Informant advised that he had recently observed four cables prepared by [MIHAILO STEVOVIC] and forwarded to the Coordination Department, Belgrade, pertaining to information received by [STEVOVIC] from VIS source "CHARLY." (S) Informant described these cables as follows: (S)

A. Cable dated [1/23/64] pertaining to [a meeting] of the Interdepartmental Committee [1/19/64]. Information in this cable pertained to an [agreement] regarding the sale of wheat to [Yugoslavia]. (S)

B. Cable dated [1/23/64]. This cable pertained to an [agreement] Interdepartmental Committee meeting during which [agreement] was reached to provide Yugoslavia with U.S. surpluses. (S)

C. Cable dated [1/27/64]. Cable containing information (S) regarding [instructions] forwarded by the USDS to the U.S. Embassy, Belgrade, [authorizing and instructing the U.S. Embassy to commence negotiations regarding the sale to Yugoslavia of agricultural surpluses under PL 480.] (S)

D. Cable dated [1/27/64]. This cable contains (S) information pertaining to a meeting between representatives of the various departments, agencies and [White House] interested in an improvement in the PL 480 program. (S)

The [USDS and AID] will forward a [circular letter] (S) to all U.S. diplomatic establishments and AID missions located abroad in countries that receive U.S. [agricultural surpluses.] (S) The diplomatic establishments are to be advised that the U.S. Government, due to its policy regarding (S)

Informant advised that he used every opportunity
available to him to prepare in detail and in his own
handwriting the entire contents of the above cables which
he presented on this occasion. (S) (U)

furnished by the informant pertaining to [an appointment
scheduled between MIHAILO STEVOVIC and YIS source "CHARLY" (S)
for 12:30 p.m., 1/29/64, at Pierre's Restaurant,] Washington,
D.C. (S)

With regard to the above, the following pertinent
information was obtained by the informant: (S)

At approximately 11:50 a.m., [1/29/64] informant (S)
was visiting in the room of [DIMITRIJE DIMITRIJEVIC,] having (S)
a discussion with [ZIVKO MILIC, Borba correspondent,] in
Washington, D.C., and [DIMITRIJEVIC] regarding the [son of MILIC,]
who had recently [run away from home.] (S)

During this particular time [STEVOVIC] entered the (S)
office of [DIMITRIJEVIC] and the informant and [MILIC] departed. (S)
Informant immediately returned to the office of [DIMITRIJEVIC] (S)
continuing the conversation by commenting how [happy MILIC] (S)
was over the [return of his son.] While present in the office (S)
informant discreetly attempted to observe the activities of
[STEVOVIC] and observed that he was receiving a large sum of (S)
money. In the informant's presence [STEVOVIC] was observed (S)

counting money received from [DIMITRIJEVIC] and informant (S)
personally observed [STEVOVIC] count the sum of \$300 with a (S)
considerable amount of money still uncounted. Informant
also observed that [STEVOVIC] had signed a receipt for this (S)
money with the name "CHARLY." Informant was unable to observe (S)
the exact amount written by [STEVOVIC] for security reasons, (S)
but did observe that the money was in \$50, \$20 and \$10
denominations. From what the informant observed he
estimated that it was his personal opinion that [STEVOVIC] (S)
had received from [DIMITRIJEVIC] a sum totaling \$1,000. (S)
Informant also expressed the opinion that this money was to
be paid to "CHARLY" on 1/29/64 during their luncheon (S)
meeting scheduled for 12:30 p.m. at [Pierre's Restaurant.] (S)

Informant advised that he will continuously remain
alert for additional information received from "CHARLY" and (S)
will make this information available during the course of
a subsequent meeting. (S)

[4. LEOPOLDO ARAGON (S)
Code Name: "PEDRO"]

Informant advised that on [1/22/64 DJORDJE POZNANOVIC] (S)
met with [ARAGON] as scheduled at 11 a.m. at the [Dupont Plaza] (S)
Hotel, Washington, D.C. (S)

Informant advised that he accompanied [POZNANOVIC] (S)
to this meeting and waited in the vicinity until the meeting
was concluded and returned to the Embassy with [POZNANOVIC.] (S)

Informant learned that [ARAGON] furnished [POZNANOVIC] (S)
with a report pertaining to Panama and that [POZNANOVIC] had (S)
paid [ARAGON] the sum of \$50. (S)

