 SUBJECT : Creditability of Service - Ross L. Crosier

1. Subject, a Career Agent currently assigned to Special Affairs Staff, will tender his resignation from the Agency on or about 16 August 1968. In the final review of his record, it was noted that Crosier had apparently been incorrectly categorized as a contract "agent" during a period of service extending from 1 June 1949 through 31 May 1957. To confirm the evidence found in the files, we have attempted to obtain the testimony of subject's former supervisors but, unfortunately, a number of them could not be identified and others are not available at Headquarters.
2. As an alternative, we have extracted copies of correspondence contained in Crosier's file which we believe provide sufficient evidence that subject was, in fact, an employee of the Agency during the period in question. Since Crosier was under non-official cover during the entire period (a major portion as a student), we found little evidence of regular office hours or day-by-day supervision. Irregularity of hours and a limited amount of supervision, however, are not unusual even for regular staff employees working under the same type of cover. We have, on the other hand, correspondence which reveal a degree of direction and control-including proposals for training, reassignment, and grade promotions - which are incompatible with his contractual status of independent contractor.
3. We are attaching a resume of statements made in the correspondence referred to, with copies of the correspondence itself, to substantiate the above. On the basis of these statements, it is requested that Crosier's service from 1 June 1949 through 31 May 1957 be deemed to have been in an employee status and hence creditable for annual leave purposes. Creditability for Civil Service Retirement, we understand, would be limited to the period 1 June 1949 through 31 December 1954 since amendments to the Social Security Act preclude extending such creditability to contract employees beyond the year 1954.

Reference is made to your contract with the United States Government, as represented by the Contracting Officer, effective 1 August 1954, as amended. Effective _____ said contract, as amended, is hereby terminated by mutual consent of the parties thereto and in lieu thereof the following agreement is substituted:

The United States Government, as represented by the Contracting Officer, hereby contracts with you for your services as a Career Agent under the following terms and conditions:

1. Status. By virtue of your relationship with the United States Government in the performance of services under this agreement your legal status is that of a Government employee under contract. As such, you are entitled only to the rights, privileges and benefits stipulated herein. It is understood that you will act under cover suitable to designate your relationship to the Government, but you will be subject to administrative and operational directions and control by the Government at all times.
2. Compensation. In full consideration for your services as a Career Agent, you will be compensated at the rate of \$4390 per annum, GS-11. In addition, you will be entitled to within-grade promotions in a manner similar to the procedures prescribed for Government staff employees. In the event that the salary level of your indicated grade is altered by Federal legislation and adopted by the Government, the compensation authorized under this contract shall be altered accordingly. Payments will be made hereunder as directed by you in writing in a manner acceptable to the Government.
3. Taxes. (a) In the event there are not withheld by your cover facility or in the event your cover facility withholds taxes on only part of the compensation due you hereunder, the Government, in view of security considerations involved, will withhold Federal income taxes from all or the remainder of taxable monies due you under this contract in an amount equivalent to the United States income tax withholding schedule based upon your taxable income under this agreement and _____ present taxation(s). Sums so withheld by the Government will be paid over to the Internal Revenue Service. No Form W-2 will be issued you by the Government and you will be instructed as to the method to be followed in making timely filing of returns, estimation and payments in order to preserve security.
(b) If for cover considerations your tax payments exceed your true tax liability under this agreement, the Government will make appropriate reimbursements in conformance with applicable policies and procedures.
4. Allowances. (a) You will be entitled to living quarters allowances in conformance with and at the rates prescribed in the Standardized Regulations, Government Civilians, Foreign Areas.

(b) In addition to the above payments, you will be entitled to an equalization allowance calculated at the rate of \$2180 per annum. This allowance is in lieu of any present or future standardized post allowance established for your present permanent post of duty overseas, but is subject to the entitlement provisions applicable to standardized post allowances. It is understood and agreed that this allowance is predicated upon the comparative cost of living between Washington, D. C., and your overseas post, your unofficial cover, family status and basic compensation. Consequently, this allowance may be unilaterally adjusted or discontinued by the Government whenever warranted by a change in any of these factors. No accounting will be required for this allowance.

5. Travel. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for the following travel and transportation expenses:

(a) For you alone for authorized operational travel. In addition, you will be entitled to reimbursement in accordance with standardized Government rates for the authorized official use of your private automobile.

