(1) Report dated 7 March 1961. Title:  
see memo forwarded by <sup>St</sup>John W. Dean,  
Director, Office of the FBI, 10 numbered  
pages. This report is a chronological  
account of General's trip from  
South to L. A. from 24th March to  
26th March. He was contemplating  
return to the US. (We received this  
report on 21 Nov 1965)

(2) Report dated June 3, 1963. To the  
Office of Security of the Department  
of State. Subject: General's return  
to the US. This report contains  
information on a long conversation  
between the two and his efforts to  
the fact that General's return  
could be made by himself.  
It would indicate circumstances  
concerning the trip. (We  
received this report on  
1975)

(C) Report dated 10 July 1962. Title:  
Lee Harvey Oswald. By <sup>Sgt</sup> John W.  
Dunn, Dallas office. 14 pages  
[Oswald background ~~was~~ on  
subject ~~is~~ in USK and  
records ~~output~~ denied the  
recruitment by Sov. U.S. or any  
deal with the Soviet government]  
(We received this report on 9  
March 1964.)

(d) Report dated 31 October 1962.  
Title: Lee Harvey Oswald - Early  
Days in New Orleans and  
Activities for Fair Play for  
Cuba Committee. Report by  
Sgt. Milton R. Kaack. 16  
pages. (We received this by  
letter from J. Edgar Hoover on  
9 March 1964.)

- [unclear] ... Report  
was inquired in surrounding ...  
statements on 10 Oct 1964. Coverage ...  
operating by June of next year but U.S. visitors  
had become notably fewer and more ...  
This decrease U.S. visitors attributable directly  
to upturn in the photo.

- Elena Garro de Paz. This is a persistent account  
noted by COS in HUK on 12 Oct 1964. Reported  
by her to Emb. Political Officer, Charles Thomas  
10 June 1965; she added that in Nov-63 she was  
initiated by an official in the Cuban mission from  
going to U.S. Embassy with her story. Story was then  
reported [unclear] 5 Oct 1965.

<sup>Thompson</sup>  
NBI Garro was interviewed by Legat on 17 Oct 64 - furnished  
similar info but not substantiated by informant. Legat  
reported in disengagement to COS on 27 Dec 65 and  
to Ambassador on 23 Feb 1966. Further means of  
confirmation by Thompson with Elena Garro on  
13 July 1966, additional details on her attendance  
30 June 1966 at Embassy functions. On 13 Oct 66  
Legat confirms that Elena Paz had been registered  
23 Nov 1963 at Hotel Vermont, 25-28 & 29-30, as  
she had claimed. 7 Feb 67. Adams of Cons.  
between Thomas and Elena Garro on her continuing

1 Oct info complete with data on a photo of an  
individual who had entered USCo Camp. on 9 Oct  
and his description. Some individual photos going  
out of USSR Emb. on 4 Oct and entering Cuban  
Emb. on 15 Oct. None of these photos were forwarded  
Wash. Hq. division. 7 Oct info: to Hq. before  
22 Nov.  
(this found reported as per Mexico 7014)

Wash. reply 7880 of 11 Oct to Mexico, gave correct  
identif. Hunt for middle name and a correct  
description (which did not match that of the  
photographed individual reported in Mex. 6453. His  
wife present to Amb. with copies letter only on 16 Oct.

Mexico 6534 of 15 Oct 83. Ask for photo of O.  
Hq. went out to the Navy and a request for a  
photo. 24 Oct. Navy was reassured on  
No photo had been sent to Mexico Station by 22 Nov.

Mexico 7044 of 22 Nov: requested 200 photo priority  
& indicates it was forwarding photo of 1 Oct of  
only visitor who could be identical.

