Subject intentionally formed a Christian political movement in Cuba in opposition to the Castro regime. In April 1959 he fled Cuba. His organization was already in contact with CIA and he was placed in contact with Wallace A. Phillips. He agreed to cooperate with private agencies who would assist a Cuban liberation movement.