(b) Upon the satisfactory completion of such two (2) years of successful overseas service under this contract, you will be entitled to home leave travel expenses for you and your dependents from your permanent post of duty overseas to your place of recorded residence in the United States and return travel expenses to your permanent post of duty overseas; provided, however, that you have fulfilled any other requirements relating to home leave which are applicable to Government staff employees.

(c) Upon the successful completion of your service under this agreement, for you, your dependents, your household effects and your private automobile from your permanent post of assignment overseas to your place of residence in the United States.

You will be entitled to pay claim in lieu of reimbursement to the cost of all travel performed hereunder and, when authorized, for you alone while on temporary duty away from your permanent post of assignment. All travel, transportation and per diem provided for under this paragraph must be properly authorized and expenses incurred hereunder are subject to payment and accounting in compliance with applicable Government regulations.

6. Operational Expenses. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for necessary operational expenses including, but not limited to, entertainment and the purchase of information, as specifically approved by the Government. Such funds will be subject to accounting in compliance with Government regulations.

7. Repayment. It is recognized that your failure to account for or refund any monies advanced you hereunder shall entitle the Government to withhold the total amount of such indebtedness or any portion thereof from any monies due you under the terms of this contract in such manner as it deems appropriate.

6. Benefits. (a) You will be entitled to death and disability benefits equal to those authorized under the Federal Employees' Compensation Act, as amended. Claims by you, your heirs, or legal representatives under this paragraph will be processed by the Government in accordance with its procedures in such manner as not to impair security.

(b) You will be entitled to continuance of pay and allowances in a manner similar to that set forth in the Missing Persons Act (50 U.S.C.A., App. 1001-1015).

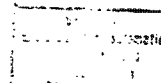
(c) You will be entitled to sick and annual leave equal to and subject to the same rules and regulations applicable to Government staff employees. Such annual leave may only be taken at times and places approved in advance by appropriate representatives of the Government. All accrued but unused leave earned under your contract with the United States Government effective 1 August 1954, as amended, will be transferred to your leave account under this agreement in conformance with established crediting procedures.

(d) From the compensation paid you pursuant to this contract, there shall be deducted the appropriate rate percentage (presently 6 1/2%) for deposit and eventual crediting to the Civil Service Retirement Fund. If the conditions of your cover warrant or require that you make contributions to the Social Security fund, such contributions shall be at your expense.

9. Cover. It is anticipated that you will undertake certain cover employment in the course of your performance under this agreement. It is expressly understood and agreed that any and all documents which you may execute in the course of such cover employment are subordinate to this agreement and any contradiction in terms which may in any way amplify, extend or restrict your rights and/or obligations hereunder shall be resolved by this agreement which shall always be dominant.

10. Offset. Any and all compensation, allowances or other benefits (including benefits in kind) received from or through your cover activities will be used to offset amounts due you under this contract and will reduce accordingly the Government's direct payment obligations hereunder. Sums so offset are payment by the Government under this contract and for purposes of Federal income taxation. You will report every six (6) months during the term of this agreement all benefits received from or through your cover activities and, if such benefits exceed those due you under this contract, the report will be accompanied by said excess amount, which you hereby agree is the sole property of the Government. Failure to submit timely reports and, as appropriate, excess payments, may result in suspension of any payments due you hereunder. As an alternative to the above, the Government may at any time exercise its basic right to require payment over to it of the emoluments received by you from or through your cover activities which would otherwise be offset as described above. In such case the Government will pay directly to you the emoluments called for by this contract.

11. Execution of Documents. If, in the performance of services under this contract, you assume the custody of Government funds or take title of record to property of any nature whatsoever and wherever situate, which property has in fact been purchased with monies of the U. S. Government, you hereby recognize and acknowledge the existence of a trust relationship, either express or constructive, and you agree to execute whatever documents may be required by the Government to evidence this relationship.



12. Secrecy. You will be required to keep forever secret this contract and all information which you may obtain by reason hereof (unless released in writing by the Government from such obligation), with full knowledge that violation of such secrecy may subject you to criminal prosecution under the Espionage Laws, dated 25 June 1943, as amended, and other applicable laws and regulations.

13. Instructions. Instructions received by you from the Government in briefing, training or otherwise are a part of this contract and are incorporated herein, provided that such instructions are not inconsistent with the terms hereof.

