SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

(U) On 19 March 1963, Oswaldo FABRON-LIMA, UC 59 302 183, Trainee, Company B, 1st Battalion, 1st Training Regiment, Fort Jackson, South Carolina, whose reliability is unknown, was interviewed and furnished the following information:

1. (C) On or about 10 March 1963, FABRON received informational memorandums from HIS father, Fabron-Lima, Oswaldo, concerning military activities in Cuba. Attached as EXHIBIT I are the original memorandums written in the Spanish language. FABRON's father currently resides in Miami, Florida and is unemployed. FABRON's father was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Cuba and receives military information through members of the Masonic Lodge in Cuba. FABRON believes that HIS father gives this information to a man named Tarabochia, who lives in Miami and works for the United States Senate Security Committee. FABRON requested HIS father to forward this type information to HIM to keep HIMSELF abreast of the military build-up in Cuba. FABRON does not know the dates HIS father received the letters containing the information in the memorandums but stated HE would obtain this information. SUBJECT's father formerly worked for the United States Steel Corporation in Cuba and was active in politics prior to the rise of the Castro Government. Attached as EXHIBIT II is an English translation of the above referenced memorandums. P-5

2. (C) FABRON worked for the Movimiento Recuperacion Revolucionario (MRR) prior to HIS arrival in the United States. HE currently is not associated with any anti-Castro organization, however, HE is a confidant of Lira Cardona who keeps HIM abreast of Cuban activities in the United States. P-5

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

1. On 14 March 1963, Rinaldo Nicolas Blanco-Navarro, Proinductee Cuban National, Member of the 2506th Brigade, Date of Birth: 10 September 1938, Place of Birth: Meriacao, Havana, Cuba, Alien Registration Number: A13 312 777, volunteered the following information to an agent of the Intelligence Corps at the Armed Forces Examining Station, Coral Gables, Florida:

Source believes that GUTIERREZ-MENYO is an agent for, or a sympathizer of Castro's government. GUTIERREZ-MENYO is head of the Second Front of the Escambray, with headquarters located at 1st Street and SW 12th Avenue, Miami, Florida. HE is believed to be currently operating in the Florida Keys, conducting sabotage activities in Cuba. GUTIERREZ-MENYO is approximately 30 to 35 years of age; 67 or 68 inches tall; of slender build; weighs 150 to 160 pounds; has a medium complexion; wears glasses; and comes from a family originally from Spain. GUTIERREZ-MENYO came to the United States (US) in 1960, and was held by the Immigration authorities in Texas. HE testified at a trial at La Cabana (prison), Havana, Cuba, in early March 1960, and HE accused approximately 140 persons of being anti-Castro, and engaging in acts against the Cuban government. At the trial, GUTIERREZ-MENYO and William Morgan, submitted documentary proof that the two of them had been ordered by Castro, through Cuban G2, to infiltrate into anti-Castro elements so as to gain sufficient information to destroy them. Source headed a group in Cuba which was composed mainly of former soldiers of Batista. Sometime in June 1959, GUTIERREZ-MENYO and Morgan made contact with an anti-Castro element in Cuba. Morgan had made contact with an anti-Castro group in Santo Domingo which was planning an invasion of Cuba and would supply necessary arms for Source's group. GUTIERREZ-MENYO was head of another anti-Castro element, Second Front of the Escambray, in Cuba, and offered assistance to Source's group. Source immediately agreed to these offers of assistance. GUTIERREZ-MENYO became part of Source's group, and HE began running the activities of the group. The invasion force from Santo Domingo was scheduled to land on 13 August 1959, and Source's group was to make contact with the invading group and give assistance. On 7 August 1959, GUTIERREZ-MENYO betrayed the trust which was given to HIM, and HE reported Source's group to the Cuban G2, resulting in the arrest of Source and approximately 140 others. Although Source has heard that GUTIERREZ-MENYO is currently conducting anti-Castro activities, Source doubts the true intentions of GUTIERREZ-MENYO. (T-5)

2. On 14 March 1963, Source was adjudicated favorably for entrance into the US Marine Corps. (B-2)
