1. The subject has been employed by Station Mexico since 18 March 1955 and has proven to be one of the most conscientious, loyal, hardworking and dedicated persons so employed. He has assumed, under the direct supervision and guidance of the Case Officer, full operational and administrative responsibility and control of the following operations:
 - a. LIPSTICK Team: Instructs the individual team members in their assignments and handles administrative matters with each individual. Supervises the maintenance of the LIPSTICK automobile and works on surveillance approximately four to six hours per day. The subject is given a cash advance each fifteen days from which he pays all salaries, automobile expenses and other expenses incidental to the LIPSTICK operation. He submits a detailed accounting at the end of each fifteen days. He receives rough reports from the team members and compiles them into a finished report.
 - b. LIPSTICK Car 4: The subject instructs LIPSTICK 2 in operational deployment of this vehicle and processes the films obtained from this operation.
 - c. LIPSTICK/LEYTEN: The subject is the alternate cut-out with LIPSTICK 19 on this operation and processes all of the photographic take.
 - d. LIPSTICK/LILYRIC: The subject processes all of the photographic take from this operation.
 - e. LIPSTICK/LIAISON: The subject instructs LIPSTICK 5 and 6 in the operational aspects of this operation and processes all of the photographic take.
 - f. LIPSTICK: The subject works with LIPSTICK on radio maintenance and other technical matters pertaining to the LIPSTICK operation.
 - g. LIPSTICK Office 2: The subject handles all administrative matters pertaining to this safehouse.

h. Retired investigations: The subject investigates addresses, places, and persons of interest to this Station. He has developed into an extremely fine investigator.

i. Spot assignments: He is given many individual spot assignments by the Case Officer and accomplishes these tasks in a professional manner.

In summary, the subject's principal duties are administration and operational direction of the Station team, processing 5 to 40 rolls of 35 mm film each week, contacting agents and acting as cut-out for the Case Officer, conducting individual investigations, handling cash advances, accountings and property.

2. The subject is perfectly covered working for LIMELICK 19 as purchasing agent. He spends approximately three to four hours per day working on his cover duties. This cover is believed by all his friends, is durable and allows sufficient freedom for operational activity. The subject has often expressed the desire to make a lifelong career with ADIA. This entire matter was discussed with [redacted] during his recent visit to this Station and he suggested that the subject be given training at Headquarters to better prepare him for carrying out his duties. Arrangements regarding the time and length of this training would depend upon training schedules, the arrival of [redacted] and the Case Officer's home leave and Headquarters training in March and April 1957. From the Station's point of view, January and February of 1957 would be the ideal time for his training. There follows for Headquarters guidance an outline of the material which the Station desires be covered in the subject's instruction: (it is suggested that, insofar as possible, he be instructed as a member of a class rather than as an isolated student under the tutorial system).

a. Counterintelligence Methods and Techniques. C-1. TR-CG, 200-1

b. Basic Administration - to include instruction on accounting, property control and personnel procedures regarding field agents.

c. Tutorial photography - to include advanced methods for expediting the processing of a large volume of negatives and prints.

3. In consideration of the subject's dedicated and efficient service, it is requested that the subject's contract, transmitted as attachment to reference, be amended as follows:

a. Paragraph 1 entitled, "Compensation" be changed from the present figure of \$3,600 per annum to \$4,525 per annum.

b. Paragraph 10 entitled, "Term" be changed to make the new contract effective as of the date of execution and remain in force for two years from that date.

4. Reference stated in Paragraph 3 that it is the usual practice for the Station to draw up agent contracts. Station Mexico will draw up a contract containing the changes noted above and will await Headquarters authorization before its execution.



Dear Mr. Gerende:

Effective _____ all contracts written or oral entered into between you and the United States are hereby terminated and in lieu thereof the following contract is substituted:

The United States Government, as represented by the Contracting Officer, hereby contracts with you for the purchase of certain information and related services of a confidential nature under the following terms and conditions:

1. Compensation. In full consideration for the purchase of such information and services, you will be paid an amount calculated at the rate of \$3600 per annum. Payments will be made as directed by you in writing in a manner acceptable to the Government.

2. Travel. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for authorized operational travel. All expenses incurred hereunder are subject to payment and accounting in compliance with Government regulations.

3. Operational Expenses. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for necessary operational expenses, as specifically approved by the Government. Such funds will be subject to accounting in compliance with Government regulations.

4. Repayment. It is recognized that your failure to account for or refund any monies advanced you hereunder shall entitle the Government to withhold the total amount of such indebtedness or any portion thereof from any monies due you under the terms of this contract in such manner as it deems appropriate.

