MEMORANDUM FOR: Director of Training
ATTENTION : Chief, Covert Training/OS/TR
SUBJECT : Covert Training for member of [CIWOOD]⁰¹ organization
REFERENCE : Proposed Training Curriculum for [CIWOOD]⁰¹ Trainees From CC/OS/TR

1. It is requested that covert training be given to the [CIWOOD] trainees listed below for the period of 8 March - 30 April 1965. This will be the second group of [CIWOOD] trainees under this program which was initiated by the [redacted] Desk of Branch Three of W1 Division through [redacted] Chief, Covert Training, in September 1964. The first group has been given an 8 weeks covert course ending on 26 February 1965. The trainees will be in Washington under the notional cover of "participating in military training courses" or possibly a "purchasing mission" for their Government. As such, they will not be formal visitors and will not be expected to enter Headquarters Buildings, except for one day training in the R & S Building, or to meet Agency officials.

2. Project [CIWOOD]⁰¹ is a [redacted] activity which has as its objective the establishment of a [redacted] with the [redacted] to permit CIA to improve the efficiency and capabilities of [redacted] [redacted] Jacob H. LIRSCHWOOD, a Staff Agent under non-official cover in [redacted] is 16-17 providing advice and guidance [redacted] and is obtaining intelligence information in regard to [redacted] it is believed that covert training can help improve the efficiency and [redacted]

24 internal security [redacted] which will enable this organization to more effectively combat the extremist guerrilla and terrorist activity fomented by the Communist Party of [redacted] with aid and encouragement from Cuba. [redacted] is getting maximum attention from Castro in his effort to bring about communist take-over in Latin America. Besides the inherent value of the training itself, the granting of the training will help [redacted] improve his daily operational [redacted]

24 [redacted] Orientation in Counter Insurgency is also being included to give [redacted] officials 24 a greater awareness of the problem and thus to lay the ground work for future work in this field.

3. The responsible desk operations officer for this course will be Mr. [redacted] who will be known to the trainees as "Bill Cabal", the name identity he used with the first group. An Agency serviced telephone number, 638-3120 has been arranged and will be given to the trainees as a number where "Bill Cabal" can be reached in an emergency. This number is serviced 24 hours a day and Mr. [redacted] is immediately notified to call the persons who asked for him at that number. Mr. [redacted] is located in room 382613 of Headquarters Building, extension 4521. 3

Also completed specialized courses in Infantry Tactics and Tank Warfare, as well as the course of study given by the Superior War College of the Ministry of War. He has served in a variety of capacities within the Army since 1947, commanding everything from platoons through battalions as well as instructor of artillery. He has seen action against the guerrillas in the [redacted] 08
[redacted] He served in [redacted] dates unknown as a member of the [redacted] mission to "Operation America". 08

Language Ability: Native Spanish, reads but does not speak or write English. His competence in understanding English is given as "fair".

Area knowledge: Subject's only travel outside of [redacted] was to [redacted]

Previous intelligence

Training: None indicated but probably has had some intelligence training during his [military] 08 career.

Other: He is Chief of [redacted] of the [redacted] 29 and will probably return to this position. It is possible that he is aware of [redacted] 24 [redacted] with [redacted] 24, without knowing the details of the relationship.

For [redacted] 06's for training have been granted for [redacted] and [redacted] and are pending for [redacted] and [redacted] 01. It is assumed that the trainees are aware of the agency affiliation of HURSCHEWOOD and that the training will be conducted by CIA. The Director of [redacted] is aware of HURSCHEWOOD's CIA association and was also received by the DCI on 21 July 1964 during a visit to the U.S.

6. Training Requirements: The training should be held in a safehouse, conducted in Spanish and on a full time basis. The suggested dates are from 8 March through 30 April 1965, which have been approved by Chief, Covert Training, OS/TR. The trainees will use actual military training cover during the training period, and it is not anticipated they will enter Headquarters building. They will be taken into the R & S Building for a one-day indoctrination in Seals and Flaps and Audio Surveillance. Requests for this entrance will be covered in a separate paragraph. A one-day orientation course in Counter Insurgency is also discussed in a subsequent paragraph as well as an extensive two-week course in Flaps and Seals for Major [redacted] at a TSP Safe House.

7. Requirements for OTR/OS/Covert Training: [redacted] 16-17 [redacted] has submitted the following recommendations as areas which should be covered in the training of these officers: OTR/OS/Covert Training may modify and/or adapt the list as necessary.

- a. The Organization of Clandestine Activities
- b. Security
- c. Observation and Description (Casual)

8. It is requested that Ground Branch of SOD make the services of Colonel [redacted] available for a one-day orientation in the latest techniques used in the field of counterinsurgency. The trainees are well aware of the general problems and history of fighting guerrillas and are actively engaged in operations at the present. It is suggested that the instructions stress use of intelligence in combatting guerrilla groups and means of procuring it to include the creation of intelligence nets among peasants in the afflicted areas. It is also believed that any current information on modifications in the tactics of Mao Tse-tung would also be of value as would be examples of the use of psychological warfare programs against the guerrillas and the intellectual leaders of the communist party, considered as the moving force behind the guerrilla movement. In [redacted] (It is proposed that Mr. [redacted] who would use the alias of "Bill Cabal" take the trainees to the office of [redacted] and that [redacted] be introduced as a consultant of CIA who is very knowledgeable of counterinsurgency problems. [redacted] as a member of the International Police Services Academy, has talked to other Latin American officials on this problem as part of his overt duties. It is believed his talks will make [redacted] more aware of the threats of insurgency movements and also be the ground work for possible future association with [redacted] or the [redacted] Government in the counterinsurgency

field. Through Mr. [redacted] Chief of the Ground Branch of S(4) and Mr. Wall, of the same branch, one-half day orientation course was given to the first trainees who suggested that a full day would be sufficient due to the level of the above trainees and the experience they have in this field.

9. ⁰³ Arrangements have been made with Mr. Luria and Mr. [redacted] of TSD/Training to provide Major [redacted] 6 with a Flaps and Seals course for the period of 19-30 April at a TSD Safe House. It is believed the Flaps and Seals course will benefit CIA because it will offer HERSCHWOOD the opportunity to maintain closer contact with [redacted] who will be responsible for this type activity. In [redacted] proposes to make a concerted effort in the letter intercept field to keep better informed of the extreme leftist efforts to overthrow the government, and it is felt that HERSCHWOOD can keep abreast of the operation. Because of [redacted] 9 responsibilities, it is believed that the more efficient effort that [redacted] can make in this field will result to the benefit of CIA. Major [redacted] would take the first six weeks of the covert training course then devote the last two weeks to the Flaps and Seals course.

10. It is also requested that TSD/Training provide a one-day course in Audio Surveillance and Flaps and Seals for the other three trainees at the R & S Building. This should be a very general briefing with the least possible emphasis on complicated, expensive equipment that might be later requested by the trainees. It is believed this general introduction will give the [redacted] trainees some idea as to approaches and problems involved in these fields as well as the pitfalls that should be avoided. This one-day course was given to the first three trainees who appeared impressed with the concepts exposed to them. This subject has also been discussed with Mr. Luria and a firm date has been selected for the training. The OTH instructor will accompany the trainees and act as translator.