The exchange of the report and money was accomplished
by passing each to the other under the table occupied
by them in the bar of the [Dupont Plaza Hotel.] (S)

Informant advised that he subsequently had an
opportunity to obtain the report furnished by [ARAGON] and (S)
photographed the contents thereof. Informant furnished
one roll of 35 millimeter film containing photographs of
this report. (S)

In addition, informant advised that he has discovered that due to a malfunction the desk occupied by POZNANOVIC at the Yugoslav Embassy fails to lock securely and can be unlatched with a hard pull. (S)

On [Saturday, 1/25/64] informant proceeded to the office of [POZNANOVIC, opened his desk] and removed therefrom the following material which he photographed and returned: (S) (S) (S)

- A. Plan of work for December, 1963
- B. Plan of work for January, 1964
- C. 1963 calendar

Regarding the latter item, informant advised that [POZNANOVIC had maintained in his desk] his 1963 calendar containing notations reflecting the names of his contacts for the entire year of 1963. Informant advised that he made numerous photographs of this 12-month calendar for presentation during the course of this meeting. Informant advised that this should clearly indicate the extent of [POZNANOVIC's] activities for the year 1963. (S) (S) (S)

Informant made available a roll of 35 millimeter film which will be forwarded to the Bureau under separate communication for processing. (S)

5. Aide Memoire Prepared by Yugoslav Embassy Regarding Attacks Against Yugoslav Diplomatic Personnel Assigned U.S. (S) (u)

During the afternoon of [1/29/64] informant initiated contact to advise that he had in his possession an aide memoire [currently being] prepared by the Yugoslav Embassy for presentation to the USDS regarding recent demonstrations against Yugoslav diplomatic personnel (S) (S) (S)

assigned to Chicago, Illinois. Informant advised that this aide memoire is to be presented to a representative of the U.S. by Ambassador VELJKO MICUNOVIC during the immediate future. Informant advised that he would make this aide memoire available [during meeting scheduled 1/29/64.] (S)

The aide memoire was made available by the informant, processed at the FBI Laboratory and returned to the informant during this meeting. (S)

On [1/30/64 WF 1318-S*] advised that Ambassador MICUNOVIC has an appointment scheduled with WILLIAM H. TYLER, Assistant Secretary, Bureau of European Affairs, USDS, for 12 noon 1/30/64. (S)

In addition, informant advised that in view of recent incidents against diplomatic representatives assigned to the Chicago Consulate MICUNOVIC had informed Belgrade of his desire to inform the USDS regarding this matter and to present an aide memoire. (S) (4)

The State Secretariat for Foreign Affairs (SSFA) in Belgrade agreed with the recommendations forwarded by MICUNOVIC but suggested that for the present the aide memoire be presented on the Assistant Secretary of State level rather than to higher officials. (S) (4)

Regarding the recent incident in Chicago involving an attack on VENCESLAV VUKOVIC, Secretary, and threats to NIKOLA KRAJINOVIC, informant advised that KRAJINOVIC is currently in Washington, D.C., in fear of his life. KRAJINOVIC came to Washington, D.C., to inform regarding the situation in Chicago and expects that someone will attempt to kill him upon his return. (S) (4)

KRAJINOVIC is expected to depart Washington, D.C., for his return to Chicago on 1/30/64. (S) (4)

Informant described KRAJINOVIC as an old Yugoslav Communist Party member and a prominent partisan who engaged (S) (4)

In many battles during World War II against the Germans, Chetniks and Ustashi. KRAJINOVIC has never been known to the informant to be a member of the Yugoslav Intelligence Service. (S) (4)

Informant advised that should anything happen to KRAJINOVIC while assigned to the U.S. it would be his opinion that drastic repercussions would result in relations between the U.S. and Yugoslavia. Such action might result in a severance of relations between the two countries or the recall of diplomatic personnel from the U.S. (S) (4)

Informant advised that he would continually remain alert for additional developments which may transpire regarding the above and will immediately furnish same to representatives of WFO. (S) (4)

On [1/30/64] informant initiated contact to advise (S) that an appointment, to be confirmed, has been made for MICHUNOVIC to deliver the aide memoire to Assistant Secretary TYLER of the USDS at 12 noon 1/30/64. (S)

[6. ROBERT V. KEKLEY
USDS] (S)

