On April 6, 1967, TP 41-C, advised SA JOHN A. AMBLER that on Saturday, April 1, 1967, SANTO TRAFFICANTE met AUGUSTINE PRIMO LAZZARA at the Yellow House Bar, Ybor City, Tampa, Fla., during which time the recent telephone call made to the FBI was discussed. Source stated that TRAFFICANTE told PRIMO that the telephone call was "a dam fool thing to do" and that TRAFFICANTE personally wanted to find out who the "stupid jerk" was who made the call. Source stated that PRIMO indicated that he had been half drunk when agents first came to his house and at first, thought it was a joke but when learned who all the FBI had gone to, realized it was no joke and that the FBI meant business.

As to the affect surveillances have on SANTO TRAFFICANTE, it is noted that on 2/28/67, ARAM P. COSHGARIAN, attorney, confidentially advised SA WENDELL W. HALL, Miami, that TRAFFICANTE recently told GOSHGARIAN that he becomes extremely excited and nervous whenever under physical surveillance and stated surveillances "just kill me".
