Headquarters Comments:

The following report is one of a series containing personality information provided by the source and includes supplemental information from the records of this Agency.

It is requested that the addressees take no action on any of the individuals mentioned in the personality reports without first checking with this Agency.

Source identified a photograph of Jose Antonio GARCIA Lira, aka "Nico," as a Cuban Intelligence Officer of the Direction General de Inteligencia (General Directorate of Intelligence - DGI) in Mexico. He is the Commercial Attache it the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16

Headquarters Comments:

- A report dated 17 January 1962, from three untested sources. stated that Antonio Garcia was one of several Cuban G-2 agents now (January 1962) in Mexico and planning to go to the United States.
- 2. A fairly reliable source, in a report dated 22 May 1962, stated that Jose Antonio "Nico" GARCIA Lara is assigned to the commercial office of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City, however, he does little work for this section. He is a member of the Cuban G-2 and an opportunist with a very bad reputation.

- 3. In a report dated 9 Jone 1882, from a usually retrable source, it was stited that America Nicol Garcia Lara is the Caban Commercial Attache in Venico. Garcia is colored, married to a white girl and is extremely race coascious. During the revolution he was in exile in Venico. Garcia told source that he was anti-Communist. He said that Castro was encircled by Communists and cannot move, and that Cuba is in bad shape. Garcia has a sister who is a Nun in the United States. In a 20 June 1962 report this same source positively identified Garcia as a cuban G-2 agent in Venico and added that Garcia is a close friend of Osmour Cientuegos and Manual Pineiro, Deputy Chief of G-2.
- 4. On 4 July 1962, a usually reliable source gave the following biographic information on Antonio GARCIA Lara:

GARCIA, a G-2 agent working in Mexico, arrived in ... Pexico in early May 1962 as the Commercial Attache of the Cuban Embassy. He is a close friend of Osmani Clenfuegos, Munuel PINEIPO, and Ramon CUENCA. GARCIA is a Negro, about six teet tall, 170 pounds, and is married to a white girl named Nelly. He belongs to the Javentud Autentaco and is known by the pseudonym Nico GARCIA. He arrived in Mexico with specific instructions from CLENFUEGOS to recruit Mexican technicians and to provide. them with necessary funds. It seems probable that this is only a guise and that the men are being taken to Cuba solely to be trained as agitators. GARCIA spends little time in his office, but is busy most of the day miking contacts on the street. Since he lived in Mexico tor a year and a half previously, he knows a good deal about the country. He also is in contact with members of the Spaarsh and Mexican Communist Parties and with students or leftist affiliations.

5. A usually reliable source with good contacts in the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City gave the following information on Automio CARCIA Lara; the report was dated 13 July 1962:

Antonio GARCIA Lava, Commercial Attache of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City, arrived in Mexico on 23 April 1962. Before coming to Mexico, CARCIA held important positions with the Cuban government in Habana. He worked for the Ministry of Agriculture and the Ministry of Public Works (MINOP). CARCIA is a member of the Cuban G-2 but did not artend the Cuban G-2 school. He did attend the diplomatic

SECRET NO FOREIGN DISSEM school, but was assigned to Mexico before he was graduated. One of GARCIA's duties in Mexico was to assist the Cuban Embassy in hiring technical experts to go to Cuba. He was also to handle commetcial matters and investigate the manipulation of \$200,000 (U.S.) in connection with the purchase of automobile parts, cameros, etc.

- An unknown source, in a report dated 25 July 1962, said that Jose Antonio GARCIA Lara, aka 'Nico" GARCIA, is the Cuban Commercial Attache in Mexico. GARCIA was born about 1929. His mother, who is seventy-six years old. resides in Habana, his father is deceased. He has three sisters, one (fnu) GARCIA is a Nun living in the United States, the other two live in Habana. GARCIA was married in Habana in 1960 to Maria Elena LARIA Baluja (white), they have one His brother-in-law, child, Tatiana, and are expecting another Hector Ramon LARIA Baluja, resides at 305 West 98th Street, Apartment number 605A, New York City. GARCIA was previously employed by the Army G-2 (with which he is no longer affiliated, according to him!, Ministry of Agriculture and the Ministry of Obraspublicas. He has a secondary school education and attended the 'Escueda de Diplomacia,' but did not finish as he was transferred to Mexico. GARCIA entered Mexico in 1957 in exile and returned to Cuba in 1959. He arrived in Mexico in his present capacity on 23 April 1962. His address is San Borja 1357 Col Del Valle, Mexico, D. F.
- 7. In a 6 August 1962 report from a usually reliable source, it was stated that Antonio GARCIA Lara returned to Mexico from Rabana on 3 August 1962. GARCIA told source that he returned to Mexico with orders to take over the commercial activities from Ramon CUENCA Montoto.
- 8. A usually reliable source in a report dated 20 November 1962, stated that Jose Antonio GARCIA Lara, his wife and their two children were leaving Mexico for Habina on 20 November 1962 via Cubana Airlines. GARCIA planned to stay in Habana approximately three weeks. A reported dated 27 November 1962 stated that GARCIA actually left Mexico on 23 November 1962.
- Jose Antonio GARCIA Lara, according to a usually reliable source in a report dated 24 January 1963, arrived in Mexico from Habana on 21 January 1963.
- 10. In a report dated 16 April 1963, from a usually reliable source, it was stated that Jose Antonio GARCIA Lara, passport number 62-213, and his wite left Mexico on 15 April 1963 for Habana. GARCIA

- 11. A fairly reliable source, in a report dated to September 1963, stated that there had been a big turnover in personnel at the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City. He also stated that Antonio GARCIA, aka "Nico," a vising Negro, remained at the Embassy. GARCIA is a former member of the Juventud Autentico, ac opportunist, and it is said that he is a member of the Cuban Intelligence Service in Mexico.
- 12. An arrivet, dated 12 October 1963, revealed that Jose A. GARCIA Lara, diplomatic passport number 62/213, arrived in Mexica City from Habana.
- 13. A usually reliable source reported that on 8 March 1964, Jose Antonic GARCIA Lara left Mexico City for Habana. He returned to Mexico City on 29 March 1964.
- 14. Jose Antonio GARCIA Lara, according to a usually reliable source, arrived in Madrid on the night of 25 May 1964.
- 15. A usually reliable source reported on 24 June 1964, that GARCIA Lara is under transfer orders to Habana. On 3 July 1964, it was reported that GARCIA and his family left Mexico City for Habana on 2 July 1964, and had left before they had finished packing which was being completed by their maid. GARCIA had an intelligence escent up to the time of his departure.
- 16. A usually reliable source, in a report dated 9 July 1964, stated that persons inquiring for GARCIA Lara on 3 July 1964, were told by Camilo POMENBCH, of the Cuban Embassy, that GARCIA had to leave because of illness, that a period of rest had been recommended, that he would have to remain in bed, and that he took his whole family with him since he would be away for some time. Federaco ALVAREZ, also of the Curae Embassy, told source that GARCIA left on a permanent transfer.