14. Unauthorized Commitments. No promises or commitments pertaining to rights, privileges or benefits other than those expressly stipulated in writing in this agreement or any amendment thereto shall be binding on the Government.

15. Term. This contract is effective as of _____ and shall continue thereafter for an indefinite period unless sooner terminated either:

- (a) By sixty (60) days' actual notice by either party hereto, or
- (b) Without prior notice by the Government, in the event of a breach of this contract by your violation of the security provisions hereof or by your otherwise rendering yourself unavailable for acceptable service.

In the event of voluntary termination on your part or termination for cause by the Government you will not be entitled to the travel expenses set forth in paragraph five (5)(c) supra. Termination of this agreement will not release you from the obligations of any security oath you may be required to take.

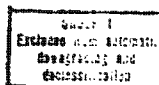

Contract to Career Agent Status

REFERENCE : HKH-A-2577

1. Referenced dispatch from the field recommends the conversion of contract agent Arthur G. VAIVADA to staff status and presents a strong case for such conversion. Upon receiving a formal WHD request for such action, however, your Plans Staff suggested that career agent status would be more appropriate in this case, and further indicated that staff status for VAIVADA is virtually out of the question at this time. The request is being re-submitted, therefore, in revised form to provide for conversion to career rather than staff status.
2. VAIVADA has served CIA in a contract capacity since 1949, with a continuous high level of performance; first in Costa Rica, later in Guatemala and Cuba. He is currently assigned to Cuba and is expected to remain there indefinitely. VAIVADA is 34 years old and was promoted recently to the equivalent of a GS-10 rating. His expressed career interests lie in continued employment by CIA, more especially in the area of unofficial cover assignments, for which he is highly suited.
3. In view of VAIVADA's outstanding record as a contract agent, his strong overall qualifications, and his expressed desire for a career with CIA, it is recommended that he be granted career agent status. A PHS and a new contract check list (in duplicate) are attached.
4. WH Division contemplates bringing VAIVADA to the U.S. for covert training during the latter part of 1957.
5. Approval for the conversion of VAIVADA from contract to career agent status, as indicated above, is hereby requested.

Effective 31 August 1953 said contract is hereby terminated by mutual consent of the parties thereto and in lieu thereof the following contract is substituted:

The United States Government, as represented by the ^{Contracting Officer} Central Intelligence Agency, hereby contracts with you for the purchase of certain information and related services of a confidential nature under the following terms and conditions:

1. Compensation. In full consideration for the purchase of such information and services, you will be paid an amount calculated at the rate of \$4200 per annum. Payments will be made as directed by you in writing in a manner acceptable to CIA. ^{Contracting Officer} No taxes will be withheld from this amount, and it will be your responsibility to report such income under existing Federal income tax laws and regulations.
2. Allowance. Effective upon your arrival at your permanent post of duty overseas, you will be entitled to a Quarters allowance equivalent to that granted a GS-7 Government employee stationed at the same permanent post of duty. This allowance will be at the maximum rates prescribed in the Standardized Regulations (Government Civilian, Foreign Areas). No accounting for this allowance will be required by CIA. In the event that Quarters are provided by your cover company, you will not be entitled to the Quarters allowance herein indicated.
3. Travel. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for travel and transportation expenses for you, your dependents and your household effects to and from your permanent post of duty overseas and for you alone for authorized travel within your operational area. You will be entitled to per diem in lieu of subsistence during such travel and while in training in the United States. All travel, transportation and per diem provided for under this paragraph must be properly authorized, and expenses incurred hereunder are subject to payment and accounting in compliance with CIA regulations.
4. Operational Expenses. In addition to the allowance indicated above, you will be advanced or reimbursed funds for necessary operational expenses including, but not limited to, entertainment and the purchase of information as specifically approved by CIA. Such funds will be subject to accounting in substantial compliance with CIA regulations.
5. Leave. You will be entitled to fourteen (14) calendar days' leave per contract year. Such leave may be accrued during the term of this contract or any renewal hereof but payment in lieu of unused leave will not be authorized. Such leave may only be taken at times and places approved in advance by appropriate representatives of CIA.
6. Cover. It is anticipated that you will undertake certain cover employment in the course of your performance under this agreement. It is expressly understood and agreed that any and all documents which you may execute in the course of such cover employment are subordinate to this agreement and any contradiction in terms which may in any way amplify, extend, restrict your rights and/or obligations hereunder shall be resolved in the agreement which shall always be dominant.