5. Execution of Documents. If, in the performance of services under this contract, you assume the custody of Government funds or take title of record to property of any nature whatsoever and wherever situate, which property has in fact been purchased with monies of the U. S. Government, you hereby recognize and acknowledge the existence of a trust relationship, either express or constructive, and you agree to execute whatever documents may be required by the Government to evidence this relationship.

6. Status. You are not an employee of the United States Government under this agreement and are not entitled to any benefits normally incident to an employee status.

7. Secrecy. All information related to this agreement conveyed through instructions, this instrument, or otherwise, is secret and shall not be divulged to any person, organization or Government in any form or manner, except as authorized by the representative of the Government executing this agreement.

It is agreed that any revelation whatsoever of the above information will constitute and be an immediate and final breach of this agreement and will result in forfeiture by you of any and all benefits which may then have accrued to you by reason of this agreement.

8. Instructions. Instructions received by you from the Government in briefing, training or otherwise are a part of this contract and are incorporated herein, provided that such instructions are not inconsistent with the terms hereof.

9. Unauthorized Commitments. No promises or commitments pertaining to rights, privileges or benefits other than those expressly stipulated in writing in this agreement or any amendment thereto shall be binding on the Government.

10. Term. This contract is effective as of 1 October 1955, and shall continue thereafter for a period of two (2) years unless sooner terminated by the Government either:

- (a) By thirty (30) days' actual notice to you from the Government, or
- (b) Without prior notice, in the event of a breach of this contract by your violation of the security provisions hereof or by your otherwise rendering yourself unavailable for acceptable service.

Subject to the availability of appropriations, this agreement may be renewed for successive periods of one year each upon notice from the Government accepted by you. Termination of this agreement will not release you from the obligations of any security oath you may be required to take.







1. Paragraph 2(a) of reference asks what cover will be utilized by LIPSTICK-20 to cover full-time participation in LIPSTICK operations, and paragraph 2(b) asks how the large salary that he will draw will be covered. It is contemplated that LIPSTICK-20 will be employed as an assistant sales manager for LIPSTICK-19. This position is sufficiently flexible so that he will be able to devote almost all of his time to LIPSTICK operations and also explain his income. LIPSTICK-19 has been queried on this matter and has assured the Case Officer that there will be absolutely no suspicion regarding LIPSTICK-20's activities or source of income. David M. WILSTED is also employed by this same company but there is no reason for compartmentation to break down since each will be kept unwitting of the other's true identity.

2. Since LIPSTICK-19's business is expanding it is only natural to his friends and present employees that he should hire more people. No one associated with the business would ever know the amount of LIPSTICK-20's salary since he would be paid by LIPSTICK-19 privately, as is the custom in many businesses in this area.

3. The apparent difference in salary mentioned in paragraph 4 of reference is not correctly stated. It was initially requested that this Station be authorized by cable to pay the subject \$160.00 per month until his contract at an equivalent grade of GS-7 was approved. This Station appreciates the fact that subject's contract will be submitted at a GS-7 level and agrees with Headquarters that the provision for overtime compensation is unnecessary under the new wage increase. It is requested that this Station be notified by cable as soon as subject's contract is approved since this Station are most desirous that he commence work as soon as possible.

1. Subject has been employed by this Mission for approximately two months as a member of the LIPSTICK team and prior to that he has been known to the undersigned for about one year. During that time he has impressed all those who have dealt with him as a conscientious, devoted and hardworking individual. Those most intimately associated with him (Chester D. POLLICOVE and the undersigned) consider him most dependable and deserving of additional responsibility. He has shown great initiative and application in his duties with the LIPSTICK team.

2. He will graduate from a local college the beginning of June 1955 and is considering accepting employment with a PEFRIQUE firm in Mexico City. As all young men who have just graduated from college, he is looking for employment with a future and with some degree of security. He has indicated his desire of working for KUBARK on a full-time basis and it is this Mission's desire to so employ him. It is presently contemplated that he will assume the duties of Jerome K. NASHWINTER in charge of the LIPSTICK team, working in association with LIPSTICK-19, Chester D. POLLICOVE and the undersigned. The administration of the LIPSTICK team is a time-consuming and demanding task which LIPSTICK-20 appears to be well suited to assume. He will be given LIFINGER credentials with which he will be able to backstop the team and also to engage in investigative work for the solution of leads which the surveillance produce.

