[March 11, 1964] (S) (U)

It was ascertained that the Yugoslavs would have a ship leaving the US for Belgrade about the 10th of September, 1964. It was expected that LJUBOMIR LJUBIC, Consul of the Yugoslav Consulate, would be returning to Yugoslavia on the ship of September 10th. (S) (U)

ROBERT O. BLAKE of US Mission was in contact with DRAGAN BERNARDIC and they agreed to meet each other on Friday evening. BERNARDIC indicated that he was sorry to hear that BLAKE was leaving. BLAKE said that he will go to California first to visit his parents. BERNARDIC told BLAKE that he would be going to Belgrade shortly for a period of 20 days. (The trip to Belgrade by BERNARDIC is in connection with the recall of BERNARDIC FOR consultations in the Co-ordination Department from Information as furnished by CIA). (S) (U)

ED MC GOWAN was in contact with RADI (VILOTIJEVIC) and advised him that today was SUSAN BRIDGE's birthday. They exchanged greetings and then VILOTIJEVIC inquired about PHYLLIS (REED). MC GOWAN indicated that she is doing fine and they then agreed to get together in the future. (S) (U)

[March 16, 1964] (S) (U)

It was determined that DRAGAN BERNARDIC was leaving for Belgrade on Thursday, March 19th at 5:00 pm. (S) (U)

[March 17, 1964] (S) (U)

RUDI (STAJDUHAR) was incontact with MILAN ZUPAN. STAJDUHAR inquired if ZUPAN had had a private conversation last night. ZUPAN advised that he did at about 11:30 last night and that he told me about the weather in Washington. (this conversation may refer to the conversation ZUPAN had the previous night as reflected in the log coming from NY 4311-S\* under the date 3/16/64). (S) (U)

[SUSAN BRIDGE was in contact with HANNA (LNU). BRIDGE asked HANNA to try to get the last two copies of the French publication "Lex Press" (PH) as it contains articles (S) (U)
