At this meeting, PAUL LODICO was introduced by his wife and spoke on the present situation in Viet Nam. He said the Vietnamese were poorly prepared to fight a war with their present weapons. He said they were holding out in the hills and were supported by the villages. Mr. LODICO thinks the President of the United States is confused and perplexed by the present happenings in Viet Nam. LODICO stated that the regime in Viet Nam, which is costing the Capitalists of the United States millions of dollars, is not controlling the Buddhist monks as well as the Imperialists of the United States would like them. He claims that the Vietnamese want to be a socialist state and the United States will not let this happen. The situation in Viet Nam is getting out of hand and, therefore, the President sent his representative to plead and beg the Vietnamese to control the Buddhists more to the United States liking.

Speaker LODICO said that the financing of this unorganized regime is not by the people or by United Nations or by the President, but by only one man in the C.I.A. He says that the people of the United States will eventually squawk about the tax dollars which are being spent.

DE T-8 advised on September 30, 1963, that on September 13, 1963, at a FNSF of the DBSWP at Eugene V. Debs Hall, Detroit, NORMA LODICO was Chairman and the speaker was her husband, PAUL LODICO. Source reported in part regarding PAUL LODICO's speech as follows:

Source reported this talk covered the high costs and excessive commercialism involved with undertakers, embalmers and anyone in the funeral business.

Capitalism is the thing that protects these practices of discrimination against the Negro and this is true in the unions that are dedicated supposedly to the protection of the Negro as a people. The only way to end this practice is to end its cause, and that is the Capitalistic system.

DE T-9 advised on January 23, 1963, that on January 4, 1963, NORMA LODICO was present at the FNSF of the DBSWP at Eugene V. Debs Hall, Detroit. Source reported GEORGE BREITMAN spoke at this meeting and reported in part regarding his speech as follows:

Gradually the Negro is coming out of his second class citizenship standing and is taking his place among the upper classes of society. This struggle should serve to prove that the laboring man can throw off the shackles of oppression and demand of the leaders of labor the rightful place of the working class in the affairs of the nation and the world.

BREITMAN stated that Socialism is an ally of the Negro in this struggle. The program of true Socialism has been in the forefront of the fight for Negro rights ever since this fight began. Socialism refuses to stand for any second class citizenship among all peoples. It recognizes one class and recognizes only one enemy and the enemy is Capitalism.

Responsibility for the plight of the Negro in this present struggle rests with the white man.

In concluding HIMMEL said "the Negro is getting tired of waiting for freedom and wants freedom now. The Negro of today wants all Negro organizations with Negro leaders to bring about equality. The Negro cannot hope to attain their goals unless theirs becomes a revolutionary movement and overthrows the present system that made them slaves in the first place".

Primarily, FNSF pertains to weekly public forums held at SWP headquarters, for the purpose of spreading propaganda of the SWP, developing contacts, facilitating recruitment of members into the SWP, and presenting subjects of a controversial nature in the social, political and economic fields. Usually speakers are members of the SWP and they give the socialist viewpoint of the subject discussed. The money collected at these FNSFs goes into the Detroit Branch, SWP treasury.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

APPENDIXYOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960, issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA), was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

A source advised on May 6, 1963, that the original YSA was an organization formed during October, 1957, in New York City by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The leaders of this group were the guiding forces in the establishment of the national organization.

The source further advised on May 6, 1963, that the YSA is dominated and controlled on a national basis by the SWP through having SWP members comprise exclusively the National Executive Committee (NEC) and through an official SWP representative at all YSA NEC meetings. The YSA, in reality, is the youth and training section of the SWP and the main source of new SWP members.

The headquarters of the Young Socialist Alliance are located at 125 Fourth Avenue, New York City.

"The Militant" is a weekly newspaper published by the SWP.

DE T-1 on November 5, 1963, advised that the subject spoke at the October 4, 1963, meeting of the FNDF about funerals, morticians and burials. The entire speech mentioned all the extra costs involved at funerals and hidden tactics which funeral directors and other persons in the profession use.

DE 100-30839

In columns 2 and 3, page 7, of the January 7, 1964, issue of "The Militant" was a letter to the editor datelined Detroit, Michigan, and signed "N.L.". This letter criticized the use by "The Militant" of descriptive torture methods revealed in articles on the persecution of Spanish miners and peace marchers in Georgia.

DE T-1 on January 30, 1964, advised that the subject attended a FROF on January 17, 1964, when RICHARD ROBERTS spoke on the war policy of the United States. He stated that the capitalist system cannot exist without war or with the threat of war, and there will only be peace when Socialism overcomes Capitalism.

DE T-1 furnished on March 11, 1964, a Branch Letter dated February 19, 1964, issued by the DDSWP which indicated the subject was on the March Headquarters Committee. This letter is furnished to DDSWP members only.

DE T-1 on March 19, 1964, furnished a letter written by EVELYN BELL regarding the election campaign. It was pointed out in this letter that the subject made the following recommendations for the program of the SWP campaign: She suggested abolishing compulsory ROTC (for youth) and to point out that workers should learn from the Negro struggle that they need their own party and should organize their own party like the Negroes are organizing the Freedom Now Party (FNP).

A characterization of the FNP is contained in the appendix hereto.

DE T-2 on March 20, 1964, advised that the subject attended the YSA Midwest Conference held January 25-26, 1964, in Chicago, Illinois. One of the speakers was GEORGE BREITMAN who made the following comments and points:

Negroes fail to grasp the importance of the FNP and the importance of what a minority can do. This is due to three major reasons:

In column 3, page 3, of the May 13, 1964, edition of "The Militant" under a Detroit, Michigan, dateline an article was written by the subject entitled "Case of Uhuru Ends in Mistrial".

A characterization of Uhuru is contained in the appendix hereto.

DE T-1 on June 17, 1964, furnished EBSWP City Letter dated June 10, 1964. This letter stated that at the last meeting of the EBSWP subject had been the chairman of the meeting.

DE T-1 on August 21, 1964, advised that the subject attended a EBSWP class on the "History of the Russian Revolution" at Eugene V. Debs Hall, Detroit, on August 16, 1964. At this meeting ROBERT BIRKELL spoke on the Art of Insurrection and among other statements made the following comments:

1. We are all professional revolutionists, and anyone who follows the beliefs of TROTSKY, LENIN and MARX are also revolutionists.
2. Even though we as the SWP Party and other Lenin, Marxists and Trotskyists say we are not trying to overthrow the Government of the United States our real purpose is to overthrow the capitalistic system of the United States. We plan to do this by revolutionary means and replace it was a Socialistic Government..

FRIDAY NIGHT SOCIALIST FORUM

On May 12, 1964, a source advised that the Friday Night Socialist Forum (FNSF) is a name used by the Detroit, Michigan, Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) in sponsoring forums, socials and other functions which are open to the public. Primarily, FNSF pertains to weekly public forums held at SWP headquarters, for the purpose of spreading propaganda of the SWP, developing contacts, facilitating recruitment of members into the SWP, and presenting subjects of a controversial nature in the social, political and economic fields. Usually speakers are members of the SWP and they give the socialist viewpoint of the subject discussed. The money collected at these FNSFs goes into the Detroit Branch, SWP treasury.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.



APPENDIX

FRIDAY NIGHT SOCIALIST FORUM, aka.  
Militant Labor Forum

On May 12, 1934, a source advised that the Forum is a paper organization set up by the Chicago Branch, Socialist Workers Party (CPSWP), Chicago, Illinois, for SWP members and sympathizers. Open meetings held under the auspices of this Forum are geared to the activities that the SWP is pursuing at a particular time e.g., unemployment, election campaign, Cuba, segregation, etc.

PETER DUCH, a CPSWP member, is in charge of the Forum and schedules meetings under the name of the Forum in order to conceal the SWP sponsorship of same. The meetings of the Forum generally are held at Chicago SWP headquarters although the Forum, in the past, has sponsored other affairs, such as meetings, socials and picnics held at other locations.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

APPENDIX

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960, issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

A source advised on May 6, 1964, that the original YSA was an organization formed during October, 1957, in New York City by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The leaders of this group were the guiding forces in the establishment of the national organization.

The source further advised on May 6, 1964, that the YSA is dominated and controlled on a national basis by the SWP through having SWP members comprise exclusively the National Executive Committee (NEC) and through an official SWP representative at all YSA NEC meetings. The YSA, in reality, is the youth and training section of the SWP and the main source of new SWP members.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Room 631, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

APPENDIX

DETROIT BRANCH, YOUNG  
SOCIALIST ALLIANCE (YSA)

A source advised on May 12, 1964, that the Detroit Branch, YSA, is affiliated with and controlled by the National YSA, which has its headquarters in New York City, and follows its policies and directives. It was organized about June 15, 1960, by the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and is currently active in Detroit, Michigan.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

APPENDIX

FREEDOM NOW PARTY

The "New York Times", August 24, 1963, page 1, carried an article entitled "An All-Negro Party for '64 is Formed." The article related that a national all-Negro political party was being organized. It hoped to run its own slate in the Congressional and local elections in 1964. A tentative national committee had opened offices at 81 East 125th Street, New York City.

A leaflet entitled "A Call for a Freedom Now Party" publicly circulated in the summer of 1963 and called for the formation of a Freedom Now Party with an all-black slate and a platform for liberation.

APPENDIX

UHURU (Freedom)

According to LUKE TRIPP, Jr., Chairman of Uhuru, Uhuru was formed in March, 1968, by militant black students at Wayne State University, Detroit. TRIPP stated the purposes of Uhuru are "to seek the closest possible alliance of militant black groups and from the broadest possible united black front to wage a tit-for-tat struggle against the anti-Negro machine that is America; to fight for 'Uhuru Quita' (Freedom now); and to affirm the principle of self-defense in the Negro freedom struggle."

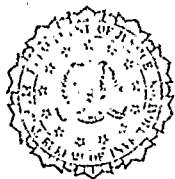

DOON SMITH announced that the National Convention of the SWP would be held in New York City in September, 1965, and that youth recruiting would be the major SWP policy for years to come.

On March 17, 1965, CV T-1 identified subject as being in attendance at a forum sponsored by the CESWP which was held on March 14, 1965. LEO BERNARD was introduced by ROY BOLT as the principal speaker. BOLT related that BERNARD was a graduate of Wayne University, a mathematician, a biologist and a DWP candidate in the 1964 elections in Michigan. BERNARD spoke on "The Great Society or the Great Fraud?" BERNARD began his talk by outlining the State of the Union address given by President JOHNSON. He took each point and related them one by one. He discussed what has been done by the JOHNSON administration in relation to what is needed. He found all the points falling far short of the needs of the American people. He stated that most of the 3 billion dollars for the educational fund had been previously allocated by Congress prior to JOHNSON's great society and by the time, "the sticky fingers got through," very little of the money would go where it was needed. BERNARD stated that the medi-care of President JOHNSON falls far short of the needs of the people. He stated for instance in case of serious, prolonged illness, that medi-care only provides for about 60 days of hospital or nursing care. BERNARD stated that JOHNSON's bill, the War on Poverty is a big joke. He stated that instead of the money allocated for this program going to poverty stricken people, the greater majority of it is being used to build super highways. Source related that BERNARD in conclusion stated that the only way to curb the ills of this society was with a social planned economy, working with other Socialist countries throughout the world.

CV T-2 on March 17, 1965 and CV T-3 on March 25, 1965, corroborated the above information.

CV T-1 on May 19, 1965, identified subject as being in attendance at a CESWP sponsored forum which was held on May 16, 1965. Source identified the speaker at this forum as RUDA ROMINE. The topic of ROMINE's talk was, "The meaning of U.S. intervention behind the civil war in the Dominican Republic". ROMINE began her talk by giving the history of the Dominican Republic, dating back to the year

1916, when the United States sent to the Dominican Republic, a garrison of United States Marines which she said governed the Dominican Republic until 1923. She stated that during that period of time, the United States Marines raised and educated JUAN TRUJILLO, who later became the dictator of the country and ruled as a pro-American capitalist for a period of 35 years, when he was assassinated.

CV T-4 on May 25, 1965, corroborated the above information.

On October 8, 1965, CV T-1 identified subject as being in attendance at a CESWP sponsored forum held on October 3, 1965. Source related that DAVE PRINCE acted as Chairman at this forum. PRINCE introduced FARRILL DOBBS as the principal speaker who spoke on the subject, "What Program for the Anti-War Movement?"

DOBBS started his talk by saying that the reason for the Colonial wars around the world was the capitalist exploitation of the people. He stated that there has been a war going on somewhere in the world for the last 18 years. He called for a stop to the fighting by the United States unconditionally withdrawing from Viet Nam, and letting the people decide which type of government they want. He emphasized the fact that capitalism cannot do this because the present system depends on the exploitation of people all over the world. During his speech DOBBS stated that the only way to change this is to completely get rid of the capitalist society and replace it with a socialist form of government.

CV T-2 on October 8, 1965 and CV T-3 on October 8, 1965, and CV T-7 on October 6, 1965, corroborated the above information.

CV T-1 on October 18, 1965, identified subject as one of a group of individuals who attended a CESWP sponsored forum on October 10, 1965.

On June 3, 1965, source identified subject as being in attendance at a CESWP sponsored social function which was held for the purpose of raising funds for the branch, on May 29, 1965.



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CV T-1 on June 3, 1965 and CV T-4 on June 4, 1965, corroborated subject's attendance at this function.

CV T-2 on June 23, 1965, identified subject as being in attendance at a CBSWP sponsored forum held June 20, 1965. Source identified the chairman at this forum as BONNIE HOLT, who introduced the speaker of the forum, HENRY AUSTIN, a member of the SWP from Detroit, Michigan. AUSTIN spoke of the recent elections in the Steel Labor Union between MC DONALD and ABEL. AUSTIN reviewed the history of the steel union prior to the election dating back to the year 1937. He stated that the recent election had not changed anything as far as the policy of the leadership of the union was concerned because both MC DONALD and ABEL have been bureaucrats that have been at the top of the union leadership since the organization of the U.S. Steel Workers and drawing large salaries of \$35,000.00 a year plus expenses.

CV T-6 on June 22, 1965, corroborated the above information.

CV T-2 in November, 1965, identified BONNIE HOLT as a member of the CBSWP.

On August 17, 1965, CV T-2 identified subject as being in attendance at a CBSWP sponsored forum, which was held on August 9, 1965. Source identified the speaker at the forum as BOB VERNON, member of the SWP from Detroit, Michigan. Subject of VERNON's talk was the "History of the Negro Revolution." At the conclusion of his talk, he stated that the only way the Negroes in the United States can gain their freedom is through a complete political revolution led by the SWP.

CV T-7 on August 17, 1965, and CV T-4 and CV T-5 August 23, 1965, corroborated the above information.

On August 19, 1965, CV T-2 identified subject as one of a group of individuals who attended a CBSWP sponsored forum on August 15, 1965. Source identified the chairman of this forum as being ERIC REINTHALER, who introduced the main speaker as PAUL BOUTILLE. BOUTILLE began his talk

by giving the history of his background leading up to the time he joined the YSA and the SWP. He stated he belonged to a number of radical Negro and white organizations, and after talking to a number of YSA and SWP members and studying the Leninist and Marxist theories of economics and revolution, he decided that the SWP was the only organization in the United States, that could have a correct program to lead the Negro people and the proletarians to a successful revolution in the United States. ECUTELLE stated that the only way the Negro in the United States could gain his or her complete civil rights was to work with other groups with the same interests to have a complete overthrow of the present political government and replace the government with a socialist government.

ECUTELLE on several occasions during his talk quoted from a book that he had recently written. One of the statements which he read stated that the peoples of Latin America should also be educated and ready for the time when the revolution in the United States occurs, because then they, the Latin Americans, could continue with their own revolutions because the government of the United States will be too busy with their own revolution to intervene in the affairs of Latin America. At the conclusion of ECUTELLE's talk, he was asked his opinion on the recent Los Angeles "uprisings". He stated that the Watts "Uprising" showed that the masses of Negroes had little or no leadership and the masses had gotten out of control.

CV T-11 on August 16, 1965, and CV T-4 on August 27, 1965, corroborated the above information.