In personal note re telephone conv. with Wf/brief  
asked permission to give legit copies of photo  
also Amb. who discussed was night manager to  
take copies to Dallas by hand of legit, who  
flown up by N.A. Also legit. would mail copies  
to Hq. from Dallas. 38 photos, 4 in black  
spot, 4 in white. Also provided via AMMT.  
22533, which included the 2 photos of same  
person exiting Cuban Embassy. Legat left Mexico  
city at 2100 22nd for Dallas. 6454 first request  
all photo has flown less for 23 Nov but  
cancelled it by arrival. Following cable  
(84822) as press wire photos of Oswald clearly  
found available. In 84881 23 Nov. also with  
con. issued to Mexico 7014 of 23 Nov. about 20 photos of Oswald.

x 3. 28 Sept 1963. 11:51. O at Cuban Consulate with  
Sibiri Bureau who calls Sov. Consulate and puts  
O on line. Soviet asks him to come over & say  
"What, all be there right away?" (Item #208)  
[This tape crossed, voice comparison not possible, but  
price of 1st call very, or same by account #]

x 4. 1 Oct 1963. 10:31. (Bosley Bureau). Refers to  
talk with Sov. Consulate last Saturday. Soviet gave  
him a new number (Item #45) Valeriy

x 5. 1 Oct 1963 03:45 Item #151. Id. subject to Le Oswald.  
Refers to Sat. night of talk with Council, KOSTIKOV.

x 7. Mexico reported has Oswald info via its 6453 on  
8 Oct 1963 (item 5 above) which it compared with  
found it had a photo of individual appearing to  
be an American who entered Sov. Cons at 12:16h.  
left 12:22 1 Oct. Give description: Age c. 35, white  
hair, c. 6', wearing hair, building type  
was black & sport shirt. NB: This person  
photographed outside Sov. Cons. 1 & 4 Oct 63 and  
entered Cuban Embassy on 15 Oct 1963.

x 8. Hqs. reply (74830, 11 Oct 63) gave LHM (sic) Army report ident. called 201 no. of photographs taken including descriptions: 5'10", 165 lb, light brown wavy hair, blue eyes. [This should have been sufficient to meet the 8 Oct description] but noted detail to interested agencies work. I ordered approx. field data. asked further details of pro. ident

x 9. 15 Oct 63 (6534) Mex. Hqs. asked for ~~attached~~ photo of O.

x 10. Photo of Lee Henry (sic) Oswald ident & certain passed to Amh. by COS, 16 Oct 63 memo. sent to Leg Lt, NA, I&NS.

x 11. Mex 2014 of 22 Nov. 63 noted LHM cannot identify referenced items #9, 8, and 7. Requested printed photo to permit photo review. as stated was formerly copies of only with Sr. but 1 out who would be identical.

x 12. 22 Nov. COS has copy of photo. asked permission for Legat copy of a photo of forwarded photo. at 6 PM Mex. time 22 Nov. but. Besides that this was most common & take copies of pictures of Dallas & NA would make special photo for purpose. Legat was meant mention B&W Chip. Copies also purchased: There were 8 photos. 4 in black & white, 4 in color. NA: some more interest Sr. but on 4 Oct 1963.

x 13. 22 Nov 1963, 1730 (King's Callahan) (item #10): HF (Carson Area) calls if she has heard the latest news of murder, in a joking tone says, "Yes, of course, I know, almost before Kennedy... Imagine, one, two, three and now, that makes three (she laughs), what barbarians!..."

- 14. Hqs. via 88102 of 28402 hrs. vsh call all facilities to follow report Sov. Emb. act. & reactions. NB: no action directed to Cuba - the focus was entirely on Soviet
- 15. Mex (7015) reported 23/11 / 147 photos of same Am. "possibly Oswald" (entire) Cuban Emb. on 15 Oct. Exiting
- 16. Hqs left Mex 2000 hrs with 2 copies 6 photos of "person suggested by Oswald" for blacks. (This was then 7021. No time. On 23/65 0422 zhr Hqs. declines need for stops delivery of photo because photos in press were obtained road. Also we told Navy for photos again [NB: descriptions did not match & they should have been sufficient to have deterred COS.]
- 17. Hqs. 84888, 23 Nov 63, 17292 informed Mexico that their photos of man entering Sov. Emb. which had been sent blacks were NOT L.H.O.
- 18. Mexi 7029, 23 Nov 63. Acknowledges from TV photos of LHO on night 22 Nov. States photos not identical.
- 19. Review by Mex. Station of coverage produced additional calls - as follows reported 27 Sept. at 1605, 1626 and calls at 1031 on 1 Oct. and on 3 Oct.
- 20. Sov. Emb. reactions to assassination almost immediate: not working Friday, Saturday or Sunday. All calls referred to Monday.
- 21. Mexi checked (see 7034 of 23 Nov) of all photos to Cuban Emb. Aug-15 Nov show no Oswald coverage - similar shots of all Sov. Emb. photos 1 Sept - 15 Nov. NB: Only known

26. AP story from Havana 7 Sept 1963: at reporter Miguel  
Cabrera. Fidel Castro quoted:

"We are prepared to fight them & answer  
in kind. U.S. leaders should reflect that  
if they are making terrorist plans to eliminate  
the Cuban leaders, they themselves will not  
be safe."

