- 1. Transmitted herewith are the following:
  - A. A five-page report of HCCDLUS's interrogation of Harry Alfons SUNDVIK on 25 April 1961
  - B. A two-page memorandum from SENDVIK covering points he had forgotten during the interrogation
- 2. When reading the attached interrogation report, there are a number of points to be noted. First of all, SCHETK's first story was a lie and it was only when he was pressed by ROODINE that he hade any mention of his meetings with KLIROV. Therefore, this story could be only the second line of defense and not a true story of their relationship. Second, the story does not attempt to explain why, when SCHEVIK had a week off from work (from historiay, 8 April to Sunday, 16 Appil), he only spent the four middle days on his trip instead of utilizing the rest of his time. Third, why ALIBOV persisted until the last moment and made arrangements to see SCHEVIK again socially in helsinki if he had really "lost his grip" to SUNDVIK's superior arguments and hostile attitude as SUNDVIK states. Anyway, to say the least, we are not ready to accept SUNDVIK's story as it stands. "e has been asked to write out in detail, at least five single-space typewritten pages, the history of his contacts with KLINOV. We will check this paper against the report in hand, for a starter.
- 3. VALINK/6 is being kept informed of the details of this case. He agrees with ROODING that there is a good deal more than has been revealed so far. (By the way, we might mention that this is another case in which VALIAK/6 and the help of the VALINK organization have been invaluable. They have provided full background reports on all concerned, and have been surveilling SUNDVIK off and on ever single we expressed our interest in him.)
- 4. As far as KLIMOV's statements about COSTILLE and MOCDINE got this was only to be expected and does not surprise either of them. For the history of COSTILLE's previous encounters with KLIMOV, see OFHAL4981, 20 Harch 1961.

  ROODINE XXXXXXX has never met KLIMOV.
- 5. The Ambussador, the Counselor, the Security Officer and the Germanl Services Officer (SUNDVIK's immediate boss) are aware of this case. The interrogation took place in the Security Officer's office. Only ROODING and SUNDVIK were present, but FURSTOSS was in the adjoining office listening through the wall.
- 6. We still have not figured out exactly how to handle this case. SUNDVIK will eventually to dismissed, but we would like to get some more information before we let go of him. Anyway, since he has even working at the Embassy since 1949 there is not much to be gained by throwing him out tomorrow. He has volunteered that he will be seeing KLINOV in the next few days to collect the bottle of vodka mentioned on page five of Attachment A, and we would like to hear the story of the meeting. It is jossible that we might ask for assistance to LUFLUTTER SUNDVIK, if this is feasible, since a lot might be learned from this. (SUNDVIK's command of English is excellent, as witness Attachment B, which he prepared by himself.) One thing we do not intend to suggest, and that is a double-agent operation. Considering the position he holds, SUNDVIK's to too langurous to us. We can just imagine KLINOV licking his chops when he first

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checked into 3.NDVIK's background (for partial information, see reference). Here is a Finnian employee of the incrition intusty with ratural access (by the direction of the incritanty to MLIKY's office once a wall or more. 30MDVIK knows all the couriers personally and also has complete information on their schedules. Moreover, the can winder about the immassy offices (except the Station's of course) almost at will. He would have been survised if there main't been any recruitment attempt. We sight point out here that the above does not only apply to 50.00VIK but to several other Finnish employees as well. In this connection, please note the last paragraph of attachment A.

7. One last point: we are at present translating a long report from the VALLES on Harry SUBDVIK's fiance (helkes Tutalkes) and her family. This will be transmitted mext week. We might note, however, that her father, Kalle Edvard \*\*RNTYLR, born 17 harch 1903 in Teisko, is a long-time Communist with an impressive police record.
