CG T-12 is an operator of a Las Vegas, Nevada,
"strip" hotel and gaming casino. (BELDEN KATLEMAN). U

CG T-19 is an operator of a Las Vegas, Nevada,
restaurant, and is close to JOSEPH PIGNATELLO, a close associate
of GIANCANA. (Las Vegas PCI ANDREW FAVA) U

CG T-24, no longer in Chicago, and whose whereabouts
are unknown, was formerly the "public relations" director
of the Cloister Inn, a Chicago Near North Side nightclub.
She was a girl friend of several Chicago nightclub operators
and minor hoodlums, and became associated with GIANCANA. Her
reliability at this point, however, is unknown, even though
she has furnished reliable information in the past. U

CG T-29 is current PCI DOMINIC SCALZETTI. He is
employed as an outside investigator and collector for the
Central National Bank, Chicago. He claims to have grown up
with Chicago hoodlums, MARSHALL CAIFANO, SAM GIANCANA, et al.
He has furnished reliable information in the past regarding
JOSEPH GLIMCO, and others in the Labor Union Field, in
addition to GIANCANA and CAIFANO. He has stated an intense
fear of the individuals, and has stated that he does not desire
that his identity or cooperation to the Bureau become known
for fear of reprisal to he and his family. U

CG T-30 is former PCI GLADYS EBLE, who resides in an apartment building adjacent to the Armory Lounge, Forest Park, Illinois. She is only slightly acquainted with GIANCANA, however, knows him by sight. She has been in a position to observe and furnish the identities of automobile license numbers in and near the Armory Lounge. U

CG T-31 is PCI HENRY H. HODL, who until recently was employed as card dealer and "lookout" at the Riviera Lounge, Niles, Illinois, which is an operation of GIANCANA through his lieutenant, ROCCO POTENZO. He has been extremely reluctant to furnish information; however, that which he has furnished has proved to be reliable. U

CG T-36 is a former PCI who was employed in the kitchen of MEO's Norwood House Restaurant, a one time hoodlum hangout. His whereabouts are now unknown. U

CG T-37 is former PCI MICHAEL GALLAGHER, who at one time was employed by MEO's Villa Venice Restaurant, Wheeling, Illinois. The information he furnished, although limited, was considered to be reliable. U

CG T-50 is former PCI TONY HORTON, a Chicago Bondsman, Negro, who was in a position to furnish information relating to the activities of another Bondsman; IRVING WEINER, known to be closely associated with the hoodlum element. His information was known to be very reliable. U

CG T-68 is PCI GERARD C. "HAT" MURRAY, an old time Chicago bookmaker who was recently severely beaten by Syndicate hoodlums in what turned out to be a successful attempt to bring him into the "syndicate" regarding his book-making activities. Although he is still a current PCI, the fact that he has "gone to the other side" makes his current reliability questionable, although the information he furnished proved to be reliable. U

CG T-70 is PCI BENJAMIN JULIUS HIRSCH, an old time Chicago confidence man who has a long record of arrests for larceny, forgery, etc. He was in an excellent position to furnish information regarding bookmaking wire services, and at one time was symbol number 5873-C. This matter was placed in a pending inactive status until recently in view of a Civil Suit which HIRSCH brought for false arrest from a Bureau apprehension in 1953. U
