SUBJECT:

Alexander I. Roarke, Jr.

- 1. Pursuant to a request at the end of last week from General Goodpasture of the White House, a representative of CO/C in New York City interviewed the Subject on 5 July.
- 2. Following a rambling narrative of his experiences over the years in Central America and the Caribbean, Mr. Roarke came to his major point which was that the most capable Cuban exiled military leader, and the one who is most deserving of U. S. support is Pedro DIAZ Lans. Mr. Roarke knows DIAZ Lans and was planning to appear with DIAZ Lans on a television program in New York City on the night of 5 July. Mr. Roarke considers DIAZ Lans superior to General PEDRAZA, Francisco CAJIGAS and Antonio VARONA, all of whom he claims to know.
- 3. Mr. Roarke said that the SCMOZAs have agreed to give DIAZ Lans a military base in Nicaragua. Hr. Roarke himself plans to organize an American committee to back DIAZ Lanz. He will call it the Committee to Rescue Latin America from Communism or something similar. Mr. Roarke claims that Spruille Braden has tentatively agreed to support this committee.
- 4. At the present time, Mr. Roarke is preparing a documentary television film dealing with a number of Cuban opposition groups. The money for this project has been put up by Channel 5 in New York City.
- 5. Mr. Elmore Haring, the 00/C officer who interviewed Mr. Roarks, will submit a more detailed report through his own channels to us in the next day or so.

Conversation with Alexander'I. Rorke, 51 Chambers Street, Hew York, H. Y.

- 1. Haring called on Rorke the narring of 5 July 60 as a result of a telephone call from Robert Reynolds, all Division, who stated that Rorke night have information of value concerning Cuba.
- 2. Borke is a tall, slender, personable man, about 34 years old, who by his own admission is somewhat garrulous. He did not appear to be a sharp operator. Rorke described himself as a free lance reporter and photographer who has worked nostly for the National Broadcasting Company on assignment. He says he is also trying to make a living by producing doc mentary films for television station WHEM in New York. He claims that he will shortly finish for them a documentary concerning the various groups which are in opposition to Castro. Rorke's business address is the office of his father, on attorney. Biographic data concerning Rorke is being forwarded 6 July 60.
- 3. Borke explained that he knows many people in Cuba and other Caribbean countries as a result of his reportorial work in Micaragua, Panama, Costa Rica, Cuba and other areas, and he says that because of a keen interest in the problem of what can be done about Castro and Communism in Cuba, and his work on the current documentary film, he has been keeping in close touch with various Cuban opposition groups. He insisted on going into his Caribbean background at great length and described in detail his visits to Micaragua, Panama, Cuba etc. The events he mentioned are all past history now however, and we will not attempt to recount them here.
- h. Rorke gave all this background merely to try to prove that he is well acquainted with the situation in Cuba and understands the various opposition groups. He then came to his real point which is that he regards Diaz Lanz, whom he has seen a great deal of recently, as the most solid of all those who want to take action against Castro. He feels that Lanz is completely able, and is in contact with the right people in the Cuban army and other Cuban organizations who can lend the support when the right time comes. According to Rorke, Lanz believes that the job should be done by Cubans from a base outside the US, and that Lanz is brave and resourceful enough to lead a successful action if he is furnished the necessary arms and assumition. Rorke believes, further, that Lanz is politically in the middle of the road, that he is not notivated by hatred and would not bring about a blood bath in Cuba. In short, he feels that Lanz would be with the US all the way.

On the matter of a base from which to operate, Rorke says that he has talked with agents of Micaragua and they say that the Somozas will furnish one.

- 5. In comparing Lanz with other figures who are in opposition to Castro, Roxee centioned Cajigas, Pedraza and Varona, none of whom he feels compares favorably with Lanz. Varona, for instance, is too far to the left. According to Roxee, Lanz has net with 5 different groups in the last faw days in New York, all of which promised to join Lanz if he can get the right backing. Roxee says that he does not know the names of these groups but can get them if we are interested.
- 6. Rorke said that he was going to appear with Lanz at 11 FM 5 July 60 on Barry Grays redio show for a period of about 2 hours. A chief topic of discussion according to Rorke will be the anti-semities of the Castro government. At the end of the week Lanz expects to return to Hismi.
- 7. Rorke stated that he hopes to form an American front committee which Spruille Braden has agreed to head if the right people can be brought into it. The group would have some such name as "Committee to Rescue Latin America from Communism" and Rorke believes that this organization might furnish excellent cover for CIA participation.
- 8. While we were in Rorke's office he received a telephone call from Diana Alexandria about 1:30 Pi. The wanted to report that a warrant had just been issued in Cuba for the arrest of her boy friend Yanes Pelletier. Borke described Pelletier as a personal aid to Castro whose real job had been to procure women for Castro and his assistants. Pelletier had fallen into disfavor as a result of the story of Castro's affair with the Lorenz girl having appeared in Confidential Magazine.
- 9. At the end of our interview, Rorke handed us the attached list of 65 names of Pedraza's mon who had been held by Trujillo. All 65 were in jail 2 weeks ago but according to a telegram which Rorke claims was received 4 July, from a brother of one of the men, only 20 are in custody now.
- 10. If there is any interest in the details of Rorke's current Cuben contacts, he will be available for questioning.
