On 6/15/65 JOHN T. DREYFUSS, Head of the Political 1/6/87 Section, American Embassy, Gustemala City, advised that he had never heard of subject or the transportation of ammunition from Gustemala to the anti-CASTRO forces in Cuba. (X) University of Section 1/8/80 100 Cuba.

On 6/16/65 ENRIQUE PERALTA DUARTE, Director General of the Immigration Department, Guatemala City, stated it would be impossible to identify the pilot and passengers in the B-25 plane in which subject claimed to have arrived in Guatemala in August, 1964. He said he did not think there were many places in the country where such a plane could land. He advised he had never heard of the shipment of ammunition from Guatemala to the anti-CASTRO forces in Cuba and stated it would first be necessary to sauggle the ammunition into Guatemala from Mexico. It should be noted that ENRIQUE PERALTA DUARTE is the son of the Chief of Government of Guatemala.

On 6/16/65 ALBERTO BARRIOS, Assistant Chief of the Judicial Police, Guatemala City, stated he thought the name of subject sounded familiar, but could not recall where he might have heard it. He advised that he would cause investigation to be made in an attempt to identify the companions of subject who arrived with him in Guatemala in August, 1964. He said he had never heard of the anti-CASTRO Cubans sending ammunition from Guatemala to Cuba.
