ADMINISTRATIVE DATA:

The Baltimore Office by referenced airtel made available to Newark, reproductions of D-1 and D-2 forms filed by the Welfare Fund for the years 1959, 1962 and 1963 together with a report of Welfare Fund CPA, to Board of Trustees, dated 4/23/63, insurance data regarding the Welfare Fund plan and a complaint form regarding instant Welfare Fund complainant LLOYD THOMAS. THOMAS' complaint similar in content with information he has previously furnished the Newark Office.

Reporting the results of an examination of the above listed records is held in abeyance pending the proposed examination of the Welfare Fund records, as its presentation at that time will appear more logical.

AUSA MATTHEW P. BOYLAN, Newark, N. J., on 8/9/63, advised he had been telephonically contacted by one JACK BAILLARD, an attorney for the Office of W & PP who requested that he be advised as to the outcome of the FBI investigation in this matter.

On 8/12/63, AUSA BOYLAN advised further that BAILLARD in his conversation of 8/9/63 had also indicated that his (BAILLARD) office had previously received complaints concerning withheld contributions to captioned welfare fund.

CLIFFORD B. FINKLE, SR. on 7/26/63 advised SA WILLIAM F. FLYNN (A) that the welfare fund has subpoenaed records of PTTC for review to establish amount due to welfare fund in view of withheld contributions by PTTC. He advised his attorney, JAMES BRESLIN, is handling this matter. He further indicated it is their belief that this is the initial step to effect collection of withheld welfare contributions and expressed concern that the results of the FBI investigation might become known to the welfare fund who could use this information as a basis for a civil suit.

Mr. FINKLE, SR. was advised the report reflecting the result of the FBI investigation will be made available only to appropriate departments of the Federal Government.