Informant observed a cable dated [1/23/64] forwarded (S) by the Yugoslav Embassy to [the SSFA, Belgrade] pertaining to (S) information received by [DJORDJE POZNANOVIC] from R. KEKLEY (S) of the USDS regarding the opinion of the USDS regarding a nonalignment conference. Informant advised that this was considered of importance since this was the first information received from [a functionary of the State Department] as to a nonalignment conference. (S)

Informant advised that he considered the information contained in this communication to have been very good and felt that it would be well received in Belgrade. This communication was signed by Ambassador MICHUNOVIC. (S) (4)

Informant advised that he prepared the complete details of this communication in his own handwriting for presentation during this meeting. (S) (4)

Informant advised that he prepared the contents of this communication in his own handwriting for presentation during this meeting. This report is in (the Serbo-Croatian language) and will be forwarded to the Bureau for (translation) purposes. (S) (S) (S)

8. Assassination-President JOHN F. KENNEDY

Informant recently observed a cable forwarded by the Yugoslav Embassy dated 1/21/64 to the Coordination Department, Belgrade, by Ambassador VELJKO MICUNOVIC regarding information obtained by MICUNOVIC during discussions with János Radványi, Hungarian Charge d' Affaires, Washington, D.C. This information pertained to information received by MICUNOVIC from Radványi regarding the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. Informant advised that this was of particular interest since it is the first communication he has ever observed forwarded by MICUNOVIC directly to the Coordination Department, Belgrade. (S)(u)

Informant advised that he prepared in his own handwriting the entire contents of this communication for presentation during this meeting. This communication is in (the Serbo-Croatian language) and will be forwarded to the Bureau under separate communication for (translation) purposes. (S) (S)

Informant advised (that in part this communication contains) the following information:

[Yugoslav Embassy in Moscow pertaining to] comments [received from ALEKSEI ADZHUBEI, editor of "Izvestia," regarding President JOHNSON.] (S) (u)

In part, [ADZHUBEI had] commented that the Soviets feel that President JOHNSON is a man of lesser caliber than was President KENNEDY and one who must continue the policies of his predecessor. (S) (u)

According to Soviet information, President JOHNSON had personally exerted his influence in the sale of wheat to the USSR and the question of the most favored nation. It was noted also that the U.S. is more realistic in its outlook on the world today.

Informant advised that he prepared in his own handwriting the entire contents of this communication for presentation during this meeting. This information was prepared by the informant in [the Serbo-Croatian language] and will be forwarded to the Bureau under separate communication for translation purposes. (S) (u)

10. President JOHNSON - Geneva Conference

[A communication dated 1/22/64 designated urgent was received at the Yugoslav Embassy from the SSFA, Belgrade, regarding information forwarded by the Yugoslav Embassy, Moscow, regarding] comments [received from Soviet representatives] regarding President JOHNSON and the Geneva negotiations. In part, this information is as follows: (S) (u)

President JOHNSON will not alter the policies of former President KENNEDY pending the next U.S. elections.

The Soviet Union does not take seriously the CIA report compiled regarding current Soviet economic development. (S) (u)

The Soviet Union is pleased with the reduction in the U.S. military and in particular with the reduction in uranium and plutonium. (S) (u)

Soviet representatives do not foresee any military intervention by the U.S. in Cuba. (\$) (4)

Pending the outcome of the next U.S. elections, President JOHNSON has no desire to meet with Premier KHRUSHCHEV. (\$) (4)

Informant prepared the entire contents of this communication in his own handwriting and in [the Serbo-Croatian language] for presentation during this meeting. (S)
This report will be forwarded to the Bureau under separate communication for [translation] purposes. (S)

[11. LESTER WARMER
PETER WALKER] (S)

On [1/28/64] NIKOLAI STEVOVIC met with PETER WALKER, (S)
the replacement for JULIUS KATZ, former Economic Advisor,
Office of Eastern European Affairs, USDS, at 10:30 a.m.
in WALKER's office. (S)

Informant has observed that an appointment with
["DELSKO"] had been scheduled for this time but had been (S)
canceled, for reasons unknown to the informant, and that
[STEVOVIC] had met with WALKER during this time. (S)