On October 25, 1965, source identified subject as being in attendance at a CBSWP sponsored forum held October 17, 1965.

Source identified CONSTANCE FARR, a member of the SWP, as the principal speaker. FARR's subject matter was "the curse of American Culture". Source related that FARR's discussion on the subject matter was in opposition to the American way of life under the capitalistic system; that the family life and culture of the United States was rapidly decaying and that the only way it could be corrected is for a complete change in society to, a social society.

CV T-2 on October 25, 1965, identified subject as being in attendance at a meeting of the Cleveland Committee to End the War in Viet Nam which was held at the residence of PHILIP PASSER, 2123 Stearns Road, Cleveland, Ohio, on October 19, 1965. The main purpose of the meeting was for those who had taken part in the Viet Nam demonstration October 15-16, 1965, to get together and evaluate the outcome of the demonstrations and to try and form a permanent organization in the Cleveland area.

On April 5, 1965, source identified subject as being in attendance at a CBSWP Forum held April 4, 1965. Source identified JIM BINGHAM, a member of the YSA while attending Indiana University, as the principal speaker. BINGHAM stated that he and two other members of the YSA were indicted by a local Grand Jury on the State of Indiana sedition laws on communist organizations. BINGHAM claimed the Indiana laws are unconstitutional and that evidence against him was secured illegally. BINGHAM stated that he was at that time fighting his case in local courts and was attempting to raise money for his defense.

CV T-2 on April 7, 1965, corroborated the above information.

On April 20, 1965, source identified subject as being in attendance at a protest Vietnam demonstration held in Washington, D.C. on April 17, 1965.

CV T-6 on April 21, 1965, corroborated the above information.

On April 22, 1965, source identified subject as one of a group of individuals who attended a CBSWP sponsored Forum on April 18, 1965.

On June 22, 1965, source identified subject as being in attendance at a CBSWP sponsored Forum which was held on June 13, 1965.

Source identified the principal speaker at this forum as JOHN BECKER, who was identified as a student of Marxist economics and of the SNF from Detroit, Michigan. BECKER spoke on the subject "The Triple Revolution," Cybarnation, Weaponry, and Human Rights. BECKER talked most about what automation is doing and how it is causing more and more unemployment. BECKER stated it is harder on the Negroes because they have, in most cases, been denied the chance of learning a trade. BECKER explained how a socialist system would use all the modern machines of today to give all peoples a higher standard of living. He stated that under a socialist system, the billions of dollars now being used for the destruction of mankind, would be used for the betterment of all.

On July 1, 1965, source related that subject attended a CDSWP sponsored forum which was held June 27, 1965. Source identified the speaker of this forum as Dr. SIDNEY PECK, who spoke on the rank and file leader. Dr. PECK stated that he started research on his thesis back in 1953 by interviewing 200 shop stewards in the Milwaukee, Wisconsin area. Dr. PECK stated that the trouble with the American worker is that he has replaced class consciousness with job consciousness. He stated that in his interview, he asked the stewards their opinions on such issues as socialism, juvenile delinquency, war, the Jew and the Negro and women working. Regarding juvenile delinquency, Dr. PECK stated that the male workers he interviewed stated that they had committed bad acts during their childhood days, that the reason juvenile crime seems so bad today is because today there are more cops to catch criminals and because the crimes are given more publicity. He stated that giving juveniles a good "whack" would solve this problem. On the question of war, the stewards felt that it was wrong but all they could do was pin their faith on the leadership of the nation. Dr. PECK said a sense of apathy or do nothing prevailed.

Dr. PECK stated that with respect to Negroes, the shop stewards strongly denied any discrimination or prejudice against the Negro and pointed to their union charter to prove it. Dr. PECK stated that by listening to them talk, he could tell, however, that there was prejudice against the Negro; that they still did not believe in full equality for the Negroes.

and had stereotyped concepts of the Negro. He stated, however, that there was a strong feeling of solidarity with the Negro worker because he worked with them and had a family to support.

Concerning the Jews, Dr. PECK said the stewards were more hostile because they could not see or conjure in their thoughts a Jewish manual laborer and referred to the Jews as "Those guys from New York who want to get as much out of us as possible." Dr. PECK stated that the stewards interviewed had some sympathy for socialism and its ideals but the workers were afraid of the red smear and the idea that if socialism came to America, it would be like the socialism in Russia with no freedom.

CV T-4 on July 6, 1965 and CV T-6 on June 30, 1965, corroborated the above information.

CV T-8 on April 16, 1966, advised that SIDNEY PECK attended a State Committee meeting of the CP of Wisconsin held April 15, 1966, and was a member of the State Committee of the Wisconsin CP District.

CV T-9 on April 29, 1963, identified Dr. SIDNEY PECK as being in attendance at a meeting of the National Committee to Abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee (NCAHUAC), a characterization of which appears in the Appendix Section of this report, which was held April 27-28, 1963 at the YMCA Hotel, 826 South Wabash Street, Chicago, Illinois. Source identified Dr. PECK as one of the speakers at this function.

On July 12, 1965, source identified subject as being in attendance at a CESWP sponsored forum which was held on July 11, 1965. Source related that BERNARD MANDELL, an active member of the Freedom Fighters, was the principal speaker. MANDELL spoke on the subject History of the Negro Struggle and the Anti-Slavery Movements.

CV T-6 on July 12, 1965, corroborated the above information and related that MANDELL stated that the Negro

slave revolts could be divided into three different levels, revolt of Negroes themselves; the white abolitionists; and the internal conflict of the slave system itself. He stated that there was suppression of reports of Negro revolution in the South to prevent other Negroes from getting the same idea and to give the white population the idea that the Negro slaves were happy in their present state. MANDELL stated that the Negro was held in bondage to preserve the Southern capitalistic structure; that the importation of Negroes was stopped because it was feared that they would overpopulate the country and successfully overthrow the white power structure.

CV T-11 on July 22, 1965 and CV T-5 on July 16, 1965, corroborated the above information.

On September 27, 1963, CV T-10 identified subject as being in attendance at a CESWP sponsored forum which was held September 23, 1965. PAUL LODICO, who was the principal speaker, spoke on civil laws. He said you can break them as long as you do not get arrested; like the SWP did in Berkeley, California. He stated that they helped to instigate the people to stop the troop trains and then they stood on the platform and proceeded to give out pamphlets. He stated that the SWP and the YSA should get into all the civil rights groups not to try to run them but to keep things moving because they have more experience. He said the Students for Democratic Society (SDS) does not have much of a platform because to join you do not have to take a Party pledge, however, in the W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs of America you take a pledge because most of the members come from prominent families with communist background.

On September 27, 1965, source identified subject as being in attendance at a CESWP sponsored forum which was held on September 25, 1965. DENNIS SWELTENHAM spoke on guerrilla warfare in Cuba and Vietnam. He said that in Cuba, CASTRO had defeated BATISTA and the United States; that the U. S. cannot win the war in Vietnam because they were defeated before they started; and that the U. S. is using helicopters, which is useless in guerrilla warfare.

CV T-1 on October 4, 1965, and CV T-4 on October 12, 1965, corroborated the above information.

On November 8, 1965, CV T-10 identified subject as being in attendance at a CBSWP sponsored forum which was held November 5, 1965. MARY ALICE STYRON, a member of the National Committee of the YSA, was the principal speaker. Source related that STYRON stated that the job of the YSA is to try to get the soldiers and college students to be against the war in Vietnam.

On October 11, 1965, source advised that on October 7, 1965, a meeting of the Cleveland Committee to End the War in Vietnam was to have been held at the Church of the Covenant, 11205 Euclid Avenue. Source related that due to the interference from other right wing organizations the meeting was moved to 2123 Stearns Avenue. Source related that this meeting, which was attended by subject, was sponsored by the SWP, SDS, YSA and W. E. B. Du Bois Clubs of America. The main speaker at this meeting was Dr. SIDNEY PECK. A discussion took place concerning a demonstration to be held by the Cleveland Committee to End the War in Vietnam on October 15-16, 1965. The meeting of October 15, was to be held at the Unitarian Society, 8143 Euclid Avenue, after which an all night vigil at Public Square was to take place and at approximately noon on Saturday, October 16, 1965, a rally was to be held at Public Square and a march to the induction center where leaflets were to be passed out by the demonstrators urging an end to the war in Vietnam.

### NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO AID THE BLOOMINGTON STUDENTS

The May 19, 1963, issue of "The Indianapolis Star", an Indianapolis daily newspaper, contained an article relating that the Committee to Aid the Bloomington Students (CABS) has been formed as an outgrowth of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA). The article related that the CABS was a fund raising unit dedicated to obtaining funds for the defense of three YSA members indicted under Indiana's 1951 Anti-Subversive Law.

A source advised on September 23, 1963, that a YSA document entitled "Tasks and Perspectives for the New York Local" (YSA) disclosed during September, 1963, that a National Committee to Aid the Bloomington Students had been set up in New York City. This document stated that the National CABS in New York City would coordinate and direct the CABS activities throughout the country.

On February 11, 1964, a second source advised that the primary purpose of the CABS, organized and controlled by the YSA, was to raise funds for the legal defense of YSA members indicted at Bloomington, Indiana. Source stated that the secondary purpose of this Committee was to propagandize the Bloomington defense and utilize this case as an introduction to the aims of campus recruitment.

The second source further advised that the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) exercises indirect control of the CABS through control over the YSA leadership which operates the CABS. According to this source, CABS work by SWP members, who are not YSA members, is considered as Party work and as a means of building the SWP.

The April 13, 1964, issue of "The Militant", a weekly SWP newspaper, page 5, disclosed that on March 20, 1964, the indictments of the YSA members, mentioned above, were dismissed. The article further relates that the National CABS, however, was continuing to operate in regard to the solicitation of contributions to fight an appeal of the dismissal of indictments made by the prosecution.

The National CABS maintains headquarters in the National Headquarters of the YSA, 125 Fourth Avenue, New York City. The National CABS maintains Post Office Box 213, Cooper Station, New York, New York 10003.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO ABOLISH THE HOUSE  
UN-AMERICAN ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" issued December 1, 1961, by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, page 115, contains the following citation regarding the National Committee to Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee (NCAUAC):

"Cited as a 'new organization' set up in the Summer of 1960 to lead and direct the Communist Party's 'Operation Abolition' campaign. Seven of the national leaders of this group have been identified as Communists."

A source has advised that the NCAUAC changed its name on March 3, 1962, to include the word "House" in its name, thereby becoming known as the National Committee to Abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee (NCAHUAC).

A second source advised on June 28, 1965, that as of that date the NCAHUAC continued to function with headquarters at 555 North Western Avenue, Los Angeles, California.

CLEVELAND BRANCH

W. E. B. DU BOIS CLUBS OF AMERICA (DCA)

A source has advised that on October 26-27, 1963, a conference of members of the Communist Party (CP), including national functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates to this meeting were cautioned against the germ of anti-Soviet and anti-CP ideologies. These delegates were also told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second conference of over 20 persons met in Chicago on December 28-29, 1963, for the purpose of initiating a "call" to the new youth organization and planning for a founding convention to be held in June, 1964.

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America (DCA) was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention. The aims of this organization, as set forth in the preamble to the constitution, are, "It is our belief that this nation can best solve its problems in an atmosphere of peaceful coexistence, complete disarmament and true freedom for all peoples of the world, and that these solutions will be reached mainly through the united efforts of all democratic elements in our country, composed essentially of the working people allied in the unity of Negroes and other minorities with whites. We further fully recognize that the greatest threat to American democracy comes from the racist and right wing forces in coalition with the most reactionary sections of the economic power structure, using the tool of anti-Communism to divide and destroy the unified struggle of the working people. As young people in the forces struggling for democracy, we shall actively strive to defeat these reactionary and neo-fascist elements and to achieve complete freedom and democracy for all Americans, thus enabling each individual to freely choose and build the society he would wish to live in. Through these struggles

we feel the American people will realize the viability of the socialist alternative."

The constitution further states that this new organization shall be a membership organization open to individuals, or if five or more people so desire, a chapter can be formed which shall in turn be guided by the policies and principles of the parents organization.

Over the Labor Day weekend, 1965, the DCA held a conference in Chicago, Illinois. According to a third source, a new slate of national officers was elected at this conference, which included Chairman HUGH STERLING FOWLER, II (who, according to the third source, attended a CP cadre encampment held at Camp Midvale, New Jersey, in June, 1965, and following his election as Chairman of the DCA, attended another national CP cadre youth conference held on September 9-12, 1965, on a farm located in Northern Indiana, according to a fourth source); Director of Publicity CARL ELLENGER BLOICE (who was elected to the San Francisco County Committee CP in April, 1964, according to a fifth source); Educational Director MATTHEW "DYNAMITE" HALLINAN (who in June, 1964, was stated to be the Youth Representative on the Northern California CP District Board, according to a sixth source); Organizational Secretary TERENCE "KAYO" HALLINAN (who, according to a seventh source, met in June, 1965, with the District Staff of the Illinois CP to discuss the proposed DCA Midwest Summer Project), and Treasurer SUSAN PHYLLIS BORENSTEIN (who, according to an eighth source, has attended meetings of the Youth Club of the CP of Illinois during 1965 in connection with the DCA Summer Project).

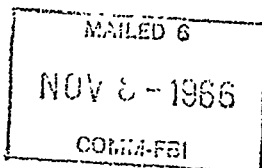

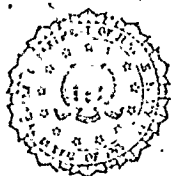

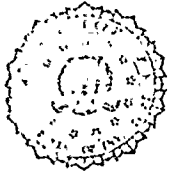

DETAILS:

I. BACKGROUND

On November 23, 1966, source advised SA WILLIAM E. FENIMORE that NORMA LODICO was residing in Apartment #303, University Apartments, 5236 22nd Avenue, N.E., Seattle, Washington, and unemployed.

On September 28, 1966, source advised that NORMA LODICO is employed in the Office of United Electrical Radio and Machine Workers of America, U.E. District Council #7, 17403 Harvard Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio.

CV T-3

The records of source, as checked by IC WILLIAM HEGEDUS on January 5 and 23, 1967, reflect that NORMA JEAN LODICO, born March 5, 1942, was arrested on November 13, 1965 at 5927 Euclid Avenue with a group of individuals charged with Disorderly Assembly. On November 15, 1965 LODICO and others appeared before Judge THEODORE WILLIAMS, Municipal Court, City of Cleveland, and entered a plea of not guilty to charge of Disorderly Assembly. Case was continued until July 12, 1966 when LODICO and others appeared before Judge WILLIAMS, Municipal Court; case dismissed against LODICO and others arrested on November 13, 1965. Judge WILLIAMS ruled that the affidavits were faulty in wording. New warrants were issued for the same group by the city police on July 24, 1966. LODICO and others appeared before Judge JOSEPH STEARNS, Municipal Court, Cleveland, Ohio, July 25, 1966; no plea entered; case continued until September 14, 1966, and since that date has been continued on several occasions and on January 11, 1967, was continued until January 31, 1967.

II. CONNECTIONS WITH THE SOCIALIST WORKERS  
PARTY (SWP) AND YOUNG SOCIALIST  
ALLIANCE (YSA)

Unless otherwise indicated, all functions at which NORMA LODICO was reported in attendance were held at 5927 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

A characterization of the YSA appears in the Appendix Section of this report.

Informant related on a number of occasions during the period November 30, 1965 to October 17, 1966 that NORMA LODICO was a member of the Cleveland Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (CBSWP) and of the Cleveland Branch of the Young Socialist Alliance (CBYSA), characterizations of which appear in the Appendix Section of this report. LODICO was identified as being in attendance at 32 scheduled activities of the CBSWP and CBYSA including membership meetings, forums, and socialist classes during the period November 21, 1965 to October 7, 1966.

On February 14, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a membership meeting of the CBSWP which was held on February 11, 1966. Source related that LODICO read the minutes of the previous meeting.

CV T-2 and CV T-3 on February 14, 1966, corroborated LODICO's attendance at this meeting.

