SPECIAL OPERATIONAL

WPA REPORT (INTERNAL SECURITY)
(Also see report, WPA 7-1-50)

1. Subject was born in Vienna, Austria, on 5 January 1920, to
Karl H. H., the father of Bill, and Rosa (nee [unclear]), the
mother of [unclear], high school graduate, who attended school in Vienna, and at
18, went to the United States to live with a great-grand-
mother.

2. The family moved to Berlin, Germany, in the following year with the family,
and on returning to Vienna, met Robert [unclear], whom she married in 1940.
The couple went to Berlin where [unclear] was editor of a Communist paper.
Subject played on the German stage for about 2 years. After three years
of married life (during which time she had become a Communist and had
been active in Communist Party work) she and [unclear] separated.

3. Shortly thereafter, she fell in love with Dr. Julius [unclear],
an American doctor, who came to Berlin in 1945. A Communist, [unclear] was
editor of a book publishing company, "Kultur Verlag," a known
Party left-wing publishing firm, under the influence of the Communist
Party. In 1946 Subject divorced [unclear] and married [unclear] for whom
she had been working several years prior to their marriage.

4. Subject and [unclear] went to Paris after their marriage and
then to the U.S., arriving in the U.S. in [unclear]. After a brief stay in
New York, they went to San Francisco and lived with [unclear] and
[unclear] who returned to [unclear] village, New York, where they resided
with [unclear] Communist. In January, 1950 the couple returned to Berlin, to
[unclear], where [unclear] worked for the Institute of Social Re-
search.
