He advised he was shot down on more than one occasion, was captured and made his escape. T-1 stated another individual who knew WILSON in Spain advised that WILSON was useless as an airman, was never a pilot and flew on one occasion only as a gunner.

T-1 stated in 1938 when he returned to England he spent three months in prison for passport fraud in connection with his trip to Spain. Later in 1938 he went to Buenos Aires and then to Chile where his anti-British activities caused embarrassment to the government and nearly led to his expulsion. In 1954 WILSON attempted to act as an intermediary in a copper deal with a Chilean firm. T-1 apprizes subject as a psychopathic case, always eager to inflate the importance of his activities and to seek publicity for them.
