On 12/15/60 and 1/3/61 CIA furnished information via Italoen that a CIA source of unknown reliability advised that the Chinese Nationalists are collaborating with anti-Castro elements in an effort to overthrow the present Cuban Government. Source indicated Chinese Nationalist Government is transmitting funds to unidentified anti-Castro individuals and the captioned individuals, Chinese Nationalists, allegedly are involved in this matter. Both individuals reportedly live in Havana; however, [Hsu] is now in Miami, Florida, and [CHIANG] is in Taiwan (Formosa) conferring with Chinese Nationalist officials. (S) (U)

CIA is making discreet checks on Taiwan to determine if there is any truth to the foregoing information and Bureau will be advised of results. (S) (U)

CIA report 10/24/67 advised information was received from a Cuban newspaperman with excellent contacts among Kuomintang (official party of Chinese Nationalist Government) that Ramon G. Chiang left (S) Havana for Formosa to attend the 8th National Congress of the Kuomintang which was expected to start 10/16/67. (S)

(S) Ramon G. Chiong was described at that time as in his early 50's, a fairly prosperous businessman with financial interests in a Chinese grocery store and a Chinese restaurant in Havana. He has little formal education but is shrewd and a good public speaker and a veteran Kuomintang member. This report was classified "Confidential." (R)

CIA report 4/22/58 advised a Cuban newspaperman with good contacts in the Chinese colony in Havana reported Ramon G. Chiong, a member of the Kuomintang Central Committee of Formosa, left Havana for a three-week tour of the Chinese colonies in Panama, Peru, Chile, Uruguay, Argentina and Brazil on an official mission for the Kuomintang Central Committee. Purpose of mission was to assess state of Kuomintang Party in aforementioned countries. This report was classified "Secret". (R)

CIA report 3/23/60 advised information received from a Chinese businessman with contacts in Nationalist Chinese circles advising Ramon Chiong (CHIANG Te'u-fu, 5598/6337/4335) member of the Central Committee of the Kuomintang returned to Taiwan on 2/23/60. (S) He fled Cuba because he feared he was on the list for investigation by the Cuban Government inasmuch as he formerly was very close to Batista's regime. This report classified "Confidential." (R)

The foregoing is furnished for your information. In the event CIA furnishes additional data regarding captioned subjects, such data will be promptly forwarded your office. (S)(U)

NOTE: When this information was originally furnished by CIA to liaison agent the name of the first subject was indicated as [SHU JUNG NUN] (U). In checking the CTC numbers also furnished by CIA, it was apparent that the name provided by CIA was not the same as the Chinese name indicated by the Chinese Telegraphic Code Numbers. Liaison rechecked with CIA and on 1/3/61 we were advised that the name [SHU JUNG NUN] was an error but the CTC numbers were correct. Therefore, instant letter reflects the name of the first subject as derived from the Chinese Telegram Code. (A)