During a recent discussion with [STEVOVIC] informant (S)
learned that the Coordination Department, Belgrade, had
reviewed his plan of providing (an automobile) to a friend (S)
of his in Washington, D.C. [STEVOVIC] according to the (S)
informant, has not completed this transaction and because
of the Coordination Department's review of his request he
now finds himself in an embarrassing and difficult position.
The Coordination Department refused his plan because they
felt he was acting too fast in this direction. (S)

[STEVOVIC] commented to the informant that he had (S)
proposed to give a car to WALKER, who replaced KATZ, and (S)
all arrangements had been made until the Coordination
Department refused his plan. (S)

repeatedly inquired of [STEVOVIC] "What about my car?" (S)
[STEVOVIC] has advised [WALKER] that the car that he, [STEVOVIC], (S)
now has is [WALKER's] car and that he will make the exchange (S)
as soon as he can. According to [STEVOVIC], [WALKER] is ready (S)
and will accept a car from [STEVOVIC] when [STEVOVIC] can (S)
proceed with his plan. (S)

Informant has learned that on [1/28/64] [STEVOVIC] (S)
had a luncheon appointment with [LESTER VARNBERUN]. (S)

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture
Telephone Directory dated April, 1963, [LESTER A. VARNBERUN], Room (S)
[5624], is a [Barter and Stock Piling Deputy Manager, Program] (S)
Analysis, Foreign Agricultural Service. (S)

Informant advised that he is continuously alert
for information regarding [automobile] transactions contemplated (S)
by [STEVOVIC] and will furnish details upon receipt. (S)

[12. (FNU) "STURC"] (S)

On [1/27/64] [STEVOVIC] had a luncheon appointment (S)
scheduled with a Mr. [STURC.]. Informant was unable to (S)
furnish any additional information regarding this individual. (S)

[13. "DAVID C. CUTHELL"
USDS] (S)

On [1/30/64] [JOSIP PRESBURGER] has scheduled a (S)
luncheon appointment with [DAVID C. CUTHELL], "Deputy
Director for Far Eastern Affairs, USDS." (S)

Informant advised this luncheon appointment has
been scheduled for 1 p.m. [1/30/64] and [PRESBURGER] is to (S)
meet with [CUTHELL] at the C Street entrance to the USDS. (S)

to the Yugoslav Government regarding the Serbian Orthodox
Church in the U.S. ["BANE"] furnished information regarding (S)
comments made by Senator DODD in the Senate regarding the
Serbian Orthodox Church in the U.S. and efforts being
exerted by Belgrade to influence the church in the U.S. (S)

Informant advised that [CVETKOVIC] commented that (S)
he has not had an opportunity to prepare this information
for transmittal to Belgrade but expected to do so during
the immediate future. [CVETKOVIC] advised the informant that (S)
he requested ["BANE"] to ascertain additional information (S)
regarding the comments of Senator DODD, the reasons as to
why he made such a statement and from whom he had obtained
his details. (S)

Informant advised that he will remain alert
to obtain further details as obtained by ["BANE"] regarding (S)
this matter. (S)

[15. Ambassador NIKUNOVIC Dinner 2/4/64] (S) (u)

Ambassador NIKUNOVIC has scheduled a black tie
dinner to be held 2/4/64. In attendance will be Secretary
of State DEAN RUSK and his wife. (S) (u)

Yugoslav representatives present will be Ambassador
NIKUNOVIC, DRAGO RAPAJ, JOSIP PRISBURGER and CVIJETO JOB and
their wives. (S) (u)

Also in attendance will be WALTER LIPPMAN (New York Herald Tribune); JAMES RESTON, Chief, "New York Times," Washington, D.C.; Congressman JOHN BLATNIK and others whom the informant was unable to recall. (S) (4)

Informant advised that Ambassador MICUNOVIC has forwarded a communication to Belgrade requesting that the SSFA forwarded any special instructions for him during this dinner together with any topics they desire for him to discuss with Secretary RUSH. For the present informant advised that it is almost a certainty that MICUNOVIC will discuss with Secretary of State RUSH the question of "PL 480" and possibly the recent anti-Yugoslav demonstrations in Chicago, Illinois. (S) (4)

[Mrs. ZUPAN] has been visiting with the informant (S) and his family in Washington, D.C. Of importance is the fact that [Mrs. ZUPAN] is planning, if possible, to bring her children to the U.S. during the Summer of 1964. [Mrs. ZUPAN] (S) has commented that she and her husband hope to remain in the U.S. for a period of an additional three years. (S)
