EQUITY IN P.R.C.

Birraja is short and Jackie Gleason-sized in girth. He is an honest, trustworthy, dedicated, cooperative, intelligent, idealistic gentleman - really "true-blue" in every sense of the word. He is well-informed about cricle activities.

His group, "Juventud Libre", probably consists of no more than a dozen action-oriented young men from Las Villas, Barrigón's province. He plans to infiltrate them into Las Villas for guerrilla activities. Neither he nor they have any illusions about the heavy odds against their ability to survive or to create any real difficulty for the Castro regime. They just think that as individuals they have to try to do what they can to fight the regime. This is the only thing they consider themselves capable of attempting, and they hope that their actions may strike a small spark against the regime. Leonel Barrigón feeds and houses them where necessary, and passes the hat to raise funds for their activities. He and his wife both work.

In 1952, Zarzaga and his men joined JUNE in the hope that this would help him finance the activities his group was planning. He was willing to overlook political differences between his mid-of-the-road views and what he considered JUNE's more radical views. During the period that he was in JUNE, he engaged contact with this office, because he felt that as a loyal and disciplined

He left JUCO some months later in disgust at its lack of action, the incompetence of its leaders, and their hypocrisy in criticizing the U. S. while at the same time they believed they were being helped by the U. S. He has gone back to his free-lance planning, so far without any results.
