Subject has only corresponded by S/W once since his return to Cuba in September 1962. There are, preports, however, that Subject has tried through mutual firends to contact or get word from ANNHIP/1. Three separate attempts have been made to reestablish contact with Subject through the use of the mails. Outcome of last and most direct attempt is not known at this writing. SAS is prepared to give Subject benefit of the doubt, until it definitely established that he wishes no further contact with USG representatives.