On March 4, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a regular membership meeting of the CBSWP on February 25, 1966. At this meeting, PAUL LODICO, husband of NORMA LODICO, requested that members of the CBYSA, who are also members of the CBSWP, be excused from the next business meeting on March 4, 1966 as they would be attending the National YSA Convention in Chicago, Illinois, March 4-6, 1966. Source related that NORMA LODICO was one of those members who would be attending the convention.

CV T-2 on March 4, 1966 corroborated the above information.

CV T-1 in October, 1966, identified PAUL LODICO as a member of the CBSWP and as Organizer of the CBYSA prior to his transfer to Seattle, Washington.

On April 19, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP membership meeting on April 15, 1966 and read the minutes of the previous Branch meeting.

CV T-2 on April 19, 1966 and CV T-5 on May 3, 1966, corroborated the above information.

On May 6, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP-CBYSA sponsored forum which was held on May 1, 1966. LODICO acted as Chairman at this forum and introduced the main speaker, DOUG JENNESS, author of the book, "War and Revolution in Vietnam." The topic of JENNESS' talk was "How This Generation Can Change Society." He stated that the United States is playing a roll of counter-revolution throughout the colonial countries of the world; spoke against the United States policy in Vietnam and supported the CASTRO revolution in Cuba. JENNESS outlined six ways that the younger generation of socialists and radicals in the United States could help change the society, by working in anti-war and anti-Vietnam committees, working in Negro and civil rights groups, urging that groups adopt a policy of independent political action rather than work in the two political parties and to overthrow the present government.

CV T-5 on May 16, 1966 and CV T-4 on May 13, 1966, corroborated the above information.

CV T-1 in May, 1966, identified JENNESS as a member of the National Committee of the YSA.

On May 18, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP sponsored forum which was held on May 8, 1966 and to have acted as Chairman of the forum. The program for this forum was a debate between PHIL BART and ERIC REINTHALER. BART spoke on the subject "The New Communist Program." He stated that the program of the American Communist Party (CP) is for members to work and infiltrate the Democratic Party and the labor unions in order to eventually control the two groups and then the government. He stated that it was also the purpose of the American CP to work in all civil rights groups and anti-war organizations.

CV T-2 on May 18, 1966 and CV T-7 on May 23, 1966, corroborated the above information.



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CV T-2 in January, 1967, identified ERIC REINTHALER as the Organizer of the CBSWP.

CV T-12 in 1965 identified BART as a member of the National Committee of the CPUSA and as Chairman of the Ohio CP.

On June 9, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a membership meeting of the CBSWP on June 3, 1966. At this meeting, LODICO reported that as of that date, she had sent the National Headquarters of the SWP in New York City a total of \$935.00 toward the Cleveland Branch quota of \$1,065.00. for the National Fund Drive of the SWP.

On June 14, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP-CBYSA sponsored socialist class which was held on June 8, 1966. LODICO was identified as being the Director of the school and introduced the first speaker as HERMAN KIRSCH. LODICO stated that this was the first summer school conducted by the CBSWP and CBYSA. She stated that the National Office of the SWP had formerly sponsored the same type of school in New Jersey where many of the older comrades had studied socialism; that a school of similar nature also had been conducted in Boston, Massachusetts for YSA members approximately two years ago; that this year there were to be summer schools held in Chicago; Boston; Detroit, Michigan; Milwaukee, Wisconsin; and Los Angeles, California. KIRSCH discussed the introduction and first chapter of the book, "In Defense of Marxism."

CV T-3 on June 14, 1966, corroborated the above information.

CV T-2 in January, 1967, identified HERMAN KIRSCH as a member of the CBSWP.

On July 18, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP-CBYSA sponsored socialist class which was held on July 13, 1966 and to have acted as Chairman of the class. Source related that HARRY RING, member of the National Committee of the SWP, lectured on the history of the YSA. RING stated that the Party began its building of the youth in the early 1950's. He stated that the YSA has been a part of every civil rights movement in the United States beginning with the Montgomery, Alabama, bus boycott in 1956 and from this began

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recruiting more and more members. He stated that the YSA was one of the first young radical groups to participate in the lunch counter "sit-ins" and from that time on have been active in civil rights groups and anti-Vietnam War Committee. He stated that the YSA, as a result of its activity in these groups, recruited new members from the Mississippi civil rights march and at the present time is one of the leading youth radical groups participating and recruiting from the anti-Vietnam War Committee.

On August 16, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP membership meeting on August 12, 1966. LODICO reported that GEORGE NOVACK would lecture at the CBSWP-CBYSA socialist class to be held on August 19, 1966.

CV T-5 on August 23, 1966, corroborated the above information.

CV T-4 in August, 1966, identified NOVACK as a member of the National Committee of the SWP.

CV T-1

Informant related on a number of occasions during the period November 30, 1965 to December 12, 1966 that NORMA LODICO was a member of the CBSWP and CBYSA. LODICO was identified as being in attendance at 36 scheduled activities of the CBSWP and CBYSA, including membership meetings, forums, and socialist classes during the period November 21, 1965 to December 9, 1966.

On January 12, 1966, source related that in July, 1965 the CBSWP elected a new Executive Committee composed of five members, two of which were PAUL and NORMA LODICO.

On January 19, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a membership meeting of the CBSWP which was held on January 13, 1966. ERIC REINTHALER gave the Branch Executive Committee report, after which nominations were accepted for members of the new Branch Executive Committee to be elected the following week. Source related that NORMA LODICO was one of those nominated and who had accepted the nomination.

CV T-4 on January 17, 1966 and CV T-1 on January 19, 1966, corroborated the above information.

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On May 25, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a meeting which was held on May 20, 1966. At this meeting, DENNIS SWEETENHAM gave the Branch Executive Committee report. He stated that PAUL and NORMA LODICO, HERMAN KIRSCH and DANNY ROSENSHINE were in Detroit, Michigan, attending memorial services for LEO BERNARD who was killed by a fanatic at Debs Hall at Detroit, Michigan.

CV T-1 on May 25, 1966 and CV T-4 on June 1, 1966, corroborated the above information.

CV T-2 in May, 1966, identified LEO BERNARD as a former member of the YSA; and in January, 1967 identified DENNIS SWEETENHAM as a member of the CBSWP and CBYSa.

CV T-1 in January, 1967, identified DANNY ROSENSHINE as a member of the CBSWP and CBYSa.

On June 14, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a membership meeting of the CBSWP followed by a CBSWP-CBYSa sponsored socialist class on June 10, 1966. At the conclusion of the class, LODICO reported on the progress of the Branch in connection with the National Fund Drive of the SWP. She stated that the CBSWP had sent to the National Office \$1,000.00, but that pledges which were made over and above the amount of the quota in the amount of \$80.00 was still owed by some of the members. HERMAN KIRSCH made a motion, which was approved, that the Branch maintain all funds over the CBSWP quota for the National Fund Drive to be used by the Branch.

CV T-1 on June 14, 1966 and CV T-4 on June 16, 1966, corroborated the above information.

On July 26, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP-CBYSa jointly sponsored socialist class which was held on July 18, 1966.

FARRELL DOBBS gave the first of a two part lecture on the subject "Building the Revolutionary Party." DOBBS started his talk by saying that the SWP has three goals of a political nature; aligning the United States with world socialism, defending the interest of the exploited masses against capitalism at home, and teaching and leading the workers of the United States for the abolition of capitalism. He spoke on reformism and stated that the SWP will oppose any change in the political objectives and must be thoroughly trained for combat. He stated that a massive counter-revolutionary war is being waged by the United States all over the world but that they cannot continue to be the world's watchdog forever. He stated that the world-wide revolutionary movement has suffered major setbacks in many areas, but at the same time an indication of the imperialist downfall is the mass protest of the war in Vietnam. He stated that this is the first time in the history of the United States that any segment of the population in numbers has protested the waging of war while war is going on. DOBBS stated that it is the need of the Party to keep recruiting students into the SWP and that as the Negroes become more militant and more politically aware to recruit them into the SWP. In conclusion, DOBBS stated that the political approach of the SWP is to aim for the conquest of power from the capitalist class to a socialist form of government in the United States by the working class. During a discussion at the conclusion of DOBBS' speech, NORMA LODICO asked DOBBS what he meant when he said that the struggle between capitalism and socialism would be a fierce struggle. He replied that the capitalist class in the United States would not give up easily and would employ every tactic known to squelch the overthrow of their system so consequently, as shown in the past history of the United States it will be a fierce battle to overthrow capitalism in the United States in order to substitute socialism.

CV T-4 in 1966 identified DOBBS as a member of the National Committee and National Secretary of the SWP.

On August 24, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at an open forum sponsored by the CBSWP which was held on August 21, 1966. Source identified the speaker at this forum as GEORGE NOVACK. NOVACK's talk was on the subject "Existentialism vs. Marxism." NOVACK spoke on the Marxist philosophy as opposed to the theory of Existentialism as propounded by JOHN PAUL SATRE, French author and philosopher.

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CV T-1 on August 24, 1966, corroborated LODICO's attendance at this forum.

On August 24, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP-CBYSA socialist class which was held on August 22, 1966. Source related that GEORGE NOVACK lectured on the "Decline of Stalinism." NOVACK reviewed the history of Russia in relationship to world politics from 1923 to the present time, at which time he stated that Russia is practicing a form of Communism, that although they claim they are a Socialist country, they do not practice true Socialism. NOVACK stated that Russia played coalition politics with the Imperialist countries since the second world war and to the present time did everything in her power to oppose every colonial revolution which took place since the second world war. NOVACK stated that this theory of coalition politics is in direct opposition to the Trotsky theory of world revolution. He stated that the Trotskyites believe that Socialism cannot exist in just one country but there will have to be world revolution, and that it is the duty of the Trotskyites to support the revolutions all over the world. NOVACK stated that Red China is the only communist country in the world with the exception of Cuba, which is following the correct Trotsky line.

On September 13, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a membership meeting of the CBSWP on September 9, 1966 and to have acted as Chairman at this meeting.

CV T-4 and CV T-5 on September 16, 1966, corroborated LODICO's attendance at this meeting.

On September 22, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a membership meeting of the CBSWP on September 16, 1966, which was held at 9801 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio. At this meeting, LODICO gave a report and a summary relating to the socialist school sponsored by the CBSWP and CBYSA. She reported that the summer school netted a profit of \$3.00 and that this school, being the first one held in Cleveland, was very successful.

CV T-1 on September 22, 1966, corroborated the above information.

On December 12, 1966, during a regular membership meeting of the CBSWP, which was held on December 9, 1966, at 9801 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, ERIC REINTHALER gave a report on the political activity of the branches in various cities around the country. He stated that since PAUL and NORMA LODICO had transferred from the Cleveland, Ohio branch in October, 1966, to Seattle, Washington, they had started to build a branch in that city. He stated that they were fortunate to be going to Seattle at this time when Seattle, Washington was organizing a boycott of food stores and that they had become active in that and since there were 3,500 people involved in the boycott, they felt that they would be able to make some good contacts.

CV T-2

On various dates during the period December 8, 1965 to October 12, 1966, NORMA LODICO was identified as a member of the CBSWP and CBYSA. LODICO was identified as being in attendance at 29 scheduled activities of the CBSWP and CBYSA including membership meetings, forums, and socialist classes during the period December 5, 1965 to October 12, 1966. During the same period, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at five meetings of the Cleveland Committee to End the War in Vietnam (CCEWV), a characterization of which appears in the Appendix Section of this report, which were held at the Church of the Covenant, 11205 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio. Source also, during this period, identified LODICO as taking part in demonstrations sponsored by the CCEWV in downtown Cleveland, Ohio.

On January 31, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP membership meeting on January 27, 1966. The newly elected Branch Executive Committee recently appointed included the name NORMA LODICO as Recording Secretary.

On February 21, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a meeting sponsored by the CBYSA which was held on February 20, 1966. The speaker at this meeting was PAUL LODICO who spoke on what part the YSA is playing in the CCEWV.

On March 21, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a regular membership meeting of the CBSWP on March 18, 1966. At this meeting, LODICO stated that she had collected \$170.00 which she had already counted for the National

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Fund Drive of the SWP and that she had also collected \$40.00 which she had not made any record as of that date.

CV T-1 on March 21, 1966, corroborated the above information.

On May 2, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a regular membership meeting of the CBSWP on April 29, 1966, at which time she stated that she had collected \$550.00 for the National Fund Drive which was the half-way mark for the quota set by the National Office of the SWP for the Cleveland Branch. PAUL LODICO gave a report on anti-war activities and stated that leaflets were being passed out at high schools and local colleges in protest of the United States action in Vietnam.

CV T-5 on May 6, 1966, corroborated the above information.

On May 16, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a regular membership meeting of the CBSWP on May 13, 1966 and to have read the minutes of the preceding meeting. LODICO also stated that the Branch was falling behind in their pledges for the National Fund Drive which must be met by June, 1966.

Source related on October 12, 1966 that PAUL and NORMA LODICO were being sent to Seattle, Washington by the National Office of the SWP to organize a branch of the YSA in that city and that they would be departing in October, 1966.

CV T-3

On various dates during the period December 3, 1965 to October 13, 1966, NORMA LODICO was identified as a member of the CBSWP and CBYSA. LODICO was identified as being in attendance at 19 scheduled activities of the CBSWP and CBYSA including membership meetings, forums and socialist classes during the period December 2, 1965 to October 9, 1966. On February 28, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP sponsored forum on February 13, 1966. The principal speaker at this forum was LEW JONES, identified by source as a member of the National Committee of the YSA. JONES talked concerned proposed solutions

to the war in Vietnam. JONES pointed out that the United States has no legal right in Vietnam, therefore, the only just solution is United States withdrawal. JONES stated that the United States supervised elections would pre-suppose the United States had a right to dictate the form of government in Vietnam.

—CV T-5 on February 24, 1966, corroborated the above information.

On June 1, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a membership meeting of the CBSWP on May 27, 1966.

During the meeting NORMA LODICO reported that she was confirming the dates on which FARRELL DOBBS and GEORGE NOVACK would be available to take part in the socialist school being sponsored by the CBSWP and CBISA.

On July 1, 1966, source identified NORMA LODICO as being the educational director of the CBSWP as of that date.

On July 26, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a business meeting and a socialist class which were held at 1508 Hillcrest Street, Cleveland Heights, Ohio, on July 24, 1966. NORMA LODICO was Chairman at these functions.

On July 26, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP-CBISA socialist class which was held on July 19, 1966 at 3054 Euclid Heights Boulevard, Cleveland Heights, Ohio. Source identified FARRELL DOBBS as instructor of this class and who spoke on the development of the SWP. DOBBS discussed the struggle of the Party, pointing out the duties of the National Committee and the theory of Democratic centralism. DOBBS stated that the goal of the SWP is to stamp out capitalism in this country and when capitalism is overthrown in the United States, the rest of the world will follow.

CV T-1 and CV T-3 on July 25, 1966; CV T-2 on July 26, 1966, and CV T-5 on August 2, 1966, corroborated LODICO's attendance at this class.

#### CV T-4

On a number of occasions during the period November 29, 1965 to October 27, 1966, NORMA LODICO was identified as a member of the CBSWP. LODICO was identified as being in attendance at 31

scheduled functions of the CBSWP and CBYSA during the period November 14, 1965 to October 7, 1966.

On April 22, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP membership meeting which was held on April 22, 1966. Source related that LODICO, who was in charge of the National Fund Drive for the local branch, requested that all those making pledges for the National Fund Drive pay their pledges at the earliest possible date as they were still in need of \$530.00 to meet the Branch quota.

CV T-5

Informant related on a number of occasions during December 3, 1965 to October 17, 1966, NORMA LODICO was a member of the CBSWP and CBYSA. LODICO was identified as being in attendance at 18 scheduled activities of the CBSWP and CBYSA including membership meetings and forums during the period December 2, 1965 to October 14, 1966. In addition to the above, during the same period, informant also identified LODICO as being in attendance at seven meetings of the CCEWV, all of which were held at 11265 Euclid Avenue, except one which was held at 1846 Coventry Road, Cleveland Heights, Ohio.

