Congressian Donald G. Brotsman, Colorado, addressed a letter dated 1/2/70 to the Attorney General (AG) requesting information from him concerning the disappearance of subject. Enclosed is one copy each of the Controssman's letter and Eureau letter to the AG dated 1/14/70 for your information.

Also enclosed for your information is one copy each of CIA-memoranda Cated 6/31/59 and 6/2/50; Pulets to WO 5/12/CO and to Doston 5/25/CO, Doston letter to the Director dated 6/30/60; Poston report dated 8/31/60, all pertaining to subject. The above are being furnished for the completion of your file.

On 1/12/70 CIA advised through liaison that the subjects is not of operational interest to that Agency. With regard to at the subject's disappearance, CIA advised it did receive a report which could be characterized as a runor, that the subject was experiencing marked difficulties and had left his wife. The Agency does not have any information concerning subject's present whereabouts.

In subsequent communications concerning this matter you should delete the character of IS - CZ and use the character of this letter.

Unless additional pertinent information is developed, no investigation need be conducted by your office. If additional pertinent information is received concerning this matter, it should promptly be furnished to the Durcau by LHM.

was of some interest to CIA. On 4/15/69, CIA advised through liaison that subject had not left the U.S. and had been having difficulty with his wife and "ran away from her." CIA advised the story or rumor indicating subject may have gone to CZ was without foundation. In 12/69 Denver received a letter from subject's mother requesting information concerning subject's disappearance. Denver replied this was a matter not within the jurisdiction of the Eureau; however, offered if she so desired to place his name on the Dureau's missing persons list. Subject's mother replied to our Denver Office on 1/13/70 declining to have subject's name placed on the list. On 12/23/69 "The Denver Post," a daily newspaper in Denver. Colorado, published a lengthy article concerning the disappearance of subject. By letter dated 1/8/70 Congressman Brotzman, R-Colorado, also requested information concerning subject's disappearance from the AG. We have conducted no investigation of subject's disappearance since there are no indications of a violation of Federal law in our jurisdiction.
