Dear Mr. Chairman:

I am saddened but understanding regarding your letter of resignation going today to House Speaker Thomas ("Tip") O'Neill as Chairman of the Select Committee on Assassinations.

Out of my associations with you and your personal staff during all of the days following the introduction of your original Resolution, H. Res. 204 - to establish a Select Committee on Assassinations to reopen for investigation our political assassinations in America -- with its accompanying long waiting periods for its acceptance and approval, the volumes of supportive correspondence handled and legislative steps taken by you and your staff, the time and effort expended within the confines of your office and on the House floor, your total sincerity and understandable dedication in launching your crusade -- to see such dedicated personal effort and sacrifice sabotaged, twisted, maligned and brought to such fruitless finality -- in complete sadness and empathy I want you to know I share with you in your moment of total surrender to utter futility. For it is my absolute belief your "dream" of establishing a Select Committee and staff for the purpose of "solving" these assassinations has been unscrupulously distorted by others lacking your desire for truth and justice - to instead establishing a Select Committee and staff deeply involved in "creating" assassinations: in my opinion, Mr. Chairman, a tragedy, but more, a disgrace.

Mr. Chairman, as I wrote you at the time of my appointment to the staff of the Select Committee on Assassinations, " . . . I am honored and proud to serve you still," -- upon your resignation, that same honor and pride dictates my request to be immediately terminated as a member of the staff of the Select Committee on Assassinations.

I came to understand my appointment in the capacity I served in the Firm was a matter of reorganization and unknown to the Managing Partners. I took the matter to the President's (U.S.) Price Board and was advised the LOA undoubtedly was not receiving the approval of Management regarding the LOA's decision at reorganization. I saw nothing to do but resign from the Firm.