7. Offset. Any sums or substantially similar benefits or allowances received from your commercial cover as differentiated from your student cover will be used to offset those due under this contract by CIA. Sums, similar benefits or allowances thus received through your commercial cover are acknowledged and agreed to be payment by CIA within the provisions of this contract. You will report all sums or substantially similar benefits received from said commercial cover at least every six months during the term of this contract.

8. Execution of Documents. If, in the performance of your cover service, you assume the custody of government funds or take title of record to property of any nature whatsoever and wherever situate, which property has in fact been purchased with monies of the U. Government, you hereby recognize and acknowledge the existence of a trust relationship, either express or constructive, and you agree to execute whatever documents may be required by CIA to evidence this relationship.

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You will be entitled to per diem in lieu of subsistence in the course of such travel. All travel, transportation and per diem provided for under this paragraph must be properly authorized, and expenses incurred hereunder are subject to payment and accounting in compliance with CIA regulations.

Reference is made to your contract effective 1 June 1949 with ODYORK for the purchase of information and services of a confidential nature.

Effective 31 August 1953 said contract is hereby terminated by mutual consent of the parties thereto and in lieu thereof the following contract is substituted:

ODYORK, as represented by the contracting officer, hereby contracts with you for the purchase of certain information and related services of a confidential nature under the following terms and conditions:

1. Compensation. In full consideration for the purchase of such information and services, you will be paid an amount calculated at the rate of \$4200 per annum. Payments will be made as directed by you in writing in a manner acceptable to KUBARK. No taxes will be withheld from this amount, and it will be your responsibility to report such income under existing Federal income tax laws and regulations.
2. Allowance. Effective upon your arrival at your permanent post of duty overseas, you will be entitled to a Quarters allowance equivalent to that granted a GS-7 Government employee stationed at the same permanent post of duty. This allowance will be at the maximum rates prescribed in the Standardized Regulations (Government Civilians, Foreign Areas). No accounting for this allowance will be required by KUBARK. In the event that Quarters are provided by your cover company, you will not be entitled to the Quarters allowance herein indicated.
3. Travel. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for travel and transportation expenses for you, your dependents and your household effects to and from your permanent post of duty overseas and for you alone for authorized travel within your operational area. You will be entitled to per diem in lieu of subsistence during such travel and while in training in FBPRIME. All travel, transportation and per diem provided for under this paragraph must be properly authorized, and expenses incurred hereunder are subject to payment and accounting in compliance with KUBARK regulations.
4. Operational Expenses. In addition to the allowance indicated above, you will be advanced or reimbursed funds for necessary operational expenses including, but not limited to, entertainment and the purchase of information as specifically approved by KUBARK. Reference is made to your contract with the United States Government, as represented by the Contracting Officer, effective 1 August 1954, as amended. Effective 24 May 1955, said contract, as amended, is hereby terminated by mutual consent of the parties thereto and in lieu thereof the following agreement is substituted:

The United States Government, as represented by the Contracting Officer, hereby contracts with you for your services as a Career Agent under the following terms and conditions:

1. Status. By virtue of your relationship with the United States Government in the performance of services under this agreement your legal status is that of a Government employee under contract. As such, you are entitled only to the rights, privileges and benefits stipulated herein. It is understood that you will act under cover suitable to disguise your relationship to the Government, but you will be subject to administrative and operational directions and control by the Government at all times.
2. Compensation. In full consideration for your services as a Career Agent, you will be compensated at the rate of \$6390 per annum, GS-11. In addition, you will be entitled to within-grade promotions in a manner similar to the procedures prescribed for Government staff employees. In the event that the salary level of your indicated grade is altered by Federal legislation and adopted by the Government, the compensation authorized under this contract shall be altered accordingly. Payments will be made hereunder as directed by you in writing in a manner acceptable to the Government.
3. Taxes. (a) In the event taxes are not withheld by your cover facility or in the event your cover facility withholds taxes on only part of the compensation due you hereunder, the Government, in view of security considerations involved, will withhold Federal income taxes from all or the remainder of taxable monies due you under this contract in an amount equivalent to the United States income tax withholding schedule based upon your taxable income under this agreement and present exemption(s). Sums so withheld by the Government will be paid over to the Internal Revenue Service. No Form W-2 will be issued you by the Government and you will be instructed as to the method to be followed in making timely filing of returns, estimates and payments in order to preserve security.
(b) If for cover considerations your tax payments exceed your true tax liability under this agreement, the Government will make appropriate reimbursements in conformance with applicable policies and procedures.
4. Allowances. (a) You will be entitled to living quarters allowances in conformance with and at the rates prescribed in the Standardized Regulations (Government of the United States of America).

