Your Melbourne Station has sought my views on the possibility of declassifying a Warren Commission document in which reference is made to the The document in question is CD.971 dated 22nd May, 1964, together with an attachment dated 29th November, 1963.

I would recommend strongly that CD.971 and its attachment should not on any account be declassified or publicly released for reasons which include the following:

- (i) It has never been officially stated that there is a "C.I.A. Canberra Station" or that there are C.I.A. officers in This has been avoided as a point of policy.
- (ii) Publication of these facts would invoke a spate of questions by the Press and in which would be contrary to the national security interest, for example:
 - (a) Who approved the establishment of the "C.I.A. Canberra Station"?
 - (b) What is its composition and location?
 - (c) What is its purpose in
