- l. Forwarded herewith is a picture of MARKEL. Although the picture was taken in 1957, he looks today exactly as he did then, with the exception of a few less hairs on the top of his head. Description: 42 years old, apparent age 45, height 6 ft. 1 in., thin build, hair dark brown, large ears, right ear lobe has distinct inverted-y cut; above his left eyebrow is a personent lump (does not show on the attached picture), large enough so that it cannot be overlooked; walks with head and shoulders bent slightly forward; speaks German and French fluently and can pass as a netive of France; on a scale of excellent, very good, good, fair, poor, his English is rated good. If English is used with him, it should be spoken slowly and distinctly, choosing words which leave no doubt as to what is meant.
- 2. MINICI. was not in Luxembourg by RABMEY and Elliott S. JOUVENOY, COS, Luxembourg, on 19 and 20 October. [AUDA] 234 had not been received in Frankfurt by the time of RABMEY's departure from there for Luxembourg, but arrangements were made to have it relayed to Luxembourg, and JCUVEMOY has confirmed his receipt of it. The following sub-paragraphs provide the substance of the meetings with MARKEL:
- a. In view of the extreme sensitivity of the objective for which we want him to perform his task, he was not told precisely what we want him to do. Instead, he was told that we have evidence of Soviet operations among nationality groups in Africa, specifically, Corsicans, and that we would like to have him spot, assess, and renommend some dependable, quick-witted persons for our use. (Comment: It was thought best to withhold our true, specific requirements pending the final decision to use MINIEL.) He agreed to go on the trip for us.
- b. Regarding cover for the trip, MARKEL suggested that he travel as a salesman for a German firm producing coin-operated soft-drink, coffee, etc., machines. He already had a brochure from this company and stated that he could easily obtain an authenticating to-whom-it-may-concern letter from the owner. The firm is SCHWEIMER RISKHWERK, MUELLER AND CO., CHEM, SCHWEIM, WESTFALIA; the owner

is Erich Illesselds, who is asserted by Milkel to be a friend. (Comment: Eqs. troops have been run on the firm and the owner, with megative results.)

- e. MARRIL stated that in dealing with Corsioens it is scentimes advisable to give a Corsioen as a reference. If he finds this advisable or necessary, his reference will be Jacques MARTHALL, 75, Blvd. Asguste Blanque, Paris. (Comments Equ. brooks have been sum on SARTHALL with negative results.)
- d. Since MARKE is become to the Surete in Paris because of his assistance to the U.S. Buyen of Marcotics, he was told to obtain visas for his trip in Garanay. His passport was revisited, and there appeared to be no objection to his using it for the upcoming trip.
- 6. He was told what immutation shots and maleria suppressive he will need and was given funds to obtain them.
- f. He was told that contact with an assertees would be available at his destination in case he needs it. (Comment: Paras. 2 and 3 of AUDA 234 take case of this for AUTEROY's bristing purposes.) He was not told that the person secting his would be from the Asserteen Echassy, nor should be be told this.
- 3. RABBEL gave JOUVEROI the same briefing conserring our purposes as be bad given to COS, Botes were left with JOUVEROI for his use in briefing MARKEL specifically on the types we want RIBERL to find for us. Those notes, plus ATMA 214 previde JOUVEROY with most of the information necessary for MARKEL's final briefing; the only other information and action necessary at this time are:
 - a. On reseipt of this disputch, to cable luxembourg the alias to be used by CRICAIND if she meets HAREM.
- Laxesbourg to include in the briefing to MANNAL the statement that if CHICKIRS wants to get bold of him, she will telephone him between 0830 and 0900 hours or between 1700 and 1730 hours at his hotel, La Capin du Sad, will give him her alias, and will say, "Brigitta wrote to me that you would be here and asked me to shee you around. " MARKEL will reply with a statement of appreciation. He should be told in Luxusbourg that if he receives such a call, he will neet CELCULED per sub-paregraph 9, paragraph 2, [AURA] 23427 On receiving the call, be should immediately suspend his search softwity until told by CHICHARD to resume it. We wish this to be included in his brinding in anticipation of the possibi-17 101117 that Station say pick up information affecting Marke during his stay there, L. . , a police inquiry. It should be stressed to Hillish during his briefing in Luxenbourg that he should not seek contact with us por paragraph 2, AVDA 234 7.7 unless he runs into obstacles cleerly requiring discussion or senses danger to bisself or his mission or hes something to report which cannot exait his return to luxumbourg. He will not contact his unless we mick up something affecting his or his sission.

 - 4. Beference perseraph 4, ANDA 234: MARIEL should be briefod on all the sub-paragraphs, but should be talk to concentrate first on sub-paragraph a, rather then dilute his effort. Unless Station objects, in which case please oable to Luxerbourg with reasons, the brisiles of MARKET should include the percenthetical note in sub-paragraph c, since this will permit high to take precentionery measures in dealing with these types. We prefer that after he has explored the possibilities offered by sub-paragraph a, he explore those offered by sub-paragraph d. Sub-paragraphs b and a abould be sonsidered last records. Although he will be aware of it from his own normal estivity, MUNEL should be specifically told to be slart to the fast that the circles in which he will be dealing are usually loaded with police informate and that we want him to exercise maximum caution. He should also be told that we do not consider this a mismice be told that we do not consider this also he can be expected. ad infinitum. If he is not able to find the types we went and arrange future contact (recognition signals, etc.) within two weeks, approximately, it is unlikely that additional time will got him anymers, although he have an open mind on this print. find the types we need in Dakar, we will look elsewhere. (The operation we have in mind is too sensitive to risk blowing it in this phase, and the search for assets must be conducted with truly minimum risk.)

- 5. JUVERUI is authorized to provide MARKEL with funds for travel, \$400 for living expenses in Dekar (20 days at \$20 per day), and \$300 for operational expenses. T/A this total to Equ., citing Cost Center 1123-1003-1000 and cite this dispetch as authority. (On his return he need submit only the sirline ticket stub. botel bills, and accounting for the \$300 operational expenses only. These should be sent to EUTUBE/D only.) If he needs more funds in he can obtain them 12-10 there from CHICHARD. His travel reservations should be made from Frankfurt, but under no circumstances from lamembourg or Paris. JOUVENOY is authorised to give his money for travel to Frankfurt for this purpose. (We will decide on his return how much to pay him for his time on the mission.)
- or Luxenbourg, please 6. If there are any questions on the part of cable to each other, with info to Eqs., or to Eqs. with info to the other station. Cables should refer to this dispatch and be slugged RYRAT LAURICLE ZRACURM.
- In view of the fact that the cover installation is not guarded during off duty hours, this dispatch should be reduced to cryptic neces-sary notes and destroyed after the first reading. MANKE's picture and all cable traffic, as well as your copies of AUDA 234, should also be destroyed as soon as 22 no longer needed. Secessary notes, i.e., on arrangements for contacts, and MAHNEL's picture, until the first contact, should be sealed in such a way that any tampering will be immediately evident.
