(6) In those cases where CIA will be handling  its agent CIA will service security  or counterintelligence requirements and will provide  all agent information bearing on counterintelligence or  internal security matters, including the scope and nature
of the agent's access to information and the identities of the agent's significant contacts, particularly in the communist-bloc field. In such cases where CIA servicing has been inadequate to internal security interests, will have direct access to the agent.
