Manuel INCIARTE Oquendo (201-783666) on 10 November 1966 and (INCIARTE) had showed him a letter addressed to his mother (Refugio INCIARTED) had/showed him a letter addressed to his mother (Refugio INCIARTED) from Maggie SUAREZ) in PBRUMEN dated 16 October 1966. (SUAREZ) is the current wife of (Milton INCIARTE (Quendo (201-753063)), and show writes frequently to her mother-in-law relating news about their family in 6 PBRUMEN. Included in the letter was the brief statement that (Milton) had told her to have (Refugio) tell ("Santiago") he had received the note from AMHARSH/1, and that soon everything would be arranged. (Milton OLINCIARTE) knows (Santiago") is the pseudonym AMHARSH/1 has used in Venezuelan PCV/FALM contacts, and AMHARSH/1 used this name in the letter to (Milton INCIARTE) which AMJUJU/1 asked him to write.)

2. In view of the above APMUG/1 was queried about the procedures followed by AMSTAFF with reference to walk-ins. AMMUG/1 advised that instructions had been issued to all overseas representatives to treat walk-ins courteously and to show interest in whatever they had to offer. All possible background and personal information was to be acquired by the overseas representative and this information was to be forwarded to AMQUAKE Headquarters for confirmation and analysis. All walk-ins were considered potential sources of information and all were considered to have possible future utilization. AMMUG/l claimed that information forwarded to AMSTAFF Headquarters was screened and sent to the desk officer for the specific area where the walk-in would probably work if recontacted. It was the responsibility of the desk officer to check all available information and to make a determination

if the valk-in could be used and should be recontacted. ASTUC/l estimated the tire involved from the date of walk-in until recontact would probably be at least four rouths or rore.

- 3. Obviously AUSTAFF has received AUSUU/1's AUGABEH/1 unlh-in report, and they are probably in the process of making a determination on AUSTAESH/1's case.
- 4. As indicated previously in paragraph 8 of reference 3, JHANN has been reviewing the AMMANSH/1 operation for some time from the standpoint of its cost (\$7,500 per year) in relation to AMMANSH/1; access to hard intelligence and operational information, and his actual production. At this time the walk-in phase of the operation appears provising; however, his access to any hard intelligence is new nil, and his production of operational support information has dwindled to infrequent marginal reports. Thus he is of no further operational use to JHANE unless he is recontacted and utilized by AHQUAKE, and our experience in this type operation has shown us that utilization by AHQUAKE can be a long, drawn out affair before any tangible results are achieved.
  - 5. Therefore, JHMAVE is initiating actions to terminate as of 30 April 1967 (expiration date of current JHMAVE deposit to the cover company) ARMARSH/1's salary and cover employment. We have advised AMMARSH/1 of the probability that he will be terminated, and he is now in the process of seeking other employment in the JHMAVE area where he wishes to remain. After 30 April 1967 our contact and financial arrangements with AMMARSH/1 will depend upon the status of his contacts with AMMARSH/1 will depend upon the status of his contacts with AMMARSH/1. A change of employers by AMMARSH/1 should have no great effect on AMSTAFF's interest in him, since AMSTAFF is aware from AMMUNU/1's walk-in report that AMMARSH/1 was dissatisfied with his cover company position.
- 6. On 13 September 1956 AMARCH/1 was scheduled to be given a SCSWIRL examination. On arrival at the examination site he claimed to have a slight head cold, and the SCSWIPL began on the basis that the slight cold might not interfere with the results. However, as the examination progressed it became apparent AMARSH/1 was suffering from more than a slight cold, and inconclusive SCSWIRL results were being obtained. Consequently, it was decided to discontinue the examination and rescheduled it when his health was better.
- 7. On 15 September 1966 AMMARSH/1 funderment an operation for a lesion of the urinary bladder. According to the doctor's report, the lesion was malignant but they were able to remove all traces of the malignancy. Post-operative treatment included almost two conths of radiation diatherny treatments. AMMARSH/1 has now recovered, and another SGSWIEL examination has been scheduled for 20 December 1986.
- 8. JAMANA will promptly advise Headquarters of all important developments in the AMMARSH/L operation.