3. As has been stated in paragraph 2 above, he is desirous of accepting a job that has a future. Although he could be retained on LIPSTICK as an agent on a full-time basis, this would not satisfy his ambition for secure employment with a future. It is therefore requested that Headquarters write a contract for LIPSTICK-20 similar to that of David M. WILSTED's present contract at the equivalent salary of a GS-7 with the usual overtime provision that is included in WILSTED's contract. In order to provide for

continuity of employment between the time that the subject graduates from college and the time that his contract is ready, it is requested that this Mission be authorized by cable to place the subject on a full-time salary basis under the LIPSTICK project at 2,000 Mexican pesos per month or \$160.00 U.S. ✓

4. Generally the following duties are contemplated for LIPSTICK-20 for full time employment: (1) he will be given credentials in a local police service, and together with LIPSTICK-19 and others, maintain the investigative office of the LIPSTICK team; (2) he will be able to backstop the team with these credentials and engage in investigative work to solve the many leads that the surveillances produce; (3) he will prepare rough reports based upon the LIPSTICK surveillances; (4) he will provide a telephone central part of the day to which the LIPSTICK team will be able to report their position in code; (5) he may, at some future date, be used as a LIFEAT translator since he is completely bilingual; and (6) he may, at some future date, be used on other operational duties in a similar manner as other contract agents are employed at this Mission but only after he has proven himself and Headquarters concurrence has been obtained.

5. As an assistance to Headquarters in the granting of contract status to LIPSTICK-20, there is being forwarded by separate cover a revised PRQ, Part I, which was completed by LIPSTICK-20. This PRQ is considerably more complete than the initial PRQ which was submitted to Headquarters based upon information gathered from ODACID files and friends of the subject. The Case Officer was in receipt of erroneous information regarding the answers to Questions 10 and 28 wherein reference is made to the family dairy business. The PRQ submitted as a separate cover attachment to this dispatch correctly reflects the correct answers to those questions.

6. It is realized that Reference B does not apply to individuals in the Subject's position since he is not a citizen of FBPRIME. However, this individual does satisfy the other requirements of Reference B, i.e., language ability, area knowledge and natural cover potential. It is believed that, if given a contract, LIPSTICK-20 will be willing to work on a career basis for KUBARK and will fill a very great need of this Mission. Indigenous agents of his education, social status, intelligence and ability are not frequently to be found. Therefore his addition to the staff of the Mission as a contract agent is recommended.



I was born in the United States of an American citizen mother and a Mexican citizen father.

3. For what periods have you resided in the United States?

I resided in the United States from birth in 1933 to 1936 in New York, for nine months in 1940 in South Carolina, and from 1946 to 1948 in South Carolina.

4. Have you any other nationality? How was this nationality acquired?

I am also Mexican because I was born abroad to a Mexican citizen father.

5. For what periods have you resided abroad? In what countries?

I have lived in Mexico from 1936 to 1940, 1941 to 1946, and from 1948 to present date.

6. When did you first consider renouncing your American nationality?

I first considered renouncing my American nationality on March 31, 1952 when I was required by Mexican law to take out a Mexican Army Registration card since I wanted to be a Mexican citizen.

7. Explain completely your reasons for desiring to renounce your citizenship at this time.

I desire to renounce my American citizenship in order to be eligible to obtain a scholarship to a school in the United States given to a Mexican citizen. At present I intend to reside in Mexico after my education is completed. The Oath of the Renunciation of the Nationality of the United States by Ramon Joseph ALVAREZ and a questionnaire, sworn to by Mr. Alvarez, are enclosed. As there were some indications in the conversations with Mr. Alvarez that he desired to renounce his American citizenship for the purpose of precluding the possibility that he would ever have to perform military service in the Armed Forces of the United States and as he refused to register for United States Selective Service as required by the President's Proclamation of April 17, 1952, the Embassy desires to submit the facts in Mr. Alvarez's case to the Department and requests that the Department advise the Embassy under which provisions of Section 401 of the Nationality Act of 1940, the Certificate of Loss of the Nationality of the United States by Mr. Alvarez should be submitted.


Mr. Alvarez was born at New York, New York, on [redacted] of an American citizen mother and a Mexican citizen father. He resided in the United States from 1933 to 1936, for nine months in 1940, and from 1946 to 1948. He has spent the rest of his life in Mexico and was included in the registration of his mother, Janie Durant de Alvarez, at this office on July 10, 1940.