(b) In addition to the above payments, you will be entitled to an equalization allowance calculated at the rate of \$2000 per annum. This allowance is in lieu of any present or future standardized post allowance established for your present permanent post of duty overseas, but is subject to the entitlement provisions applicable to standardized post allowances. It is understood and agreed that this allowance is predicated upon the comparative cost of living between Washington, D. C., and your overseas post, your unofficial cover, family status and basic compensation. Consequently, this allowance may be unilaterally adjusted or discontinued by the Government whenever warranted by a change in any of these factors. No accounting will be required for this allowance.

5. Travel. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for the following travel and transportation expenses:

(a) For you alone for authorized operational travel. In addition, you will be entitled to reimbursement in accordance with standardized Government rates for the authorized official use of your private automobile.

(b) Upon the satisfactory completion of each two (2) years of successful overseas service under this contract, you will be entitled to home leave travel expenses for you and your dependents from your permanent post of duty overseas to your place of recorded residence in the United States and return travel expenses to your permanent post of duty overseas; provided, however, that you have fulfilled any other requirements relating to home leave which are applicable to Government staff employees.

(c) Upon the successful completion of your services under this agreement, for you, your dependents, your household effects and your private automobile from your permanent post of assignment overseas to your place of residence in the United States.

You will be entitled to per diem in lieu of subsistence in the course of all travel performed hereunder and, when authorized, for you alone while on temporary duty away from your permanent post of assignment. All travel, transportation and per diem provided for under this paragraph must be properly authorized and expenses incurred hereunder are subject to payment and accounting in compliance with applicable Government regulations.

6. Operational Expenses. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for necessary operational expenses including, but not limited to, entertainment and the purchase of information, as specifically approved by the Government. Such funds will be subject to accounting in compliance with Government regulations.

7. Repayment. It is recognized that your failure to account for or refund any monies advanced you hereunder shall entitle the Government to withhold the total amount of such indebtedness or any portion thereof from any monies due you under the terms of this contract in such manner as it deems appropriate.

8. Benefits. (a) You will be entitled to death and disability benefits equal to those authorized under the Federal Employees' Compensation Act, as amended. Claims by you, your heirs, or legal representatives under this paragraph will be processed by the Government in accordance with its procedures in such manner as not to impair security.

(b) You will be entitled to continuance of pay and allowances in a manner similar to that set forth in the Missing Persons Act (50 U.S.C.A., App. 1001-1015).

(c) You will be entitled to sick and annual leave equal to and subject to the same rules and regulations applicable to Government staff employees. Such annual leave may only be taken at times and places approved in advance by appropriate representatives of the Government. All accrued but unused leave earned under your contract with the United States Government effective 1 August 1954, as amended, will be transferred to your leave account under this agreement in conformance with established crediting procedures.

(d) From the compensation paid you pursuant to this contract, there shall be deducted the appropriate rate percentage (presently 6 1/2%) for deposit and eventual crediting to the Civil Service Retirement Fund. If the conditions of your cover warrant or require that you make contributions to the Social Security fund, such contributions shall be at your expense.

9. Cover. It is anticipated that you will undertake certain cover employment in the course of your performance under this agreement. It is expressly understood and agreed that any and all documents which you may execute in the course of such cover employment are subordinate to this agreement and any contradiction in terms which may in any way amplify, extend or restrict your rights and/or obligations hereunder shall be resolved by this agreement which shall always be dominant.

10. Offset. Any and all compensation, allowances or other benefits (including benefits in kind) received from or through your cover activities will be used to offset amounts due you under this contract and will reduce accordingly the Government's direct payment obligation hereunder. Sums so offset are payment by the Government under this contract and for purposes of Federal income taxation. You will report every six (6) months during the term of this agreement all benefits received from or through your cover activities and, if such benefits exceed those due you under this contract, the report will be accompanied by said excess amount, which you hereby agree is the sole property of the Government. Failure to submit timely reports and, as appropriate, excess payments, may result in suspension of any payments due you hereunder. As an alternative to the above, the Government may at any time exercise its basic right to require payment over to it of the emoluments received by you from or through your cover activities which would otherwise be offset as described above. In such cases the Government will pay directly to you the emoluments called for by this contract.

