Special Agent ~~JOSEPH KORJENEK~~ Thoroughbred Racing Track Protective Association, who is assigned to the Fair Grounds Race Track, New Orleans, advised that jockey PHIL ERNST was suspended indefinitely for using a "joint" on a horse that ran second during the first week of February, 1964. ~~KORJENEK~~ explained that a joint is an electrical device used on a horse to make the horse run.

EVERETT RAMSEY, PCI of this office and a former nationally known jockey, advised ERNST was riding horses using a battery with knowledge of race track officials. The batteries used by ERNST were purchased in New Orleans from one PHIL CASTELLI, 2900 Moniteau Drive, St. Louis, Mo. According to PCI, ERNST was using batteries with knowledge of several New Orleans race track officials and was caught when one official learned that he was not obtaining information relative to winners being ridden by ERNST.