On January 19, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a joint meeting of the CCEWV and CBYSA which was held on January 16, 1966. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss ways of getting the newsletter being published by the CCEWV into the hands of the public. It was felt by those present that the best means for distributing the newsletter would be to do so at local high schools and colleges and selling them at the churches at \$.10 per copy.

On February 28, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a meeting sponsored by the CBYSA, the CCEWV, and the CBSWP, which was held on February 20, 1966. The purpose of the meeting was to form a sub-committee and to hold meetings for a better understanding and coordination of the activities and people involved in the anti-war movement.

On June 2, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a membership meeting of the CBSWP on May 27, 1966, and to have given a report relating to the National Fund Drive of the SWP.

CV 100-27226

CV T-1 and CV T-2 on June 2, 1966, corroborated the above information.

On October 10, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a CBSWP forum which was held on October 9, 1966, at 9801 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio. The topic of discussion at this forum was "Black Power." PAUL LODICO stated that the Negroes can only gain their freedom by fighting for it; that the Negroes must control their own struggle for freedom. He stated that the Negroes are tired of promises and are soon going to get up and fight. PAUL LODICO stated that we must get rid of capitalism and have a socialist revolution.

CV T-3 on October 10, 1966, corroborated the above information.

On October 17, 1966, source related that a farewell party was given for PAUL and NORMA LODICO at their residence, 2649 Hampshire Road, Cleveland Heights, Ohio, on October 13, 1966, who were departing from Cleveland to Seattle, Washington, on October 14, 1966.

CV T-6

On various dates during the period December 30, 1965 to October 11, 1966, NORMA LODICO was identified as being in attendance at eight forums sponsored by the CBSWP during the period December 19, 1965 to October 7, 1966. On February 14, 1966, LODICO was identified as being in attendance at a forum sponsored by the CBSWP on February 6, 1966. An informal panel discussion took place on the subject, "How Does Racial Segregation Undermine the Public Schools?" The panel discussion was lead by DONALD FREEMAN, who believes a rebellion is open, militant, and possibly violent in order to let the white man know that the old days have passed, gradualism cannot be tolerated and that the American dream must be altered if the United States wishes to remain a power in the shrinking world of the future. FREEMAN advocates a separate Negro state where the Negro will run everything. He encourages the establishment of Negro businesses in Negro neighborhoods and support of these businesses by all Negroes and the building of pride in race among Negro children through Negro history projects and closer ties between American Negroes and the independent Black African and Asian countries.

CV T-3 on February 14, 1966 and CV T-4 on February 18, 1966, corroborated the above information.

A characterization of DONALD FREEMAN appears in the Appendix Section under the caption "Voluntary Action Movement" (RAM):

On February 10, 1966, source identified NORMA LODICO as being in attendance at a demonstration sponsored by the CCEWV in front of Public Auditorium, Cleveland, Ohio, on February 7, 1966, for the benefit of Vice President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY who was in Cleveland at that time. Source related that the purpose of the demonstration was to relate to Vice President HUMPHREY how the people were protesting United States action in Vietnam.

CV T-8

On April 7, 1966, source identified NORMA LODICO as being in attendance at the Fifth National Convention of the YSA held at Chicago, Illinois, March 4-6, 1966.

CV T-11 on April 21, 1966, corroborated LODICO's attendance at the above convention.

On September 20, 1966, NORMA LODICO was identified by source as being in attendance at a National Leadership Conference which was attended by approximately 150 registered guests representing peace organizations from various parts of the United States. Included in these organizations were individuals from the YSA, SWP and CP. The conference was held at Baker Hall, Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio, on September 10-11, 1966, for the purpose of formulating plans for a nationwide demonstration pertaining to United States action in Vietnam.

CV T-9

On April 18, 1966, source identified NORMA LODICO as being in attendance at a meeting sponsored by the CCEWV on April 5, 1966, which was held at 11205 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio.

CV T-10

CLEVELAND COMMITTEE TO END THE WAR IN VIETNAM

On December 4, 1965, a source advised that the Cleveland Committee to End the War in Vietnam (CCEWV) was organized in the latter part of October, 1965, and that members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) in Cleveland were instrumental in forming the CCEWV.

A second source advised on January 24, 1966, that Daniel Rosenshine, an SWP member, was elected Chairman of the CCEWV, and that all the other officers except two were members of the SWP or YSA. Further, the SWP and YSA branches in Cleveland were paying Rosenshine \$35.00 a week so he could devote full time to the anti-war movement.

The second source advised on June 27, 1966, that a subcommittee of members of the SWP and the YSA active in the CCEWV meet periodically to formulate policy for the CCEWV, to decide who would be elected to the various offices and what steps could be taken so that it would not appear that the SWP-YSA faction had taken over the CCEWV completely.

A third source advised on November 29, 1966, that Rosenshine continues to serve as Chairman of the CCEWV although he is no longer being paid. The source stated that at the elections on November 29, 1966, four other SWP or YSA members were named to fill principal offices, and of the eleven persons named to the Steering Committee, six are members of the SWP or YSA and one is a Communist Party member.

On December 12, 1966, the second source advised that the CCEWV has office space at 1846 Coventry Road, Cleveland Heights, Ohio, and holds weekly meetings there. According to the source, an estimated 20-30 persons attend these meetings with over half of them being members of the SWP or YSA. Most of the members are of high school or college age.

The second source also advised that the principal activities of the CCEWV have been in connection with sponsoring demonstrations and the distribution of literature against the war in Vietnam.

REVOLUTIONARY ACTION MOVEMENT

On November 3, 1964, a source made available a document entitled, "The Revolutionary Action Movement Manifesto", the document having been obtained by the source from an individual known to be a member of the Revolutionary Action Movement (RAM).

This document stated, in part, that RAM was officially organized in the Winter of 1963 by Afro-Americans who support the revolutionary objectives of ROBERT F. WILLIAMS, now residing in Cuba, and his concept of organized violence to achieve the liberation of the Afro-American people in the United States. This Manifesto disclosed that RAM had oriented its program to one of education and political revolution and the organization of a "black" political party with revolutionary objectives, having recognized the need for a "black revolution" that could and would seize power. RAM philosophy is described in this document as one of revolutionary nationalism, that is, one involving the struggles of the non-white races of the world against exploitation and enslavement by the white capitalist and imperialist nations.

Regarding WILLIAMS, it should be noted that on August 28, 1961, a Federal warrant was issued at Charlotte, North Carolina, charging him with Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution for the crime of kidnapping. Subsequent to the issuance of this warrant, WILLIAMS fled the United States to Cuba, where he now publishes a monthly newsletter entitled, "The Crusader" from Havana.

This source in September, 1964, advised RAM is dedicated to the overthrow of the capitalist system in the United States, by violence if necessary, and to its replacement by a socialistic system oriented toward the Chinese communist interpretation of Marxism-Leninism. RAM is entirely non-white in membership, clandestine in nature, and owes its primary allegiance to the "Bandung World", that is, the non-white races of the world rather than to any national entity, as such.

On November 16, 1964, a second source advised he learned recently from a RAM member that the organization began in Detroit, Michigan, largely under the impetus of DON FREEMAN, described

as the "Father" of RAM and referred to as RAM's "Black Stalin." FREEMAN served as RAM Chairman with MAXWELL STANFORD, now of New York City, formerly of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, serving as RAM Field Chairman.

On 3/18/65, a third source advised that Hanif Abdul Wahab of Cleveland, Ohio, occupies a position in the RAM only one or two places removed from the top RAM leadership.

On 5/16/66, a fourth source advised that the RAM still remains active; however, there is no formal headquarters, as such, for RAM. This source further advised that so far as is known, FREEMAN, STANFORD and WAHAB still occupy positions of leadership in RAM.

SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY (SWP)  
CLEVELAND BRANCH

A source in April, 1943, reported that the Cleveland Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) was organized about 1938 or 1939, and was affiliated with the National SWP and followed its policies and directives.

A second source, on June 2, 1966, advised that the Cleveland Branch SWP, with approximately sixteen members, is affiliated with the National SWP and is currently active in Cleveland and Akron, Ohio.

APPENDIX

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960, issue of the "Young Socialist," (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the founding declaration of YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

A source advised on May 23, 1966, that the original YSA was an organization formed during October, 1957, in New York City, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The leaders of this group were the guiding forces in the establishment of the national organization.

The source further advised on May 23, 1966, that the YSA is dominated and controlled on a national basis by the SWP through having SWP members comprise exclusively the National Executive Committee (NEC). The YSA, in reality, is the youth and training section for the SWP and the main source of new SWP members.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Room 535, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

A source on June 2, 1966, reported that the Cleveland Branch of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) was organized in 1964, is affiliated with the national YSA, follows its policies and directives, and it is close to the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), as the majority of its members are members of the SWP. Source related that its activities are aimed toward youth on college campuses and that it claims to be independent of the SWP. It has approximately 22 members.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

This activity was to be held on April 15, 1967, on the West Coast at San Francisco, California, and on the East Coast at New York, New York. The leaflets included a list of local Seattle sponsors and named NORMA LODICO, identified as with the Seattle Young Socialist Alliance, and DEBORAH LEONARD, identified with the Seattle Spring Mobilization Committee. The leaflets describe the purpose of the meeting as, "We call all Americans to unite and mobilize in a movement to end the senseless slaughter of American GI's and the mass murder of Vietnamese".

SE T-3 (4/7/67)

On April 14, 1967, the "Seattle Times", a daily newspaper, Seattle, Washington, reported DEBORAH LEONARD was the Director of the Seattle Spring Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam, which LEONARD stated "has three goals; an end to U.S. bombing of North Vietnam; immediate withdrawal of American troops; and self-determination for Vietnam".

ST - DEBORAH EVE LEONARD, nee Roberts, who was born September 11, 1942, in New York, New York, was reported on March 14, 1966, by SE T-4 as having been sent by the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) at New York City to Seattle for an indefinite period in an

attempt to prevent the Seattle Branch of

National organization.

APPENDIXSOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY - SEATTLE BRANCH

In May, 1941, a source advised that during the month of May, 1941, the Seattle Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) was reorganized and received official recognition as a branch of the Party from the National Office of the SWP in New York, New York.

The Socialist Workers Party has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On May 24, 1965, another source advised the Seattle Branch, SWP, with headquarters at 3815 Fifth Avenue Northeast, Seattle, was an affiliate of the National SWP. According to source, membership in the Seattle Branch included RICHARD FRASER, who is a member of the SWP National Committee, and his wife, CLARA FRASER, who is an alternate member of the SWP National Committee.

In April, 1966, a third source stated that the Seattle Branch, SWP, executed a statement of resignation from the National SWP, dated April 9, 1966; that they have made reference to the group as the Seattle Branch, SWP (Unaffiliated) since then; and have temporarily adopted the name Freedom Socialist Party (FSP) of Washington. This group, led by RICHARD FRASER, formerly a member of the SWP National Committee, and his wife, CLARA FRASER, Organizer of the branch, were in disagreement with the National SWP over the questions of the Negro struggle, the colonial revolution, the Vietnamese war, regroupment, woman's emancipation, and party organizational principles.

This source advised that prior to the resignation of the Seattle Branch, SWP, TOM LEONARD and DEBBIE ROBERTS, aka DEBBIE LEONARD, were transferred by the SWP from New York to Seattle, to try to bring back some of the members to the majority line and prevent the entire branch membership from resigning. They established SWP headquarters at their residence at 5265 - 15th Avenue Northeast, Seattle.

The April 17, 1967, issue of "The Militant" listed the address of the Seattle SWP at 5257 University Way (NE).

"The Militant" is a weekly newspaper of the SWP.



## APPENDIX

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960, issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

On March 10, 1967, a source advised that the YSA was formed during 1957, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The source further advised that the YSA has recently become more open about admitting that it is the youth group of the SWP and that an SWP representative has publicly stated that the YSA is the SWP's youth group.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Rooms 532-536, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

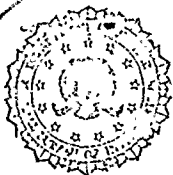

DE T-2 advised on various dates between October 2, 1967 and September 25, 1968, that subject attended 31 closed membership meetings of the DBSWP (see appendix) held at Debs Hall, 3737 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, Michigan, between September 28, 1967 and September 19, 1968.

DE T-3 on November 1, 1967, and DE T-4 on November 9, 1967, stated that the subject attended the SWP National Convention which was held at the Empire Hotel in New York City, October 26-29, 1967.

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, has advised that a newly formed committee in Detroit, calling itself the Peace Coalition Coordinating Committee (PCCC) has recently been organized with the specific purpose of generating interest in the Detroit area for the demonstration scheduled for Washington, D. C., November 15, 1969, to protest the United States intervention in Vietnam.

This source said that the PCCC was formed as an Ad-hoc committee with the hope of having participation from all local groups which are opposed to United States intervention in Vietnam. Source said that he has attended meetings of the PCCC and is on the Steering Committee of the PCCC, and it was his opinion that the PCCC is under the domination and control of individuals who are members of the Detroit Branch, Socialist Workers Party (DBSWP).

A characterization of the DBSWP is contained in the appendix pages attached hereto.

The above source advised that the PCCC, which is also known as the Detroit Coalition, has offices at 5705 Woodward Avenue, Detroit.

Paschal urged all those present to attend. He also discussed the fact that a simultaneous mass rally is scheduled for San Francisco on November 15, 1969, at the same time the mass rally is held in Washington, D. C.

David Herreshoff also spoke to those present and said that on September 20, 1969, a rally would be held in the immediate vicinity of the University of Michigan (U of M) Stadium at Ann Arbor. Following the rally, a march would be held to designate support at or near the U of M campus and a second rally would be held that night.

The purpose of the activity in Ann Arbor would be to alert the student body to the scheduled march on Washington and attempt to generate interest in the formation of a U of M group to participate in the Washington demonstration.

The seventh source, above, stated that the person in charge of the Lutheran Student Center, a Sister Doreen, made the statement to the approximately 20 persons present that she would not participate in any further street demonstrations because she was tired of the disruptions, the attitude of the police, and the bad reactions that follow in the newspaper. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" reflects the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on December 11, 1969, that the activities scheduled for the greater Detroit area on December 12 and 13, 1969, which are described as National Moratorium Days would be devoted to mass leafleting and the selling of peace buttons and other paraphernalia at shopping centers and plant gates in the Detroit area.

On December 13, 1969, a program sponsored by the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (SMC) was scheduled to be held at 5705 Woodward Avenue, Detroit. This program was described as "Anti-War Basic Training".

On December 15, 1969, the above source advised that the program sponsored by the SMC, mentioned above, began at approximately 10:50 AM, at 5705 Woodward Avenue, Detroit. The first activity was the showing of a movie entitled, "North Vietnam". This source estimated that there were approximately 70 persons in attendance for the showing of this movie and it appeared that most of the group were white students of high school age predominantly from suburban areas of Detroit.

Above source continued that at 11:45 AM, a panel program commenced and the topic discussed was "GI's Fight Against the War". The members of the panel were identified

Harris, Box 1173, Selfridge, Air Force Base, Michigan; Douglas Beyers, 20 Brett Drive, Selfridge; Bruce Mertz a former Sergeant in the United States Army who had served in Vietnam, and Dewey Ames identified as a former construction engineer in Vietnam. This source also stated that Michael Smith, a Detroit attorney who participated in the defense of the Fort Jackson Eight, was also advertised as a member of the panel; but he did not attend this program.

This source stated that all of the members of the panel were critical in various ways of the United States intervention in Vietnam and the military service. Source said that Beyers told the gathering that if he as a Negro got in trouble at Selfridge Air Force Base, the only persons that he could turn to for support were fellow panel member Harris and another GI at Selfridge Field whom he identified only as Green. Source stated that Beyers in his remarks also implied that he had considered the possibility of leaving the United States and fleeing to Canada. Beyers also indicated that he was bitter against the United States military and blamed his personal problems on the system. Charles Harris made the statement he desired to get out of the service and defend his people (blacks) at home.

The above source stated that Sharon Naiman appeared to be the person in charge of the SMC program. Source also recognized in attendance John Benson, Norma Lodico, Paul Lodico, Dave Chamberlin, Helen Schiff and Laura Robb.

