AMMUG/l is a former Euban intelligence service officer who defected in Canada 21 April 1964. At that time A/1 requested and was granted asylum in the United States. With the assistance of INS he was allowed to enter the US as a permanent resident.

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# MOTIVATION AND CONTROL

Subject's declared motivation is complete disenchantment with the Cuban revolution and the Cuban Government as it currently exists.