11. Execution of Documents. If, in the performance of services under this contract, you assume the custody of Government funds or take title of record to property of any nature whatsoever and wherever situate, which property has in fact been purchased with monies of the U. S. Government, you hereby recognize and acknowledge the existence of a trust relationship, either express or constructive, and you agree to execute whatever documents may be required by the Government to evidence this relationship.

12. Secrecy. You will be required to keep forever secret this contract and all information which you may obtain by reason hereof (unless released in writing by the Government from such obligation), with full knowledge that violation of such secrecy may subject you to criminal prosecution under the Espionage Laws, dated 25 June 1948, as amended, and other applicable laws and regulations.

13. Instructions. Instructions received by you from the Government in briefing, training or otherwise are a part of this contract and are incorporated herein, provided that such instructions are not inconsistent with the terms hereof.

14. Unauthorized Commitments. No promises or commitments pertaining to rights, privileges or benefits other than those expressly stipulated in writing in this agreement or any amendment thereto shall be binding on the Government.

15. Term. This contract is effective as of June 17 and shall continue thereafter for an indefinite period unless sooner terminated either:

(a) By ninety (90) days' actual notice by either party hereto, or

(b) Without prior notice by the Government, in the event of a breach of this contract by your violation of the security provisions hereof or by your otherwise rendering yourself unavailable for acceptable service.

In the event of voluntary termination on your part or termination for cause by the Government you will not be entitled to the travel expenses set forth in paragraph five (5)(c) supra. Termination of this agreement will not release you from the obligations of any security oath you may be required to take.

REFERENCE : HKI-A-2577

1. Referenced dispatch from the field recommends the conversion of contract agent ~~VAIVADA~~ to staff status and presents a strong case for such conversion. Upon receiving a formal WHO request for such action, however, your Plans Staff suggested that career agent status would be more appropriate in this case, and further indicated that staff status for ~~VAIVADA~~ is virtually out of the question at this time. The request is being re-submitted, therefore, in revised form to provide for conversion to career rather than staff status.

2. ~~VAIVADA~~ has served CIA in a contract capacity since 1949, with a continuous high level of performance; first in Costa Rica, later in Guatemala and Cuba. He is currently assigned to Cuba and is expected to remain there indefinitely. ~~VAIVADA~~ is 34 years old and was promoted recently to the equivalent of a GS-10 rating. His expressed career interests lie in continued employment by CIA, more especially in the area of unofficial cover assignments, for which he is highly suited.

3. In view of VAIVADA's outstanding record as a contract agent, his strong overall qualifications, and his expressed desire for a career with CIA, it is recommended that he be granted career agent status. A PHS and a new contract check list (in duplicate) are attached.

4. WH Division contemplates bringing ~~VAIVADA~~ to the U.S. for covert training during the latter part of 1957.

5. Approval for the conversion of ~~VAIVADA~~ from contract to career agent status, as indicated above, is hereby requested.



Reference is made to your contract, as amended, effective 1 September 1953 with the United States Government, as represented by the Central Intelligence Agency, for the purchase of information and services of a confidential nature.

Effective 31 July 1954, said contract is hereby terminated by mutual consent of the parties thereto and in lieu thereof the following contract is substituted:

The United States Government, as represented by the Central Intelligence Agency, hereby contracts with you for the purchase of certain information and related services of a confidential nature under the following terms and conditions:

1. Compensation. In full consideration for the purchase of such information and services, you will be paid an amount calculated at the rate of \$5060.00 per annum. Payments will be made as directed by you in writing in a manner acceptable to CIA. No taxes will be withheld from this amount, but it will be your responsibility to report such income under existing Federal income tax laws and regulations.

2. Allowances. Effective upon your arrival at your permanent post of duty overseas, you will be entitled to: (a) A Quarters allowance equivalent to that granted a GS-9 Government employee stationed at the same permanent post of duty. This allowance will be at the maximum rates prescribed in the Standardized Regulations (Government Civilians, Foreign Areas). No accounting for this allowance will be required by CIA. In the event that Quarters are provided by your cover facility, you will not be entitled to the Quarters allowance herein indicated.