A second source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on December 11, 1969, that Michael Smith, Sharon Naiman, John Benson, Norma and Paul Lodico, Dave Chamberlin and Helen Schiff are all current active members of the Detroit Branch Socialist Workers Party (DBSWP).

A characterization of the DBSWP is attached hereto.

The second source above also advised on December 11, 1969, that Laura Robb is a member of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) in Detroit.

A characterization of the YSA is attached hereto.

A third source, a representative of another government agency that conducts security type investigations, advised on December 15, 1969, that the film shown at the SMC activities at approximately 10:45 AM, December 13, 1969, at 5705 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, was entitled "Vietnam-North" and depicted life in North Vietnam. The film was produced by Newsreel, and it was stated that the film was shot in North Vietnam in July and August, 1969. This source believed there were from 150 to 175 persons present during the showing of the film and estimated that sixty percent were college age and about forty percent appeared to be students of high school age. A small portion of the gathering were over the age of 30. Source said that there appeared to be only four to six Negroes in attendance at the gathering.

The third source stated that the panel discussion commenced at approximately 11:45 AM, following the showing of the above film. This source advised that the active duty Air Force servicemen from Selfridge Air Force Base were identified as Douglas Beyers and Carlos Hughes. All of the panel members were dressed in civilian attire. Bruce Mertz, the former Sergeant, claimed that he was a Vietnam veteran, who had served in the Ninth Infantry Division along the Cambodian border in Vietnam. He claimed that the morale of the men in his company in Vietnam was low due to the incompetence of the officers. Mertz also claimed

that throwing suspects out of helicopters during interrogations was common place in Vietnam. He stated that it was normal to beat people up until you got the answer you wanted from them. Mertz also claimed that much of the military equipment in his unit in Vietnam was faulty.

Third source above stated that Dewey Ames claimed that his unit had committed alleged atrocities against civilians in South Vietnam. As an example he said that homes were knocked down with bulldozers.

The third source said that the two military personnel, both of whom were Negroes, referred to racial tensions which exist at Selfridge Air Force Base. Hughes said that he had not been to Vietnam and further that he would flee to Canada if he received orders to go to Vietnam.

The third source above said Marc Stickgold, a Detroit attorney, addressed the gathering at approximately 2:30 PM. At this time, there appeared to be between 100 and 125 persons present, and they were almost entirely of high school age. Stickgold discussed students' rights in matters of protest. He referred to court cases in the matter and distributed copies of a legal brief that had been prepared regarding high school students' rights.

The third source above stated that following the speech of Stickgold, Laura Robb addressed those present on the topic of how to organize SMC chapters on their individual school campuses. She was very general and the guidelines that she laid down for those present were to participate as much as possible in all facets of anti-war protest, to hold meetings frequently and to encourage large participation in the meetings so that it would be safer for all individuals involved. Source said that this program ceased at 4:15 PM.

A source advised on May 15, 1969, that the Detroit Branch of the SWP is affiliated with the National SWP and follows its policies and directives. It was organized in 1940 and is currently active in Detroit, Michigan, with headquarters at Debs Hall, 3737 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, Michigan.

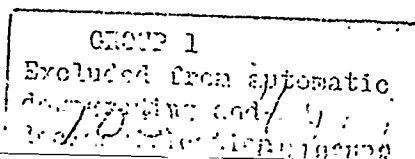

### FRIDAY NIGHT SOCIALIST FORUM (FNSF), Also Known As Militant Forum

On May 19, 1970, a source advised that the Friday Night Socialist Forum (FNSF) or "Militant Forum" as it is sometimes called, is a name used by the Detroit, Michigan, Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) in sponsoring forums, socials and other functions which are open to the public. Primarily, FNSF pertains to weekly public forums held at SWP Headquarters, 3737 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, for the purpose of spreading propaganda of the SWP, developing contacts, facilitating recruitment and members into the SWP, and presenting subjects of a controversial nature in the social, political and economic fields. Usually speakers are members of the SWP and they give the Socialist viewpoint of the subject discussed. The money collected at these FNSFs goes into the SWP treasury in Detroit.

The source advised some bulletins that are distributed by the SWP advertise the forums as being "Militant Forums" depending upon the speaker and to entice some of the more radical students from the campuses.

A source advised on May 16, 1969, that the Student Mobilization Committee (SMC) originally grew out of the National Student Strike for Peace conference held in Chicago, Illinois, on December 28-29, 1966, which resulted in a call for massive anti-war demonstrations in New York City and San Francisco, California, on April 15, 1967. The National Student Strike for Peace was originally called by the Communist Party (CP) and the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), culminating in a takeover by the SWP element in the summer of 1968 and the CP element withdrawing. Source further advised the SMC locally and nationally is controlled by the SWP and its youth arm, the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA), as evidenced by the YSA leadership and participation in SMC activities.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

A report by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, Ninetieth Congress, First Session, dated March 31, 1967, entitled "Communist Origin and Manipulation of Vietnam Week (April 8-15, 1967)," on page 53 states in part "Communists are playing dominant roles in both the Student Mobilization Committee and the Spring Mobilization Committee."

A second source on January 26, 1970, made available a copy of "The Student Mobilizer" dated January 21, 1970, which was self-described as being published by the National Office of the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam, 1029 Vermont Avenue, Northwest, Washington, D. C. 20005. In this issue the program of the SMC was set forth as follows: immediate and unconditional withdrawal of all United States troops from Vietnam, an end to the draft, end all forms of campus complicity with the war in Vietnam, self-determination for Vietnam and Black America and constitutional rights for GIs and high school students.

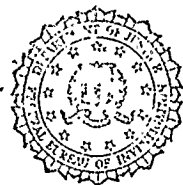

He advised that her duties consist of providing library services for professional doctors throughout Eastern Virginia who make inquiry of the library for certain research materials. He advised that the information that she has access to and throughout the library is public information available to the public in general.

~~He~~ said that Mrs. LODICO was hired in this position on 9/1/71 and resides at Apartment 3, 102 East Laburnum Avenue, Richmond. He advised that she has, to date, proved to be a capable and satisfactory employee and that no problems have been experienced with her in any way.

Former residence at 5027 Brooklyn Avenue, N.E., Seattle verified in 1967. No present neighbors or landlord recall or have records pertaining to occupancy by LODICO. Both former residences shown in credit bureau records. No arrest record located for employee. Seattle City Light referred bill of \$10.50 owed by employee to Seattle Credit Bureau Collection Agency on November 15, 1967, for collection. This obligation was still owed by employee as of March 23, 1973, according to Credit Bureau file. Employee unknown to other confidential sources.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

The Standard Form 85 of the employee, dated January 8, 1973, identified her husband as PAUL ALVIN LESLIE LODICO, and shows that she was employed by Stearns Machine Company, 25 W. Nickerson, Seattle, Washington, from November, 1966, to July, 1967, during which time she resided in Seattle with no street address shown by her on the Standard Form 85.

On March 31, 1967, SE T-1 furnished a three-page letter dated March 15, 1967, addressed to "Dear Friend," which was distributed at a Socialist Workers Party (SWP) meeting held at the Seattle Center, Seattle, Washington, on March 19, 1967. This letter advertised a "Spring Mobilization To End The War In Vietnam" to be held in New York and San Francisco on April 15, 1967. The literature stated that anti-war protestors from across the nation were to converge on the two cities for two mass marches and rallies and that a number of groups in Seattle who were opposed to the war in Vietnam had formed the Seattle Spring Mobilization Committee to coordinate their efforts to build the April 15 Mobilization.

The letter indicated the sender to be the "Spring Mobilization Committee To End The War In Vietnam" and at the left margin on page 3 of the letter appeared the heading "Organizations and institutions listed for the purpose of identification only". Set out under that heading appeared various names of individuals and organizations with which they were identified. Included in this list of names and organizations was "NORMA LODICO, Seattle Young Socialist Alliance".

On March 22, 1967, SE T-2 furnished a copy of the same three-page letter described above from the "Spring Mobilization Committee To End The War In Vietnam", which the source had received through the mail. The name "NORMA LODICO, Seattle Young Socialist Alliance" was contained on the left margin of page three.

SE T-2 is not available for recontact.

SE T-3 on April 7, 1967, furnished a copy of the same three-page letter described above which the source received through the mail.

SE T-3 is not available for recontact.

On December 20, 1966, SE T-4 advised the name PAUL LODICO, 5027 Brooklyn Northeast, Seattle; telephone LA 3-3705, had that day been added to the Freedom Socialist Party (FSP) mailing list. The source was of the opinion that PAUL LODICO was active in the YSA at Seattle.

The FSP is characterized in the Appendix section of this report.

SE T-4 was recontacted on March 28, 1973, and advised that the source does not recall PAUL LODICO and had no information at this time concerning him. SE T-4 also stated that the source had no information concerning NORMA JEAN LODICO.

On January 9, 1967, SE T-5 advised the catalogue for the Free University of Seattle (FUS), Winter Session - 1967, was distributed in the University District of Seattle, Washington. PAUL LODICO was listed in that catalogue as the coordinator of a course entitled "LEON TROTSKY, His Life and the Relevance of His Policies Today".

The FUS is characterized in the Appendix section of this report.

SE T-5 is not available for recontact.

Unless otherwise indicated the investigation conducted hereinafter was in connection with another investigation conducted by the FBI.

On January 26, 1967, [redacted] Stearns Machine Co., 25 West Nickerson Street, Seattle, Washington, advised that NORMA LODICO had been employed by that company as a machine operator since November, 1966.

On June 26, 1967, [redacted] Stearns Machine Company, 25 W. Nickerson Street, advised that NORMA JEAN LODICO was currently employed by that company as a machine operator.

On July 5, 1967, the above [redacted] advised that NORMA JEAN LODICO gave one week's notice that she intended to resign from her job with that company effective July 14, 1967, inasmuch as she was going to move to Detroit, Michigan.

On March 27, 1973, [redacted] Stearns Company, 25 W. Nickerson Street, Seattle, advised his employment records showed that NORMA JEAN LODICO, Social Security Number [redacted] JFK Act 6 (3), was employed by that company on November 3, 1966, as an assembly worker or machine operator, exact position not shown. Her residence address was shown as 5027 Brooklyn Avenue N.E., Seattle, and her marital status was shown as married. She terminated on July 4, 1967, and gave a forwarding address of 4527 Commonwealth Avenue, Detroit, Michigan.

[redacted] stated [redacted] records contained no additional information concerning LODICO.

[redacted] stated [redacted] had seven or eight women employees during the time LODICO worked for [redacted] company, and has continuously employed the same number of workers. He experiences a high turnover of employees, and with the passage of time, he could recall nothing whatever concerning LODICO.

He advised that [redacted] during the time Mrs. LODICO worked there, is deceased, and [redacted]

[redacted], had no personal contact with the assembly workers and machine operators, would not have known LODICO personally, and was unavailable for interview.

He advised no other present employees would have been in a position to have known LODICO.

### NEIGHBORHOODS

5236 22nd. Avenue N.E.  
Seattle, Washington

[redacted] 5236 22nd. Avenue N.E., Seattle, the University Apartments at that address, advised on November 23, 1966, that Mr. and Mrs. PAUL LODICO and small son moved into apartment 303 of that building approximately October 26, 1966.

On November 23, 1966, [redacted] University Apartments, advised that Mr. and Mrs. LODICO currently resided in the apartment next to [redacted].

On November 28, 1966, [redacted] advised that Mr. and Mrs. LODICO moved out from that building during the night of November 27 - 28, 1966, without notice.

[redacted] Customer Service, Seattle City Light, Seattle, advised on January 12, 1967, that electric service was terminated for PAUL A. LODICO at Apartment 303, 5236 22nd. Avenue N.E., Seattle, on December 1, 1966, and connected for him at 5027 Brooklyn Avenue N.E., Seattle, the same day.

On March 27, 1973, [redacted] 5236 22nd. Avenue N.E., Seattle, advised he was the present manager of University Apartments, but had no records of tenants who occupied the building in 1966 and stated no present tenants of the building resided there in 1966. He stated the present whereabouts of the above [redacted] and [redacted] were unknown to him.

Seattle, Washington  
11/66 - 7/67

On February 27, 1967, [redacted] Monarch Apartments, 5033 Brooklyn Avenue N.E., Seattle, advised that Mr. and Mrs. PAUL LODICO had been residing at 5027 Brooklyn Avenue N.E., Seattle, since December 1, 1966.

On June 26, 1967, [redacted] Brooklyn Avenue N.E., Seattle, advised that NORMA JEAN LODICO and her husband resided [redacted] at 5027 Brooklyn Avenue N.E.

On June 26, 1967, [redacted] Stearns Machine Company, 25 W. Nickerson Street, Seattle, advised that NORMA JEAN LODICO was at that time employed by his company and his records showed she resided at 5027 Brooklyn Avenue N.E., Seattle.

On March 27, 1973, [redacted] Monarch Apartments, 5033 Brooklyn Avenue N.E., advised he did not know the present location of [redacted] the former manager of that building, that he did not reside there in 1966 - 1967, and he did not know NORMA JEAN LODICO. He stated that none of the present occupants of that building resided there in 1966 - 1967.

On March 27, 1973, [redacted] Brooklyn Avenue N.E., advised the one-family residence at 5027 Brooklyn Avenue N.E. was a transient rental house owned by a [redacted] whose son-in-law, [redacted] now controls the property. She stated she never became well acquainted with any of the residents of the house and because of the passage of time and the number of people who have resided in that house, she was unable at the present time to recall a family by the name of LODICO who may have resided there at one time.

On March 28, 1973, [redacted] Maritime Building, 911 Western Avenue, Seattle, advised [redacted] formerly owned the rental property at 5027 Brooklyn Avenue N.E., Seattle. [redacted] is now deceased and [redacted] is the present owner of record of the property, but it is managed by [redacted] stated the records of former tenants which are in his

possession go back only to 1968, and records prior to 1968 have been destroyed. He stated that neither he, his wife, nor ~~XXXXXX~~ had any knowledge of, and no contact with any of the tenants who resided there in 1966 and 1967.

# CREDIT AND ARREST

On March 22, 1973, the files of the Seattle, Washington Police Department and the King County Department of Public Safety, Seattle, contained no arrest record for the employee.

On March 23, 1973, the files of the Seattle, Washington Credit Bureau reflected that in December, 1966, the residence address for the employee was shown as 5236 22nd. Avenue N.E., Apartment 303, Seattle; and in April, 1967, her address was shown as 5027 Brooklyn Avenue N.E., Seattle. In December, 1966, and in April, 1967, her employer was shown as the Stearns Machine Company, Seattle.

The Credit Bureau file reflected that on November 15, 1967, Seattle City Light had referred to the Seattle Credit Bureau Collection Agency for collection a bill in the amount of \$10.50 which was owed by the employee. As of March 23, 1973, this obligation was still owed by the employee, according to the Credit Bureau file.

# MISCELLANEOUS

During the course of the current investigation, other confidential sources who are acquainted with certain activities of the SWP and related SWP front groups in the Seattle area were contacted. They advised they had no knowledge of the employee or of her participation in any SWP activities.

APPENDIXFREE UNIVERSITY OF SEATTLE (FUS)

In its issue of September 30, 1966, "The Spectator", a student publication of Seattle University, carried an article on the formation of FUS at the University of Washington (UW), Seattle, Washington. It stated, in part, that RON RICHARDSON, a junior at the UW who is one of the founders of the movement in Seattle, stated the "free" does not refer to money but to academic freedom. "The student and teacher will meet together on common grounds to develop course content, curriculum, and to discuss direction of the school. In contrast to departmentalized education, courses will bridge several disciplines, emphasize controversy and clash of ideas. . . ." The free university "basically represents dissent with the present system. People wouldn't spend their money and teachers would not volunteer their services unless this dissent existed."

On August 30, 1966, a source reported RON RICHARDSON is in charge of FUS, RICH SALING has supervision of the Marxist classes and MIRIAM RADER is in charge of the "radical" classes.

In July, 1966, a second source stated MIRIAM RADER, daughter of UW philosophy professor, Dr. MELVIN M. RADER, and RICK SALING are members of the Freedom Socialist Party of Washington which is the new name adopted by a group of former members of the Seattle Branch, Socialist Workers Party (SWP).

