6. Will maintain daily liaison with logical criminal informants, law enforcement authorities, and other logical sources of information throughout the Tampa Office territory in efforts to identify the Unknown Subject in this case.

HARRY P. MAXWELL rented a post office box at that station on 3/5/60, post office box number 6571. He furnished his home address as being 809 Nottingham Avenue, Orlando, Florida. His wife was listed in these records as being NOELIE A. MAXWELL.

According to LILLY, MAXWELL still receives an occasional piece of mail at the above post office box, and MAXWELL occasionally picks up his mail there.
