 Infantry Regiment in Plovdiv. MIKOLOV obtained a number of rifle cartridges and seven hand granades of dorman manufacture. To delivered all of them to Angel MRISTOZOV, who in turn delivered the accountion to Jorjani couriers who occasionally visited him.
- 3. MIRCLOV had heard of the existence of the inlegal Gorjani group in the mountains, and he had also heard of the clashes that occurred between the Gorjani and the Militia at Kuklen on 14 May 1951 and at Ferdina dove on 22 kgy 1951. He had never seen any of the rebels except one Ilija Jiurov whom he met in connection with the Tradevak deserters. Jaurev acted as courier between the Gorjani and Angel ENSTAGIV.
- h. MIKOLOV heard that in June 1951 the Plowliv police discovered a clandestine radio transmitter, made in the united States, hidden in the Plowdiv cemetery. Doctor Hans HCVACHV and some woran were arrested in connection with the incident. (WATHV, who also heard of the incident, stated that KOVACHV was released after a few weeks.)
- 5. On 12 May 1951 NIKOLOV was told by his brother Peter that at a place called Gola Mosila there were three Trudovak deserters in hiding, and that he (Ivan) should provide them with bread in the name of the underground organization.

  NIKOLOV had not known the Trudovaks before. NIKOLOV carried bread to the Trudovaks three times, but he stopped when the police began surveilling him.
- 6. On 16 May NIKOLOV was ordered by URISPOLOV to locate one Iliev GIUMOV, and to take him to the Trudovaks at Sola Pojila. From Jola Pojila GIUPOV would take the Trudovaks to the Gorjani group in the Lastensko Wountains.

  Arrangements were made that the next day INUROV would take the Trudovaks to the Gorjani. The next day GIUROV did not appear and later HIXOLOV Learned that he had been arrested by the police.
- 7. Om 22 May the Militia in Novo Selo (Plovily) arrested NYOLOV. He was interrogated about the frudevaks, but he dealed evarything and was released after 2k hours of detention. Following this, NYOLOV decided to stop provisioning the Trudovaks.

- o. On 27 Day Boris Philippor, so more of fredoral stellar Philippor, arrived in Harkevo and visited Ivan Makel of Philippor asked HTM 100 to centime carrying food to the Trudovaes, but Makelley refused to do so tocause of police surveillance. On 23 May form Makelley resustant, subtlet the arrest that it was too dangerous to carry foot to Gola Morila. Therefore, Moris suggested that the Trudovaks hide for a few days in Ivan's attickness it would be easier to feed these until a gride was found. By 7 June the Trudovaks had not sees.
- On 7 June, while at work, Ivan met his brother Petur MIKOLOV. Petur told Ivan that the police had arrested vasil IAZAROV, a member of the underground organization and the brother-in-law of Stefan PELTEKOV, one of the Trudovaks. Petur stated that IAZAROV had revealed everything about the underground organization and the Trudovaks, and that he (Petur) had been arrested as a result of IAZAROV's confession. Petur said that he was beaten during interrogation, and that he had been forced to confess also. He had been released for two days on the condition that he would turn over the Trudovaks to the police. He had also provided to obtain from Ivan the recognition signals for meeting the Trudovaks. Petur asked Ivan to go immediately to warn HRISTOZOV and to tell him that the HIKOLOVS are going to escape to Oreece and that everyone connected with Vasil IAZAROV should escape also.
- 10. The same avening the Trudovaks went to Ivan's house as had been arranged with Horis FilteKOV. Ivan told them what had happened and advised them to spend the night somewhere in the vicinity and to return the next day to Gola Mogila where he would join them for the escape to Greece.
- 11. MIKOLOV told Angel HMISTOZOV of the danger they were in and advised him and all other compromised members of the organization to escape. MRISTOZOV refused because he was confident that he could save himself by putting all of the blame on the NIKOLOV brothers.
- 12. On d June Ivan and Petur joined the Trudovaks at Gola Morila. There they waited until Boris and Petur Printmov came, and on 11 June they left for Greece.
- 13. NIKOLOV suspects Vasil LAZAROV of being an agent provocateur, but he is not certain. He has not associated with LAZAROV since the latter joined the Army. During the flight to Greece he heard Petur and Boris PELTEKOV say that they would kill Vasil LAZAROV as a traitor if they ever went back to Bulgaria. In any case, Vasil LAZAROV deceived the Trudovaks and the PELTEKOV brothers by telling them that he wanted to help them to escape to Greece, when he actually wanted to send them to the Borjani.
- Ih. NTKYLOV is now at odds with the PELITEXOVS because of Vasil IAZAROV, but he states that he has known than before and that they have been and still are patriotic anti-Communists.