(b) Cost of living allowances in conformance with the Standardized Regulations (Government Civilians, Foreign Areas).

3. Travel. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for the following travel and transportation expenses:

(a) For you from Washington, D. C. to your permanent post of duty overseas.

(b) For your dependents and your household effects from your old to your new permanent post of duty overseas.

(c) For you alone for authorized travel within your operational area.

(d) For you, your dependents and your household effects from your permanent post of duty overseas to your place of recorded residence upon the satisfactory completion of the terms of this contract or any renewal thereof.

You will be entitled to per diem in lieu of subsistence in the course of such travel. All travel, transportation and per diem provided for under this paragraph must be properly authorized, and expenses incurred hereunder are subject to payment and accounting in compliance with CIA regulations.

4. Operational Expenses. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for necessary operational expenses including, but not limited to, tuition, books, entertainment and the purchase of information as specifically approved by CIA. Such funds will be subject to accounting in substantial compliance with CIA regulations.

5. Benefits. (a) You will be entitled to death and disability benefits equal to those authorized under the Federal Employees' Compensation Act, as amended. Claims by you, your heirs, or legal representatives under this paragraph will be processed by CIA in accordance with its procedures in such manner as not to impair security.

(b) You will be entitled to continuance of pay and allowances in a manner similar to that set forth in the Missing Persons Act (50 U.S.C.A., App. 1001-1015).

(c) You will be entitled to fourteen (14) calendar days' leave per contract year. Such leave may be accrued during the term of this contract or any renewal hereof but payment in lieu of unused leave will not be authorized. Such leave may only be taken at times and places approved in advance by appropriate representatives of CIA.

6. Cover. It is anticipated that you will undertake certain cover employment in the course of your performance under this agreement. It is expressly understood and agreed that any and all documents which you may execute in the course of such cover employment are subordinate to this agreement and any contradiction in terms which may in any way amplify, extend or restrict your rights and/or obligations hereunder shall be resolved by this agreement which shall always be dominant.

7. Offset. Any sums or substantially similar benefits or allowances received from your cover facility (if you use the G.I. Bill of Rights any allowances received by you under said bill except tuition payments) will be used to offset those due under this contract by the Government. Sums, similar benefits or allowances thus received are acknowledged and agreed to be payment by the Government within the provisions of this contract. You will report all sums or substantially similar benefits received at least every six (6) months during the term of this contract.

8. Execution of Documents. If, in the performance of your cover service, you assume the custody of government funds or take title of record to property of any nature whatsoever and wherever situate, which property has in fact been purchased with monies of the U.S. Government, you hereby recognize and acknowledge the existence of a trust relationship, either express or constructive, and you agree to execute whatever documents may be required by CIA to evidence this relationship.

9. Status. You are not an employee of the United States Government under this agreement and are not entitled to any benefits normally incident to an employee status, except as specifically enumerated herein.

10. Secrecy. You will be required to keep forever secret this contract and all information which you may obtain by reason hereof (unless released in writing by CIA from such obligation), with full knowledge that violation

of such secrecy may subject you to criminal prosecution under the Espionage Laws, dated 25 June 1948, as amended, and other applicable laws and regulations.

11. Instructions. Instructions received by you from CIA in briefing, training or otherwise are a part of this contract and are incorporated herein, provided that such instructions are not inconsistent with the terms hereof.

12. Unauthorized Commitments. No promises or commitments pertaining to rights, privileges or benefits other than those expressly stipulated in writing in this agreement or any amendment thereto shall be binding on the Government.

13. Term. This contract is effective as of 1 August 1954 and shall continue thereafter for a period of two (2) years unless sooner terminated by CIA either:

- (a) By thirty (30) days' actual notice to you from CIA, or
- (b) Without prior notice, in the event of a breach of this contract by your violation of the security provisions hereof or by your otherwise rendering yourself unavailable for acceptable service.

Subject to the availability of appropriations, this agreement may be renewed for successive periods of one year each upon notice from CIA accepted by you. In the event of voluntary termination for cause by CIA prior to expiration of this agreement or any renewal thereof, you will not be entitled to return travel expenses to the United States. Reference is made to your contract effective 1 June 1949 with the United States Government for the purchase of information and services of a confidential nature.