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

RONALD ALAN RICHARDSON resides with MIRIAM RADER at Seattle, according to the second source in August, 1966, but has no known party affiliation.

On May 22, 1969, a third source stated FUS has been defunct for several months and no known efforts are being made to revive it.

APPENDIXFREEDOM SOCIALIST PARTY OF WASHINGTON,  
Also Known as Freedom Socialist Party (FSP)

In April, 1966, a source advised that the members of the Seattle Branch, Socialist Workers Party (SWP), executed a statement of resignation from the National SWP dated April 9, 1966, and temporarily adopted the name Freedom Socialist Party of Washington, also known as Freedom Socialist Party (FSP). Their disagreement with the National SWP was over the questions of the Negro struggle, the colonial revolution, the Vietnamese War, regroupment, women's emancipation, and party organizational principles.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The source further advised that at a convention on July 9, 1966, the group adopted the name FSP of Washington, and became a membership organization.

In August, 1966, the source furnished the August 5, 1966, issue of "The Freedom Socialist", self-described as the "Voice of the FSP of Washington". This publication states, "We are a new revolutionary socialism organization", that is comprised of the former Seattle Branch, SWP, "individual independent radicals who were part of the 1964 united socialist electoral coalition which created the FSP", and "A new segment of radical youth who have recently adopted Marxism as their political philosophy".

In December, 1967, a second source stated the FSP split in November, 1967, following the expulsion of RICHARD FRASER and a walkout of approximately half of the membership in sympathy with him. This group formed the FSP Emergency Committee. The FSP Emergency Committee, which had control of the publication funds, established headquarters at the home of FRANK KRASNOWSKY, 3117 East Thomas Street, Seattle, with ALFRED PEPPARD as Organizer. Both groups maintained they were the FSP.

On October 26, 1972, the first source advised that CLARA FRASER is the Organizer for the FSP and that this organization exists in name only.

## APPENDIX

STUDENT MOBILIZATION COMMITTEE  
Also Known As  
STUDENT MOBILIZATION COMMITTEE TO END  
THE WAR IN VIETNAM;  
NATIONAL STUDENT MOBILIZATION COMMITTEE;

A source advised on May 16, 1969, that the Student Mobilization Committee (SMC) originally grew out of the National Student Strike for Peace conference held in Chicago, Illinois, on December 28-29, 1966, which resulted in a call for massive antiwar demonstrations in New York City and San Francisco, California, on April 15, 1967. The National Student Strike for Peace was originally called by the Communist Party (CP) and the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). It culminated in a takeover by the SWP forces and a withdrawal of the CP element. Source further advised the SMC locally and nationally was controlled by the SWP and its youth arm, the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA), as evidenced by the YSA leadership and participation in SMC activities.

(The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.)

(A characterization of the YSA is set out separately.)

A report by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, Ninetieth Congress, First Session, dated March 31, 1967, entitled "Communist Origin and Manipulation of Vietnam Week (April 8-15, 1967)," on page 53, stated in part, "Communists are playing dominant roles in both the Student Mobilization Committee and the Spring Mobilization Committee."

The second confidential source advised on April 10, 1972, that the National Office of SMC was located at 150 Fifth Avenue, Room 911, New York, New York, telephone number 741-1960. The SMC Regional Office had been consolidated into the National Office and operated out of the above location.

A third confidential source advised on April 10, 1972, that SMC had for its publication, "The Student Mobilizer," which, in its issue of April 8, 1972, described itself as being published by the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Southeast Asia, 150 Fifth Avenue, New York City. This source stated that the program of the SMC was as follows:

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

EMPLOYMENT

On April 2, 1973, [redacted] of Medical Library (Templins - McGraw Library), Medical College of Virginia of the Virginia Commonwealth University, 509 North 12th Street, Richmond, Virginia, advised that employee was employed at this library in the position of reference librarian from September 1, 1971 until January 3, 1973. He advised employee resigned from this position to join her husband who was attending school in Washington, D.C. He advised that employee proved to be a very capable, trustworthy and satisfactory employee and that no problems were experienced with her in any way.

He recalled that employee had a son named MARCELLO who was born in October, 1962, and who stayed with employee's husband in Detroit, Michigan when she came to Richmond to take this employment. He stated that employee had indicated that both her husband and her son would remain in Detroit until the completion of her son's school term in January, 1972. He further recalled that prior to her husband coming to Richmond, employee's son was killed when struck by an automobile while walking to his school in Detroit. He stated that, thereafter, employee's husband, PAUL, went to Washington, D.C. to complete his schooling and came to Richmond only during holidays and on weekends and that employee resided alone at Apartment 3, 102 Laburnum Avenue in Richmond, Virginia.

Mr. MILLER stated that employee never gave any indication to him of being involved in any activities he considered un-American and pointed out that if employee had engaged in any such activities, he would have become aware of it and would have taken appropriate action to protect the outstanding reputation enjoyed by the Medical College of Virginia.

He advised that based on his association with employee, he would have no hesitancy in recommending her for the position under consideration.

On April 2, 1973, [redacted] of Virginia Medical Information System, (VAMIS), Medical Library, Medical College of Virginia, Richmond, Virginia, advised that employee, while employed at this [redacted] Richmond, was a reference librarian working under [redacted] supervision. She advised employee was considered by her to be an excellent librarian and very dependable and prompt in her duties. She stated she believed employee to be of excellent character and gave no indication of disloyalty to the United States. She stated employee had indicated to her that while in Detroit, she had engaged in some type of anti-government demonstrations in connection with the "Stop The War In Vietnam" philosophy that was prevalent at that time.

[redacted] stated that employee never tried to convert anyone while under her supervision to her apparent type of thinking on these matters. She stated she was aware of employee's present job with the Department of the Interior in Washington, D.C. and stated she felt employee was very well qualified for that position and that she would recommend her highly for same.

She advised that employee suffered a tragedy in November, 1971, when employee's only child was killed in, she believes, a bus accident while going to school. She stated that this child was living with employee's husband in Detroit, Michigan and after the child was killed, the husband moved to Washington, D.C. to complete his schooling and that employee resigned this job to join him in Washington, D.C.

#### NEIGHBORHOOD

On March 29, 1973, [redacted] Rental Department, Blake and Son, Five North Fourth Street, Richmond, Virginia, advised that they are the rental agents for Laburnum Manor Apartments in this city. She advised that employee formerly resided at 102 Laburnum Avenue, Apartment 3, Richmond, Virginia, from September 1, 1971 to January 2, 1973, when employee vacated the premises without notice to the rental agent. She advised that other than the fact she failed to give proper notice of termination of occupancy, there is nothing in the records indicating she was an undesirable tenant. She stated she recalled employee moving into the apartment and stating that she would be joined by her husband and son on or about January 1, 1972. However,

her husband never came to reside in the apartment other than on weekends or during holidays from his schooling he was obtaining in Washington, D.C. She stated that this tenant was current in her rent and no complaints were received concerning her from any other tenants. She explained that these apartments are generally occupied by transient-type tenants and the only tenant presently residing in the area of Apartment 3, 102 Laburnum Avenue would be Mr. COONS in Apartment 2.

On April 2, 1973, [redacted] Richmond, Virginia, [redacted] advised that employee resided in Apartment 3 for approximately one year prior to moving to Washington, D.C. in January, 1973. He advised employee lived alone except on weekends and on holidays when she would be joined by her husband. He advised they were quiet and well-behaved neighbors and stated he knew of nothing derogatory concerning either of them.

#### CREDIT

On April 2, 1973, [redacted] Richmond Credit Bureau, Richmond, Virginia, advised SC LEO C. MADE that PAUL A. During period of residence in Cleveland area, employee and her husband, PAUL LODICO, were reported by several reliable informants to have been very active and leading members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) in Cleveland throughout the entire period. Employee and her husband were also reportedly participants in activities and demonstrations of the Cleveland Committee to End the War in Vietnam during above period. Employee was arrested by Cleveland Police in Nov. 1965 and in Sept. 1966 for disorderly assembly, both of which charges were dismissed by Cleveland Municipal Court. On April 9, 1973, ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ District No. 7, UE, stated he personally recalled that NORMA LODICO had been employed as ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ secretary and as a general office worker of District No. 7, UE, for the better part of a year and during the approximate period set forth in the caption. He said that the District Office was located at 17403 Harvard Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, during that period. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ caused a thorough search to be made of available personnel and other records of above office, and was unable to locate any records covering LODICO's above employment, other than an income tax withholding report for the month of October 1966, which carried NORMA J. LODICO, Social Security Account Number JFK Act 6 (3), as an employee of above District at a salary of \$150 a month.

~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ said that he recalled Mrs. LODICO quite well as a former employee. He said that ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ had hired her on the recommendation of another official of above union, who did not work in the District 7 Office, and whose name he could not now recall. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ said that he had found Mrs. LODICO to be a very capable, intelligent and hard-working employee, whose services had been entirely satisfactory. Her employment had been terminated at her own request because she and her husband were then moving away from the Cleveland area.

~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ said that he had never met Mrs. LODICO's husband, and knew nothing of her social life or activities away from work. He said that his recollection of her is entirely favorable, and that nothing of an adverse nature concerning her had come to his attention. He said that he

As is noted below in this report, records of the Police Department, Cleveland, Ohio, disclose that NORMA LODICO, whose background and descriptive data coincide with that of employee, was arrested by that Department on November 14, 1965, at which time she said she was employed as a waitress at the restaurant named in the caption.

On April 6, 1973, ~~hostess at captioned restaurant~~ hostess at captioned restaurant, advised that she has been employed there as long ago as November 1965 and is the only employee of the restaurant who has worked there for more than five years. She said that she could not recall the employee as a former waitress at the restaurant, owing to the large number of employees and rapid turnover of waitresses at the restaurant. She said that any records of the employment of waitresses as long ago as 1965, if still in existence, would be at the restaurant's headquarters office, 2914 West Market Street, Akron, Ohio.

On April 10, 1973, ~~Mark Restaurants Chain~~ Mark Restaurants Chain, 2914 West Market Street, Akron, Ohio, advised SA ROBERT BILLHIMER, Jr., that all records of waitresses and other similar employees of the Chain, who were employed at captioned restaurant or elsewhere prior to January 1, 1968, have been destroyed. He said he could locate no information possibly identifiable with the employee in the records of the Chain.

The 1966 edition of the Cleveland, Ohio, City Directory lists Mrs. NORMA LODICO, employed as office secretary, United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America (UE), residence in Cleveland Heights, Ohio (no residential address listed).

The 1967 edition of the East Suburban City Directory for Cleveland, Ohio (the only edition covering Cleveland Heights, Ohio, for captioned period) lists PAUL LODICO, mechanic, and wife, NORMA, residing 2649 Hampshire Road, Cleveland Heights.

On April 4, 1973, Hampshire Road; Hampshire Road; and Hampshire Road, Cleveland Heights, Ohio, advised that they had not resided in the area as long ago as 1966, and did not know anyone possibly identifiable with employee or her husband.

On April 4, 1973, Hampshire Road, Apartment 2, Cleveland Heights, Ohio, advised that she has resided and managed an apartment house at that address since about the middle of 1966. She said that she has never heard of the employee or her husband, to the best of her knowledge. She noted that most, if not all, of the residents of above neighborhood since she has been a resident there, are young people who live very informally and move about a great deal. She said that she could not suggest the identities or present whereabouts of any former residents of the neighborhood during the 1965-1966 period.

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The 1965 edition of the Cleveland, Ohio, City Directory lists PAUL LODICO, a student, as residing at 2123 Stearns Road, Apartment 6, Cleveland, Ohio.

The area in which above address was located during the period of employee's reported residence has since been rebuilt with new commercial and office buildings and a current neighborhood investigation covering the period of employee's residence is no longer possible.

#### AFFILIATIONS AND ACTIVITIES

The following information was developed during prior investigations by the FBI from the sources indicated:

On January 22, 1965, CV T-1 reported that NORMA LODICO and her husband, PAUL LODICO, formerly active members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) in Detroit, Michigan, had moved to Cleveland, Ohio, recently and reportedly were then residing at 2123 Stearns Road, Cleveland.

#### SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY (SWP)

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On February 16, 1965, [redacted] of a residential building located at 2123 Stearns Road, Cleveland, advised SA WILLIAM W. PATTON that PAUL LODICO and his wife, NORMA, were then residing in Apartment 1 at that address. He said that Mrs. LODICO was an unemployed housewife.

On July 16, 1965, CV T-1 identified the above NORMA LODICO as a then member of the Cleveland, Ohio, Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP).

#### CLEVELAND, OHIO, BRANCH OF THE SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY (SWP)

A characterization of the Cleveland, Ohio, Branch of the SWP is included in the appendix of this report.

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In November 1965, CV T-1 identified PAUL LODICO, husband of the above NORMA LODICO, as the then organizer of the Cleveland, Ohio, Branch of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA).

CLEVELAND, OHIO, BRANCH OF THE  
YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE (YSA)

A characterization of the Cleveland, Ohio, Branch of the YSA appears in the appendix of this report.

Unless otherwise noted, all meetings and similar functions at which NORMA LODICO was reportedly present, as set out below, were held at 5927 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio.

On various dates over the period December 3, 1965, to October 13, 1966, CV T-1 submitted reports identifying the above NORMA LODICO as a member of the Cleveland Branch, SWP (CBSWP) and of the Cleveland Branch, YSA (CBYSA), and as having attended nineteen scheduled meetings of one or the other of these organizations, including membership meetings, forums, and classes on socialism, which were held over the period December 2, 1965, to October 9, 1966.

CV T-1 was recontacted on March 28, 1973, regarding the employee and her husband, and he advised that he was unable to furnish any information concerning them, in addition to that previously reported and set out above.

CV T-1 is not available to testify.

On November 30, 1965, CV T-2 reported that NORMA LODICO, known to the source as an active member of the CBSWP and CBYSA, was an unemployed housewife then residing at 2649 Hampshire Road, Cleveland Heights, Ohio

On September 28, 1966, CV T-2 reported that the above NORMA LODICO was then employed in the office of the United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America, District Council No. 7, 17403 Harvard Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio.

On various dates during the period December 8, 1965, to October 12, 1966, CV T-2 identified the above NORMA LODICO as a member of the CBSWP and CBYSA, and as having been in attendance at twenty-nine scheduled meetings and activities of one or the other of these organizations in Cleveland, Ohio, including membership meetings, forums, and classes on socialism, which took place over the period December 5, 1965, to October 12, 1966.

During the same period CV T-2 also identified her as having been in attendance at five meetings of the Cleveland Committee to End the War in Vietnam (CCEWV), all of which were held at 11205 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio. Source also identified her as having taken part, during above period, in several demonstrations in Cleveland which source reported were sponsored by the CCEWV.

CLEVELAND COMMITTEE TO END THE  
WAR IN VIETNAM (CCEWV)

A characterization of the CCEWV appears in the appendix of this report.

On January 31, 1966, CV T-2 identified the above NORMA LODICO as having been newly elected to the executive committee of the CBSWP, as well as to the office of recording secretary of the Branch.

On January 31, 1967, CV T-2 reported that the above NORMA LODICO and her husband, PAUL LODICO, had been sent to Seattle, Washington, by the national headquarters of the SWP for the purpose of having them organize a branch of the YSA in that city.

CV T-2 was recontacted on April 3, 1973, with respect to the employee and her husband, and he advised that he could furnish no information concerning them, in addition to that he had previously reported, as set out above.

CV T-2 is not available to testify.

On January 9, 1965, CV T-3 identified the above NORMA LODICO as a member of the CBYSA. On January 13, 1965, and on July 15, 1965, source identified her as a member of the CBSWP.

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On January 12, 1966, CV T-3 reported that above NORMA LODICO during July 1965 had been elected to a newly formed executive committee of the CBSWP, which was composed of five members, including NORMA LODICO and her husband, PAUL LODICO.

On January 19, 1966, CV T-3 reported that NORMA LODICO was present at a membership meeting of the CBSWP held in Cleveland on January 13, 1966, at which meeting she was nominated for membership on the Branch executive committee and that she had accepted the nomination. α

On September 22, 1966, CV T-3 reported that the above NORMA LODICO attended a CBSWP membership meeting held at 9801 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio. At the meeting she gave a report on the school on socialism which had been sponsored for their members by the CBSWP and the CBYSA in Cleveland during the Summer of 1966. In her report LODICO claimed that the school, the first of its kind held in Cleveland, had been very successful.