Mrs. Alvarez, who has been a respected member of the teaching staff of the American School in Mexico City for a number of years, first indicated over a year ago in an informal conversation with the Chief of the Citizenship Office of the Embassy, that her son was considering the renunciation of his American citizenship. She asked at that time at what age he could renounce and whether the renunciation would be held against him if, at some later date, he should desire to return to the United States for residence or to regain his citizenship. She stated then that her son was

trying to qualify for the Mexican Olympics Team and that he also would like to try for a scholarship to an American university as an alien student. She was informed, during the course of the conversation, that under the laws in effect at the time, her son could renounce his claim to American citizenship upon reaching his eighteenth birthday and there would be no stigma in connection with the renunciation.

Two weeks ago, Mr. Alvarez called at the Citizenship Office to discuss the renunciation of his American citizenship. He was asked at the time, by the interviewing Vice Consul, why he desired to renounce his citizenship. He stated he desired to renounce his citizenship so he would be eligible to receive a scholarship as an alien to a university in the United States and so there would be no possibility of his schooling's being interrupted by military service. He stated that he had registered for Mexican military service but that he did not expect to do the service as he would be in the United States. It therefore appeared to the interviewing Vice Consul that while Mr. Alvarez primarily desired to renounce his citizenship so he would be eligible for a scholarship as an alien, he also was motivated by a desire to avoid military training.

Mr. Alvarez was then asked why he desired to renounce at that particular time and why he had not done so upon reaching the age of eighteen. He stated that he desired to renounce so he would not have to register for Selective Service during the month of July at the Embassy. He was then informed of the provisions of Section 401(j) of the Nationality Act of 1940, and was told that because of the statements he had made, the possibility existed that his case might be considered as falling within the purview of that Section and if he were held to have lost his nationality under that provision of law, he would be ineligible to immigrate to the United States.

It was then suggested to Mr. Alvarez that he comply with the United States Selective Service Registration requirement to overcome the presumption that he was renouncing his American citizenship to avoid military service, that he wait to renounce his citizenship as there appeared to be no urgency other than avoiding the registration, and that if he later applied for a Certificate of Mexican Nationality or performed his Mexican military service, he would lose his American citizenship because of the declaration of allegiance to Mexico required in either case. He was further informed that three persons who are presently registering abroad are not at this time being called for military service. He replied, "That might be changed within the next two weeks". He then said that he would consider the matter further and return at a later date.

Mr. Alvarez called again on July 31, 1952, and stated that he wished to proceed with the renunciation. He was asked to answer the questions on the attached questionnaire for the purpose of establishing his reasons for desiring to renounce. It is believed that his answers are an accurate indication of his feelings concerning the renunciation of his citizenship.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Since Mr. Alvarez has several motives for renouncing his American citizenship and since one of the motives, his desire to renounce to avoid registering for military service, would seem to indicate that it is his intent to remain outside the United States or go to other lengths to avoid military service in the United States, the Embassy would appreciate the Department's decision whether he may be considered to have lost his nationality under the provisions of Section 401(f) or 401(j) of the Nationality Act of 1940.

It is believed that there will be several cases at this office of persons desiring to renounce their American citizenship, who have not previously complied with Selective Service registration requirements and do not intend to do so. Please inform the Embassy whether such cases should be considered to fall within the provisions of Section 401(f) or 401(j) of the Nationality Act of 1940.

The Oath of the Renunciation of the Nationality of the United States by Juan Jose ALVAREZ and a questionnaire, sworn to by Mr. Alvarez, are enclosed. As there were some indications in the conversation with Mr. Alvarez that he desired to renounce his American citizenship for the purpose of precluding the possibility that he would ever have to perform military service in the Armed Forces of the United States and as he refused to register for United States Selective Service as required by the President's Proclamation of April 17, 1952, the Embassy desires to submit the facts in Mr. Alvarez's case to the Department and requests that the Department advise the Embassy under which provision of Section 101 of the Nationality Act of 1940, the Certificate of Loss of the Nationality of the United States by Mr. Alvarez should be submitted.

Mr. Alvarez was born at New York, New York, on [redacted] of an American citizen mother and a Mexican citizen father. He resided in the United States from 1933 to 1936, for nine months in 1940, and from 1946 to 1948. He has spent the rest of his life in Mexico and was included in the registration of his mother, Janie Parent de Alvarez, at this office on July 10, 1946.

Mrs. Alvarez, who has been a permitted member of the teaching staff of the American School in Mexico City for a number of years, first indicated over a year ago in an informal conversation with the Chief of the Citizenship Office of the Embassy, that her son was considering the renunciation of his American citizenship. She asked at that time at what age he could renounce and whether the renunciation would be held against him if, at some later date, he should desire to return to the United States for residence or to regain his citizenship.