Effective 31 August 1953 said contract is hereby terminated by mutual consent of the parties thereto and in lieu thereof the following contract is substituted:

The United States Government, as represented by the Central Intelligence Agency, hereby contracts with you for the purchase of certain information and related services of a confidential nature under the following terms and conditions:

1. Compensation. In full consideration for the purchase of such information and services, you will be paid an amount calculated at the rate of \$4200 per annum. Payments will be made as directed by you in writing in a manner acceptable to CIA. No taxes will be withheld from this amount, and it will be your responsibility to report such income under existing Federal income tax laws and regulations.

2. Allowance. Effective upon your arrival at your permanent post of duty overseas, you will be entitled to a Quarters allowance equivalent to that granted a GS-7 Government employee stationed at the same permanent post of duty. This allowance will be at the maximum rates prescribed in the Standardized Regulations (Government Civilians, Foreign Areas). No accounting for this allowance will be required by CIA. In the event that Quarters are provided by your cover company, you will not be entitled to the Quarters allowance herein indicated.

3. Travel. You will be advanced or reimbursed funds for travel and transportation expenses for you, your dependents and your household effects to and from your permanent post of duty overseas and for you alone for authorized travel within your operational area. You will be entitled to per diem in lieu of subsistence during such travel and while in training in the United States. All travel, transportation and per diem provided for under this paragraph must be properly authorized, and expenses incurred hereunder are subject to payment and accounting in compliance with CIA regulations.

4. Operational Expenses. In addition to the allowance indicated above, you will be advanced or reimbursed funds for necessary operational expenses including, but not limited to, entertainment and the purchase of information as specifically approved by CIA. Such funds will be subject to accounting in substantial compliance with CIA regulations.

5. Leave. You will be entitled to fourteen (14) calendar days' leave per contract year. Such leave may be accrued during the term of this contract or any renewal hereof but payment in lieu of unused leave will not be authorized. Such leave may only be taken at times and places approved in advance by appropriate representatives of CIA.

6. Cover. It is anticipated that you will undertake certain cover employment in the course of your performance under this agreement. It is expressly understood and agreed that any and all documents which you may execute in the course of such cover employment are subordinate to this agreement and any contradiction in terms which may in any way amplify, extend or restrict your rights and/or obligations hereunder shall be resolved by this agreement which shall always be dominant.

7. Offset. Any sums or substantially similar benefits or allowances received from your commercial cover as differentiated from your student cover will be used to offset those due under this contract by CIA. Some, similar benefits or allowances thus received through your commercial cover are acknowledged and agreed to be payment by CIA within the provisions of this contract. You will report all sums or substantially similar benefits received from said commercial cover at least every six months during the term of this contract.

8. Execution of Documents. If, in the performance of your cover service, you assume the custody of government funds or take title of record to property of any nature whatsoever and wherever situate, which property has in fact been purchased with monies of the U. S. Government, you hereby recognize and acknowledge the existence of a trust relationship, either express or constructive, and you agree to execute whatever documents may be required by CIA to evidence this relationship.

9. Status. You are not an employee of the United States Government under this agreement and are not entitled to any benefits normally incident to an employee status.

10. Secrecy. You will be required to keep forever secret this contract and all information which you may obtain by reason hereof (unless released in writing by CIA from such obligation), with full knowledge that violation of such secrecy may subject you to criminal prosecution under the espionage laws dated 25 June 1943, as amended, and other applicable laws and regulations.

11. Instructions. Instructions received by you from CIA in briefing or training are a part of this contract and are incorporated herein, provided that such instructions are not inconsistent with the terms hereof.

12. Unauthorized Commitments. No promises or commitments pertaining to rights, privileges or benefits other than those expressly stipulated in writing in this agreement or any amendment thereto shall be binding on the Government.

13. Term. This contract is effective as of 1 September 1953, and shall continue thereafter for a period of two (2) years unless sooner terminated by CIA either

- (a) By thirty (30) days' actual notice to you from CIA, or
- (b) Without prior notice, in the event of a breach of this contract by your violation of the security provisions hereof or by your otherwise rendering yourself unavailable for acceptable service.

Subject to the availability of appropriations, this agreement may be renewed for successive periods of one year each upon notice from CIA accepted by you. In the event of voluntary termination on your part or termination for cause by CIA prior to expiration of this agreement or any renewal thereof, you will not be entitled to return travel expenses to the United States. Termination of this agreement will not release you from the obligations of any security oath you may be required to take.