On a number of occasions throughout the period November 30, 1965, to December 12, 1966, CV T-3 reported that the above NORMA LODICO was a member throughout most of that period of the CBSWP and the CBYSA, and had been in attendance at thirty-six scheduled activities of one or the other of these organizations in Cleveland, Ohio, including membership meetings, forums, and classes on socialism, throughout most of that period.

On February 2, 1967, CV T-3 reported that in October 1966 the above NORMA LODICO and her husband, PAUL LODICO, were transferred to the Seattle, Washington, Branch of the SWP, and shortly thereafter left the Cleveland area in order to take up residence in Seattle.

CV T-3 is not available for recontact and this source is not available to testify.

On January 9, 1965, CV T-4 identified the above NORMA LODICO as a member of the CBYSA. On January 13, 1965, and on July 15, 1965, this source also identified her as a member of the CBSWP.

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On March 4, 1966, CV T-4 identified NORMA LODICO as a then member of both the CBSWP and of the CBYSA, who was scheduled to attend the National YSA Convention in Chicago, Illinois, on March 4-6, 1966.

On May 12, 1966, CV T-4 reported that NORMA LODICO had acted as chairman of a forum sponsored jointly by the CBSWP and CBYSA in Cleveland on May 1, 1966, and on May 8, 1966.

On June 9, 1966, CV T-4 identified NORMA LODICO as being present at a membership meeting of the CBSWP, held in Cleveland on June 3, 1966, at which she reported that she had sent \$935 to the National Headquarters of the SWP in New York City as part of the quota of the CBSWP in the National Fund Drive of the SWP.

On June 14, 1966, and on July 18, 1966, respectively, CV T-4 identified NORMA LODICO as having been present at schools on socialism sponsored by the CBSWP and the CBYSA in Cleveland on June 8, 1966, and on July 13, 1966. Source identified LODICO as being the director of the school in each instance.

Over the period November 30, 1965, to October 17, 1966, CV T-4 reported that the above NORMA LODICO was a member of the CBSWP and of the CBYSA throughout most of that period, and as having been in attendance at thirty-two scheduled meetings of one or the other of these organizations, held in Cleveland over the period November 21, 1965, to October 7, 1966, including membership meetings, forums, and classes on socialism.

CV T-4 is not available for recontact and this source is not available to testify.

Over the period November 29, 1965, to October 26, 1966, CV T-5 identified the above NORMA LODICO as a member during that time of the CBSWP, and as having been in attendance at thirty-one scheduled functions of the CBSWP or of the CBYSA, held in Cleveland, Ohio, during the period November 14, 1965, to October 7, 1966.

CV T-5 was recontacted on April 3, 1973, with respect to the employee and her husband, and he advised that he could furnish no information concerning them in addition to that which he had previously reported concerning them, as set out above.

CV T-5 is not available to testify.

Over the period December 3, 1965, to October 17, 1966, CV T-6 identified the above NORMA LODICO as a member during that time of the CBSWP and of the CBYSA, and as having been in attendance at eighteen scheduled meetings of one or the other organizations in Cleveland, Ohio, during that approximate period.

CV T-6 also identified NORMA LODICO as having been in attendance at six meetings of the CCEWV, held at 11205 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, during the above period.

CV T-6 was not available for recontact and this source is not available to testify.

On February 13, 1968, CV T-7 reported that the YSA had held its seventh annual convention at the Wolverine Hotel in Detroit, Michigan. Source identified a number of persons whom he had observed in attendance at the convention, among whom he named PAUL LODICO and NORMA LODICO, both of Seattle, Washington.

On April 11, 1973, CV T-7 was recontacted with respect to the above report. He stated that he recalled making the above report. He also recalled observing PAUL and NORMA LODICO as in attendance at above convention. He said that PAUL and NORMA LODICO were husband and wife who had formerly lived in Cleveland, Ohio, about 1966, and had been known to source at that time as very active and leading members of the YSA in the Cleveland area, prior to their moving to Seattle, Washington.

CV T-7 is not available to testify.

CREDIT AND LAW ENFORCEMENT RECORDS

On April 6, 1973, Credit Bureau of Cleveland, Ohio, advised SC MARY ANN RUSTILE that there is no information in the Bureau's records concerning the employee or her husband.

On March 26, 1973, SC WILLIAM HEGEDUS caused a search to be made of the files of the Record Room, Police Department, Cleveland, Ohio, and a record of two arrests, one on November 14, 1965, and the other on September 5, 1966, was noted for NORMA LODICO, white, female, born March 5, 1942, residing 2649 Hampshire Road, Cleveland Heights, Ohio. No other information concerning this individual was contained in the records. Details and dispositions of the above arrests were located and reviewed on April 5, 1973, in the microfilm records of the Central Records Bureau, Police Department, Cleveland, Ohio, by SC HEGEDUS, and the following pertinent information was obtained:

NORMA LODICO was booked at 1:40 AM, November 14, 1965, on a charge of disorderly assembly and causing a riot at 5929 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, in violation of section 13:1124 of the Municipal Code of Cleveland. She said that she was employed as a waitress by the Mark Restaurant, Burke Airport, Cleveland, was born in Michigan, and was 5'5" tall, weighed 133 pounds, had brown hair and blue-gray eyes.

On November 15, 1965, LODICO was arraigned in the Municipal Court of Cleveland and pleaded not guilty to above charge. The case was continued and the charge was eventually dismissed on July 12, 1966, by Judge THEODORE WILLIAMS because the affidavit on which the charge was based was not correctly worded.

The same individual was again booked at 1:15 PM on September 5, 1966, on a charge of disorderly assembly at 5927 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, on August 23, 1966, in violation of the above section of the Cleveland Municipal Code. She again gave her residence as 2649 Hampshire Road, Cleveland Heights, Ohio, but refused to give her place of

employment. She was released on \$200 bond and the charge was eventually dismissed by the Municipal Court of Cleveland, date and grounds of dismissal not appearing in the records.

There was no other information identifiable with the above person in the Central Records Bureau.

On March 26, 1973, SC HEGEDUS caused searches to be made of the records of the Headquarters Intelligence Unit, Police Department, Cleveland, Ohio, and the following information of pertinence was noted:

NORMA LODICO, wife of PAUL LODICO, in April 1965 resided at 2123 Stearns Road, Cleveland, and later resided at 2649 Hampshire Road, Cleveland Heights.

Confidential informants of the above Police Department, whose identities cannot be disclosed, reported the following information from time to time regarding above NORMA LODICO:

On December 18, 1965, January 4, 1966, and February 8, 1966, she attended meetings of the CCEWV. On April 14, 1966, she was a participant in a protest demonstration in front of the Federal Building, Cleveland, sponsored by the CCEWV. A 1965 Volkswagen with Ohio license EK 6774 was used to bring participants to above demonstration. (Records of the Cleveland Police Department disclosed on above date that the above car and license were registered to PAUL and NORMA LODICO, 2649 Hampshire Road, Cleveland Heights, Ohio.)

NORMA LODICO was present at another demonstration sponsored by the CCEWV at Public Square, Cleveland, Ohio, on June 11, 1966.

The above-noted informants of the Cleveland Police Department also reported the following pertinent information from time to time concerning PAUL LODICO, the husband of NORMA LODICO:

On October 18, 1964, he was reported to be in Cleveland, Ohio, and until recently to have been an organizer for the YSA in Detroit, Michigan. On above date, he lectured at a forum of the CBSWP and mentioned that he had been on a tour of Ohio colleges on behalf of the YSA.

As of February 1, 1965, he was reportedly a permanent resident, with his wife, NORMA, at 2123 Stearns Road, Cleveland, and to be a key man for the YSA in the Cleveland area.

On November 8, 1966, it was reported that PAUL and NORMA LODICO had left Cleveland and moved to Seattle, Washington, after having been very active in SWP, YSA and CCEWV activities in the Cleveland area since early 1965.

On March 28, 1973, SC HEGEDUS caused a search to be made of the records of the Identification Bureau, Police Department, Cleveland, Ohio, and no information identifiable with the employee was located.

On March 28, 1973, SC DALE A. KONOPKA was advised by ~~SC HEGEDUS~~, clerk, Police Department, Cleveland Heights, Ohio, that there is no information identifiable with the employee in the general records of that Department. On the same date, ~~SC HEGEDUS~~, Detective Bureau, above Police Department, advised SC KONOPKA that there was no information of pertinence identifiable with the employee in the records of that Bureau, with the exception of a report that a meeting of the SWP was held at the residence of PAUL LODICO, 2649 Hampshire Road, Cleveland Heights, on January 31, 1966, concerning which a complaint was made to the Police Department of excessive noise. No arrests were made and no other details are on record.

CLEVELAND COMMITTEE TO END THE WAR IN VIETNAM

On December 4, 1965, a source advised that the Cleveland Committee to End the War in Vietnam (CCEWV) was organized in the latter part of October, 1965, and that members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) in Cleveland were instrumental in forming the CCEWV.

The SWP is an organization designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. \*

A second source advised on January 24, 1966, that DANIEL ROSENSHINE, an SWP member, was elected Chairman of the CCEWV, and that all the other officers except two were members of the SWP or YSA. Further, the SWP and YSA branches in Cleveland were paying ROSENSHINE \$35. a week so he could devote full time to the anti-war movement.

The second source advised on June 27, 1966, that a subcommittee of members of the SWP and the YSA active in the CCEWV meet periodically to formulate policy for the CCEWV, to decide who would be elected to the various offices and what steps could be taken so that it would not appear that the SWP - YSA faction had taken over the CCEWV completely.

A third source advised on November 29, 1966, that ROSENSHINE continues to serve as Chairman of the CCEWV although he is no longer being paid. The source stated that at the elections on November 29, 1966, four other SWP or YSA members were named to fill principal offices and of the eleven persons named to the Steering Committee, six are members of the SWP or YSA and one is a Communist Party member.

The second source advised on May 22, 1967, that the CCEWV has office space at 13017 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, and holds weekly meetings there on Wednesday nights. Approximately twenty people attend these meetings, with over half of them being

members of the SWP or YSA. The officers of the CCEWV are the same as were elected in November, 1966, as there has been no subsequent election held. The principal activities of the CCEWV have been in connection with sponsoring demonstrations and the distribution of literature against the war in Vietnam.

In February, 1968, the second and third sources, who are familiar with the activities of the SWP, YSA and CCEWV, advised that the CCEWV was last known to have met in Cleveland, Ohio, on September 6, 1967. These sources stated that the CCEWV is no longer in existence as a functioning organization in the Cleveland, Ohio, area.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

WF T-1 advised in November of 1972 that PAUL LODICO was a member of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). In December of 1972, WF T-1 learned that PAUL LODICO was on phone list of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA)/SWP.

WF T-1 further advised in February of 1973 that PAUL LODICO attended regular meetings of the SWP. At one of these it was said that he led sales of the "Militant" with more than fifty copies.

The SWP and the YSA are characterized in the appendix to this report.

The "Militant" is a publication of the SWP.

It is to be noted that employee on Standard Form 85, Data for Non-Sensitive Position, signed by her on January 8, 1973, indicated her husband as PAUL ALVIN LESLIE LODICO, who was born September 9, 1940, Wyandotte, Michigan. She married him on January 6, 1962, in Detroit, Michigan.

WF T-2 advised in November of 1972 that PAUL LODICO was a current member of the Washington, D. C. Local of the YSA. In February of 1973, WF T-2 heard that PAUL LODICO had decided to disassociate himself from the YSA/SWP.

The Washington D. C. Local of the YSA is characterized in the appendix to this report.

Standard Form 61-B, Declaration of Appointee, signed by her on January 8, 1973, is attached to this report as Exhibit A. It is to be noted that employee answered in the negative concerning Item Ten on this exhibit which asked the question, "Since you filed a qualifications statement for this employment, have you been convicted of an offense against the law or forfeited collateral,...?"

Standard Form 171, Personal Qualifications Statement signed by employee on September 12, 1972, is attached as Exhibit B to this report. The employee answered in the negative to Item 29 on this exhibit which asked the question, "Have you ever been convicted of an offense against the law or forfeited collateral,...?"

On April 5, 1973, investigative files, Civil Service Commission, were reviewed and files contained no additional information concerning the employee.

On April 9, 1973, Special Clerk MYRA C. MILLER caused a search to be made of the files of the House Committee on Internal Security and information appearing therein was utilized during this investigation.

CREDIT AND POLICE AGENCIES

Special Agent CHARLES W. SMITH caused a search to be made of the files of The Credit Bureau, Incorporated, Washington, D. C., and was advised on March 23, 1973, that the files contained no credit rating for the employee.

According to the masthead of the YSO, dated April 21, 1972, the YSA was described as "a Multi-National Revolutionary Socialist Youth Organization."

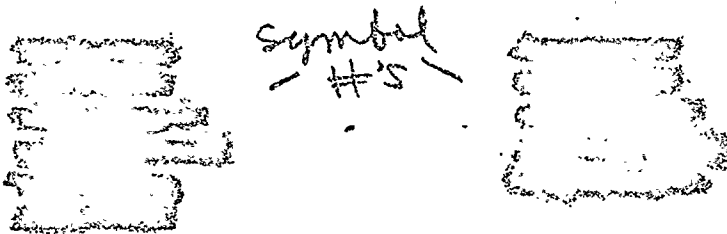

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) has conducted an investigation regarding NORMA JEAN LODICO, nee Dupire, also known as Mrs. Oliver Francis Cote, Mrs. Paul Alvin Leslie Lodico, born March 5, 1942, at Detroit, Michigan, Social Security Number JFK Act 6 (3)

The information set forth hereinafter has been reported during this investigation.

DE T-1, who is unavailable for recontact or testimony, on August 16, 1962, advised NORMA and PAUL LODICO were then current members of the Detroit Branch, Young Socialist Alliance (DBYSA).

A characterization of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) and the DBYSA are contained in the appendix attached hereto.

It should be noted the employee, on her Standard Form 85 reported that on January 6, 1962, at Detroit, Michigan, she married PAUL ALVIN LESLIE LODICO, birthdate September 9, 1940, Wyandotte, Michigan.

DE T-1, on December 6, 1962, advised that on November 11, 1962, at a closed Detroit Branch, Socialist Workers Party (DBSWP) membership meeting at Debs Hall, 3737 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, NORMA LODICO was elected to the post of member of the Friday Night Socialist Forum (FNSF) Committee.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Characterizations for the FNSF and the DBSWP are contained in the appendix attached hereto.

It should be noted that Debs Hall, 3737 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, is the headquarters for the DBSWP and DBYSA.

DE T-3, who is unavailable for recontact or testimony, on September 30, 1963, advised NORMA LODICO was chairman of a meeting of the FNSF held at Debs Hall on September 13, 1963, and that she introduced her husband, PAUL LODICO, who spoke about Vietnam and America's role in that country.

DE T-4, who is unavailable for recontact or testimony, furnished information between September 20, 1962 and November 14, 1963, reporting that NORMA LODICO attended 28 meetings of the FNSF held at Debs Hall during the period September 14, 1962 to October 18, 1963.

DE T-5, who is unavailable for recontact and testimony, advised between the period October 29, 1963 and October 15, 1964, that NORMA LODICO attended 24 meetings of the FNSF at Debs Hall during the period October 18, 1963 and October 9, 1964.

On November 6, 1963, a throwaway leaflet bearing the letterhead and return address of the FNSF identified NORMA LODICO as Detroit "Militant" Subscription Director.

"The Militant" is the official publication of the SWP.

DE T-2 advised between November 5, 1963 and September 1, 1964, that NORMA LODICO attended 14 meetings of the FNSF at Debs Hall during the period October 4, 1963 to August 28, 1964.

DE T-2 on February 1, 1964, advised NORMA LODICO was then a current member of the DBSWP.

DE T-2 between the period February 4, 1964 and October 23, 1964 advised NORMA LODICO attended 28 closed membership meetings of the DESWP at Debs Hall during the period February 2, 1964 and October 18, 1964.