27. Pres. of Dep'te Briefed by COS re case including substantial  
quotations on 25 Nov 63.

- 42. Hqs. (Des 8605X) asked Mli. to follow up a report that on 22 Nov. a Cuban aircraft delayed its departure Mex. City because from 1700 to 2100 aircraft on airport grounds who arrived Mex. airport in private time under aircraft at 2400 transferred directly without entering of command. & stayed in pilot cabin. Composite entry 23 Dec 64 CSCI 316/02545-64 which reported entry and by a woman since discovered from a Cuban passport which was also on this plane and reported on previous arrival.
- 43. What are ramifications of LHO. relations with Fair Play for Cuba Committee associated?

(a) Vincent Theodore Lee - went to Cuba via Mexico City 28 Dec 62, returns Mexi 20 Jan 1963. Travelled with Eliz. Catlett de Moran (Betty Moran) E E

44. Cuban Govt doc. provided via Swiss, consists of a Visa Application dated 27 Dec 62. which indicated planned date of arrival in Cuba on 30 Dec 62. Sec. number 3 for "in transit on the way to the Soviet Union" after a stay in Cuba of 2 weeks (and longer if possible.) An accompanying notations indicates he displayed "docs. in proof of his membership" in CPUSA and F.P.C.C. New Orleans.



45. Co of Sept 1964 Sylvia Duran had given up her Cuban Embassy job and had disappeared. Husband stated she was out of Mexico. Husband residing in Cuba. Elizabeth reports she had seen no occasion with Sylvia & Cuban Meyer & Monte.

with 7 more Mex. past and background.

46. Eleana Carras de Paz - memo of 10 Dec 1965 - relates alleged sighting of Oswald on Sept 1963, party at home of Rachel Duran, intended by Azusa, had a Latin American Negro with red hair (See Alvarez's story) and others. (P-8533 1417)

Mrs Paz is cousin of Horacio Duran, Sylvia's husband. The very hostile latter. Paz's activities under to Sept 17-24 Nov 64 & inquiry failed to substantiate - report memo of 23 Feb 66 indicated: no further action.

✓ 97. London Report 26 May 1967 on meeting with Cuban informant  
 agent. LIRING/s indicates letter was an old contact of  
 Soloviz & Horacio Simon. Soloviz Simon a receptionist at  
 Cuban Club. 1953-4 had been placed by Teresa Proenza,  
 his own attorney. Simon had claimed to LIRING/s that she  
 had gone out with 400.00 and had spent money with him, had  
 been taken out country etc. etc. He had cut all rel. with  
 Cuban. (See P-5593, 19 May 1967 - Vol. 5)

✓ 98. Report by Amalio. Tampico, Benj. J. Ruyf dated 11 May 1967  
 relates details of alleged contact of Oswald with someone of  
 Cuban descent but then. Also identifies former pro-Castro  
 student. Oswald by going after lunch & he remained with  
 group afternoon, evening & all of following day. He did not  
 pay for his stay. Ruyf because of several copies & photo. Oswald  
 gave nothing except. Of pro-Castro student to help persuade  
 Cuban Club. Oswald him a coin. Ruyf tells Sp. No further  
 contact after 2nd day. This report forwarded by Ruyf with  
 comments. but source also said he had known Maria  
 Teresa Proenza. Source was: Oscar Brito <sup>Castro</sup>, reporter for  
El Sol de Tampico as UN. of Mex. 62-64. Interviewed on 25 June 67.  
 He very cautious because of leakage danger. Confirms vague on  
 details and fixed on denial if confronted. (He had indep. traces  
 on Brito showing his UNAM, no. Also contact in June 1961)  
 Story gained to Legat by memo 5 July 1967. Following indicates  
 C. was registered as student 1953-60, not 61-63 }
