checked into SUNOVIK's background (for partial information, see reference). Here is a Finnish employee of the American Embassy with natural access (by the direction of the Americans) to SUNOVIK's office once a week or more. SUNOVIK knows all the couriers personally and also has complete information on their schedules. Moreover, he can wander about the Embassy offices (except the Station's, of course) almost at will. He would have been surprised if there hadn't been any recruitment attempt. We might point out here that the above does not only apply to SUNOVIK but to several other Finnish employees as well. In this connection, please note the last paragraph of attachment A.

7. One last point: we are at present translating a long report from the VALIKS on Harry SUNOVIK's fiancée (hökka Känkä) and her family. This will be transmitted next week. We might note, however, that her father, Kalle Edvard *MANTILA, born 17 March 1903 in Teisko, is a long-time Communist with an impressive police record.