DE T-5 on March 20, 1964 advised NORMA LODICO attended the YSA Mid-Western Conference in Chicago, Illinois on January 25-26, 1964.

A characterization of the SMC is contained in the appendix pages attached hereto.

DE T-7, who is unavailable for recontact or testimony, advised between February 27, 1968 and September 4, 1968, that NORMA LODICO attended 17 meetings of the FNSF at Debs Hall during February 2, 1968 and August 23, 1968.

DE T-8, who is unavailable for recontact or testimony, advised between the period March 4, 1968 and September 11, 1968 that NORMA LODICO attended eight meetings of the DBYSA at Debs Hall during the period February 25, 1968 and September 8, 1968 and that as of March 26, 1968 she was serving as DBYSA Educational Director.

DE T-7 on October 28, 1968, advised NORMA LODICO was a guest speaker at a meeting of the FNSF at Debs Hall on September 13, 1968 and her topic was the Russian invasion of Czechoslovakia.

DE T-2 between the period November 4, 1968 and March 5, 1971, advised NORMA LODICO attended 57 membership meetings of the DBSUP at Debs Hall during the period October 31, 1968 and February 18, 1971.

DE T-6 on December 3, 1968 advised NORMA LODICO attended the YSA National Convention in Chicago, Illinois on November 28, 1968 to December 1, 1968.

DE T-8 on March 26, 1969 advised NORMA LODICO was then a current member of the DBYSA.

DE T-7 on June 13, 1969 advised NORMA LODICO was chairman for the FNSF meeting held at Debs Hall on April 25, 1969.

DE T-9, who is unavailable for recontact or testimony, on June 17, 1969, advised NORMA LODICO participated in a rally at Wayne State University (WSU), Detroit, on May 29, 1969. DE T-9 advised the rally was staged for the Fort Jackson Eight, a group of U.S. Army soldiers who were arrested for their anti-Vietnam War activities at Fort Jackson, South Carolina. DE T-9 advised NORMA LODICO collected donations at the rally.

DE T-6 on June 24, 1969, advised the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) National Convention was held June 18 - 22, 1969 in Chicago, Illinois. DE T-6 advised that during this convention SWP and YSA members from various cities throughout the United States, including Detroit, engaged in disruptive tactics in an attempt to recruit dissident SDS members to the YSA and that NORMA LODICO was among those participating in these activities.

A characterization of the SDS is contained in the appendix pages attached hereto.

DE T-6 on July 8, 1969 advised NORMA LODICO attended a national anti-war conference held at Cleveland, Ohio, on July 4-5, 1969 and participated in a SMC conference in Cleveland on July 6, 1969.

DE T-7 advised between August 15, 1969 and September 8, 1969, that NORMA LODICO attended five sessions of the SWP summer school held at Debs Hall during the period July 2, 1969 to August 3, 1969.

DE T-6 advised on September 2, 1969 that NORMA LODICO attended the SWP National Convention held at the Hotel Diplomat, New York, New York, on August 29, 1969 to September 1, 1969.

DE T-10 has advised that the 23rd National Convention of the SWP was held at the Hotel Diplomat, New York, New York August 29-September 1, 1969 and arrangements for out of town delegates and visitors to the convention were made at the Hotel President, 234 W. 48th Street, New York, New York.

March 29, 1971

Dear Comrades:

Party membership has always been a very serious matter with me. I have the greatest respect for the concepts: vanguard party, and professional revolutionary. Because of this and because of seriously analyzing my activity and my relationship to the party, I am offering this letter of resignation.

In various periods during my eight year's membership in the party, I have exercised my political talents, such as they are, responsibly. I want to list some of the functions I have served for the sake of the comrades who have only known me in my inactivity. I did all right as B.C. member, former director, YSA organizer, sub campaign director, and Summer School director. I believe my performance was not exceptional because of one important deficiency. I took no joy in these activities nor did I find much satisfaction in the more routine branch work.

I have no disagreement with the party's political nor politically-derived organizational principles. I have loved the comradeship in the party and, more relevantly, I love the idea (and the near-certainty) of the world socialist revolution. I don't feel capable, however, of answering the demands and the pace required to work as a revolutionary should in a vanguard party in this period.

I understand that Leonid Brezhnev wrote that it is not enough to love the revolution but that one must also love being a

It was organized about June 15, 1960, by the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and is currently active in Detroit, Michigan, at SWP Headquarters, 3737 Woodward Avenue, Debs Hall, Detroit.

## APPENDIX

### FRIDAY NIGHT SOCIALIST FORUM (FNSF) Also Known as Militant Forum

On July 19, 1972, a source advised that the Friday Night Socialist Forum (FNSF) or "Militant Forum" as it is sometimes called, is a name used by the Detroit, Michigan, Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) in sponsoring forums, socials and other functions which are open to the public. Primarily, FNSF pertains to weekly public forums held at SWP Headquarters, 3737 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, for the purpose of spreading propaganda of the SWP, developing contacts, facilitating recruitment of members into the SWP, and presenting subjects of a controversial nature in the social, political and economic fields. Usually speakers are members of the SWP and they give the Socialist viewpoint of the subject discussed. The money collected at these FNSFs goes into the SWP treasury in Detroit.

The source advised some bulletins that are distributed by the SWP advertise the forums as being "Militant Forums" depending upon the speaker and to entice some of the more radical students from the campuses.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

STUDENT MOBILIZATION COMMITTEE

NATIONAL STUDENT MOBILIZATION COMMITTEE

A source advised on May 16, 1969, that the Student Mobilization Committee (SMC) originally grew out of the National Student Strike for Peace Conference held in Chicago, Illinois, on December 28-29, 1966, which resulted in a call for massive antiwar demonstrations in New York City and San Francisco, California, on April 15, 1967. The National Student Strike for Peace Conference was originally called by the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), and the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), culminating in a takeover by the SWP element in the Summer of 1968 and the CPUSA element withdrawing. Source further advised that the SMC locally and nationally is controlled by the SWP and its youth arm, the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA), as evidenced by the YSA leadership and participation in SMC activities.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

A report of the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, Ninetieth Congress, First Session, dated March 31, 1967, entitled "Communist Origin and Manipulation of Vietnam Week (April 8-15, 1967)," on page 53, states in part, "Communists are playing dominant roles in both the Student Mobilization Committee and the Spring Mobilization Committee."

A second source advised on November 16, 1970, that the New York Regional Office of the SMC was located at 15 East 17th Street, Second Floor, New York, New York, where "The Student Mobilizer" is published. "The Student Mobilizer" is self-described as being published by the National Office of the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam. Source stated that the program of the SMC continues as follows: immediate and unconditional withdrawal of all United States troops from Vietnam, an end to the draft, an end to all forms of campus complicity with the war in Vietnam,

self-determination for Vietnam and black America, and constitutional rights for GI's and high school students. 2.

A third source advised that the National Office of the SMC is in the process of moving to Room 1122, 1346 Connecticut Ave., N.W., Washington, D. C.

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## APPENDIX

### STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as commonly known, came into existence at a founding convention held during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan. In the 1960s, it functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States.

From an initial posture of "participatory democracy," SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position. Shadings of Marxist-Leninist ideology became predominant during 1968-1969, with debate centering on how best to create a revolutionary youth movement. During the 1960s, SDS moved from involvement in the civil rights struggle to an anti-Vietnam war position and to advocacy of a militant anti-imperialist line linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa, and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States.

Internal factionalism developed within SDS during 1968-1969 with the following three factions developing as a result of a split during the SDS National Convention in June, 1969: Weatherman; Worker Student Alliance (WSA); and Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM). The Weatherman and RYM are no longer affiliated with SDS, whereas the WSA continues to use the name SDS.

Until the Weatherman closed the SDS National Office in February, 1970, it was maintained at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois; however, WSA has its national headquarters in Chicago and continues to use the name SDS.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY/WORKER  
STUDENT ALLIANCE FACTION

During the June, 1969, National Convention of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) held in Chicago, Illinois, a split arose between members aligned with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and those supporting the faction in control of the National Office. The National Office faction later became known as the Weatherman.

From late Summer of 1969 until December, 1970, the PLP-oriented faction of SDS maintained its National Office in Boston, Massachusetts. This faction instituted a campaign to build a Worker Student Alliance (WSA) or a Campus Worker Student Alliance. Although this faction is often referred to as WSA, it has emerged as the only remaining national SDS organization.

Shortly after the Students for a Democratic Society/Worker Student Alliance (SDS/WSA) National Convention in Chicago in December, 1970, the National Office was moved to Chicago. During the 1970 National Convention a confrontation occurred between the PLP-oriented leadership and various caucuses opposed to PLP domination of SDS/WSA. This confrontation left the PLP-oriented leadership in complete control of SDS/WSA.

The SDS/WSA currently maintains its National Office at 1225 South Wabash, Chicago. The official publication of SDS/WSA, "New Left Notes," is printed in Chicago.



APPENDIX

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

"The New York Times," city edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the Progressive Labor Party (PLP), which had been known as the Progressive Labor Movement.

According to the article, the Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1964 by Milton Rosen and Mortimer Scheer after they were expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for assertedly following the Chinese communist line.

A source advised on June 3, 1968, that the PLP held its Second National Convention in New York City, May 31-June 2, 1968, at which time the PLP reasserted its objective of the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

The source also advised that at the Second National Convention, Milton Rosen was unanimously re-elected National Chairman of the PLP and Levi Laub, Fred Jerome, Jared Israel, William Epton, Jacob Rosen, Jeffrey Gordon, and Walter Linder were elected as the National Committee to lead the PLP until the next convention.

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a quarterly magazine, and "Challenge-Desafio," a biweekly newspaper.

Source advised on June 3, 1971, that the PLP utilizes an address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn, New York, and also utilizes an office in Room 617, 1 Union Square West, New York, New York.

APPENDIX

REVOLUTIONARY YOUTH MOVEMENT

A source advised that the Revolutionary Youth Movement II (RYMII) faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) held a national conference at Atlanta, Georgia from November 26 to 30, 1969. At this conference it was decided to form a new organization to be known as Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), characterized as a mass anti-imperialist youth organization, said organization being proposed as separate and distinct in form and content from SDS. The "Principles of Unity" adopted by the conference included a struggle against white supremacy and male supremacy; fights against imperialism, anti-communism, fascism and oppression of youth; and support of the right of self-determination of all "oppressed nations," also support of the right of all "oppressed and exploited" peoples "to armed self-defense." It was agreed that RYM would not be a Marxist-Leninist organization; however, source said this was decided in order to indicate an organization broad enough in form to be acceptable to everyone. A temporary National Steering Committee (NSC) made up of eight females and two males was elected to govern RYM until national officers could be elected during the spring of 1970.

RYM publications have listed the RYM National Office (NO) at Post Office Box 5421 and Post Office Box 77012 C, both Atlanta, Georgia, and a second source has advised that the NO has no office space but would probably be considered as located at Apartment 27, 1967 Alta Avenue, Northeast, Atlanta.

Second source advised that women dominated the founding conference and have continued to dominate NSC meetings to the point that "women's liberation" has apparently become the RYM's principal issue - also that RYM's poor financial condition has resulted in its failure to publish a paper. During early 1970, RYM has decided to cater to the working class rather than youth, since the potential for social revolution lies in workers.

A third source has stated that it was decided at the March, 1970, NSC meeting that RYM women had decided the organization will be molded into a "working class, Marxist-Leninist, revolutionary, anti-imperialist, pro-black nationalist, people's women's liberation organization."

## APPENDIX

### WEATHERMAN

Initially called the "Action Faction," Weatherman came into being immediately before the June, 1969, Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) National Convention. At this National Convention, Weatherman won all three national officer positions and a majority of the National Interim Committee as well. Subsequently, it took over the SDS National Office in Chicago, Illinois, and controlled its funds, paper, and national records. Although internal struggle existed until late 1969, Weatherman for all major purposes controlled SDS nationally from June, 1969, until its National Office closed in February, 1970. At this time, it no longer considered itself part of SDS.

The term Weatherman emerged from an ideological paper prepared by its leaders entitled "You Don't Need a Weatherman to Know Which Way the Wind Blows." ("New Left Notes," June 18, 1969) This statement outlined the basic stance of Weatherman: Marxist-Leninist in content but with strong advocacy that action, not theory, would bring about revolution in the United States. This posture was complemented with an international identification with the Cuban revolution and Castro's statement that the duty of a revolutionary is to make revolution.

During October, 1969, Weatherman riots in Chicago resulted in more than 260 arrests for mob action and related charges. A program of armed struggle was adopted during a December, 1969, "War Council" wherein terrorist tactics and political assassination were contemplated. The basic strength of Weatherman was then revealed to be some 300-500 nationally, and geographically apportioned to the Midwest, New York, and some to the Northwest.

As its rhetoric of violence escalated, Weatherman leaders increasingly discussed the necessity of an underground operation wherein more than 90 per cent of the organization

would be submerged; "affinity groups" of three-five members would function independently. In February, 1970, Weatherman leaders announced a program of "strategic sabotage" with police and military installations as primary targets.

In February, 1970, Weatherman abandoned the SDS National Office, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois, and throughout the country entered an underground status.

APPENDIX

NATIONAL PEACE ACTION COALITION

On October 7, 1970, a source made available a copy of "An Open Letter To All College Students" from National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC) dated October 6, 1970, which self-described NPAC as an umbrella organization formed at the Student Mobilization Committee (SMC) National Emergency Conference against Cambodia-Laos-Vietnam War held at Cleveland, Ohio, on June 19-21, 1970, to unite all antiwar forces in the struggle to immediately end United States involvement in Southeast Asia. One aim of NPAC is to gain the support of labor forces.

NPAC Headquarters is located at 2102 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, with branch offices located in major United States cities.

A second source on October 11, 1970, made available a copy of a paper entitled "Organizing Local Peace Action Coalitions," published by NPAC, 2102 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland. The paper states that the basic objective of NPAC is to involve masses of people, including labor unions, GI's and the black community in the struggle to end United States intervention in Indochina through orderly and peaceful tactics. These tactics include building mass demonstrations and national conferences, distributing leaflets, selling literature, organizing forums and fund-raising activities, and testifying at state legislative hearings.

A third source, on May 6, 1971, advised NPAC was formed and made operational by members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). NPAC is heavily influenced by SWP leadership nationally and is a recruiting ground for this organization.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Records, Supreme Court of Ohio, Columbus, Ohio, show PAUL LODICO arrested 9/29/64, Bowling Green, Ohio, and convicted of selling the "Young Socialist" magazine, in violation of city ordinance. The conviction was upheld by the Wood County, Ohio, Court of Appeals, 9/9/66. Records show conviction was reversed by Ohio Supreme Court, 7/12/67.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION:

On April 16, 1973, records of the Supreme Court of Ohio, Columbus, Ohio, were made available by SAMUEL ADKINS, Clerk, Office of the Clerk of Supreme Court of Ohio, which disclosed the following:

PAUL LODICO and THADD, D. BEEBE were arrested September 29, 1964, by the Bowling Green, Ohio, Police Department, while selling publications on the Campus of Bowling Green State University. LODICO was selling the "Young Socialist Organizer," a publication of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA), of which LODICO was a member. BEEBE was selling "The Militant." Both defendants were charged with violating Chapter 723 of the Municipal Ordinance of Bowling Green, Ohio, which requires the obtaining of a license from the Safety Director before selling or offering for sale goods, wares or personal services. The charge against BEEBE was dismissed, but LODICO was convicted.

Characterizations of the Young Socialist Alliance, "The Young Socialist Organizer" and "The Militant" appear in the Appendix to this report.

The conviction of LODICO was upheld by the Court of Appeals, Wood County, Ohio, September 9, 1966.

Volume II, "Ohio State Reporter," second edition, page 135, records the fact that on July 12, 1967, the Supreme Court of Ohio reversed the conviction of the defendant and reversed the findings of the lower courts.



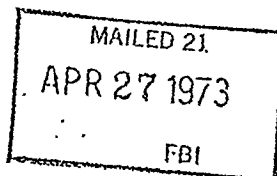
