Knows Finnish rather well (Lohwater). (Subj's Finnish noticeably weaker than Ivan Y. SERGEYEV's (predecessor) (OFHA-2148, (VACCINE/1) O. Speaks only Russian & Finnish according to own statement (OFHA-2419). Source (Lohwater) said Subj stated he had attended secondary school and the "Language Institute." Subj stated he was a Col. in Sov Army during WW II & saw action in Leningrad & Moscow -- was wounded 6 times; Hela is 1st foreign assignment.

When [Lohwater] showed Subj photo of his children, Subj became quite emotional & almost wept. Remarked that he and his wife have wanted to have children for past 6 yrs., but have had no success. Appeared pleasant to source, but after somewhat ruthless interview with some Finn mothers who were begging him to allow return of their sons from USSR, appeared quite stern. Source thought Subj was hard Commie, although he admired the material accomplishments of US. Feels Subj is very much a Sov Commie and is not defectable. Very pleasant and jovial with good sense of humor. Great sense of humor, very quick, very sharp & witty. Constantly refers to self as Ukrainian. Wears double-breasted suits - Western style.

Source did not know which directorate he was in - might be technical section - but knew that he was a "fairly high boss." Source could not recall whether he had ever seen Subj so does not know if this is the same person.
 Early Aug 57, Subj called on [VACCINE/1] & asked that [V/1] warn him in adv. of any Sov official were about to be png'd from Finland & he would personally see to it that the man left quietly & immediately. [V/1] replied in stern & angry manner, "Since when does a little diplomat w/ low rank of 2d Sec presume that he is so powerful as to remove officials of his own country from Finl? If you are really that powerful, who are you anyway & what are your real duties here in Finl?" Subj disturbed did not pursue the question. (Sta Comment: Subj's question interesting in view of [BGMORNING] oper. Trying to determine date of chat.)

CONTACTS Source invited to give lectures on math in USSR. Soon after receiving the invitation, he & wife were in bar of Hells restaurant, where Subj and man RASKE, a Finn Commie, came up to his table & introduced themselves. Subj mentioned source's imminent trip to USSR. Subj told source to come to Sov Emb next day to meet the Cultural Attache, who could arrange to get source to USSR & back without cost. Source invited Subj and RASKE to his home for dinner following Sunday. Both accepted. Subj paid entire bill. When source went Sov Emb next day met Yuriy VORONIN & Subj, also SERGEYEV. V. invited himself to dinner with Subj at source's home. Subj, VORONIN & wives went source's for dinner, bearing many presents. RASKE did not come. Subj told source "this RASKE is a swine." Felt that it necessary to use these Finn Commies politically but that they cannot be trusted.
 Subj had contact w/ Prof [David Hecht] (Fulbright), a Russian speaking research scholar whose interest is 19th century Russia. [Hecht] through Hilliker (Ch/Pol Sec), met Jane Kichline who obtained a report for Hqs. [Hecht] reported that GOLUB very down on the Am Emb & America. Wanted to know about American life in U.S., etc.

Subj had said on the phone that he was leaving for vacation (presumably in 1958) on the 25th of June. [V] was to meet Subj one hour after we left him, that is, at 1500 hrs. He suggested to [V] that he ask Subj about the executions in Hungary (NAGY & associates), but [V] said that the question is a little bit too delicate for him to put to Subj. [V] asked [V] how long Subj would be gone, [V] said he did not know but would try to find out. 7. Subj had asked [VACCINE/1] to try stopping NTS literature sent to Sov officials from Sweden last Spring and told [VACCINE/1] on 21 Jan 58 that the mailings had stopped. [VACCINE/1] when queried by subj said he had talked to two persons in Sweden re this. Subj was profuse in his thanks & said that it is a great step for his career that he will be able to report to Moscow that he has enough influence with [VACCINE/1] to get a job like this taken care of... When subj was asked by [VACCINE/1] "Are you the highest intelligence officer the SU has in Finland?" subj protested that his interests were purely diplomatic and that he had no other than normal consular duties. As an additional comment to the conversation on the NTS matter, subj appeared highly pleased and remarked that Moscow had recently told him that his reporting was far better than anything [VACCINE/1] had done.

Subj invited [VACCINE/1] to lunch with him at 5 Jan 58, and told him how much he knows about what goes on in Finland.

In mid-December, [VAIKELORY/12] told [VARIATION/1] the following which [V/1] passed to station. GOLUB had recently complained to Johannes VIROLAINEN that the Finn security police were not paying any attn to cases of British & American espionage in Finl, adding that the Sovs had info regarding Western espionage in Finl & would be glad to furnish it to the security police. GOLUB said some of the Western cases were old & some new. Did not elaborate. Source did not say what VIROLAINEN's reply was to GOLUB. [V/1] then said it would behoove AIS officers in Hels to be as careful as possible cause it quite possible security police would receive orders to keep their eyes sharply peeled for oper involving Finnish citizens. Pendleton briefed all senior ODEARL people. ODUNIT man said he had rec'd a warning few days earlier from a friendly Finn offer that another ODUNIT offer had been seen too frequently driving a Volkswagen w/dipl plates around freight yards of Hels. (This was ODUNIT's energetic factory & freight car marking program.) The ODOATE man said his family had noticed Finn policeman on the beat outside his house had recently begun to go to phone booth & make a call every time the senior ODOATE man left his house and drove towards town. Everyone took warning seriously. [V/1] to tell us any further developments.

William L. Costello, FBI, attended a luncheon on Wednesday, 10 Dec 58. During the luncheon Costello was introduced as the new Vice-Consul for the U.S. After the lunch they came directly up to Costello, introduced himself and asked C. to join him at this table for coffee and cognac. Subj was extremely friendly and proceeded to ask the usual W-2 type questions, such as Costello's home in the States, how long he's been in Finland, did he have a diplomatic title also, etc. Subj mentioned that his wife was in the Sov Union and that he was living alone in his apartment. Subj speaks no English, so Finnish was used.

On the evening of 10 Sept 58 V's wife was at Bradley's home for dinner and could not resist the urge to bring up the [VAPID] Torreyson case. He had read the interpretation rpt which had been prepared by one of his men and had subsequently talked to BILB on GOLUB's initiative. GOLUB had called him & invited him to lunch and had described the incident at the airport quite factually, but [V/I] placed very little credence in the accuracy of the account. GOLUB said that in view of the fact that the six American athletes were left behind to await visas, he could well understand that Torreyson had needed "VAPID" to the point of exasperation. He does not believe that anything further will come of the case. Certainly the Ministry of Interior plans to forget about it unless a new protest comes from the Soviet Ambassador. GOLUB told [V/I] that [VAPID] had behaved stupidly in the whole affair and has been recalled to the Soviet Union. [V/I] says he has already departed. GOLUB also stated that [VAPID] is a worried and upset man. Apparently the Soviets, or at least GOLUB, do not believe [VAPID]'s full story, acc to [V/I]. The reason for this doubtfulness is that when the slapping incident occurred [VAPID] had been speaking Finnish to Torreyson. GOLUB thought it strange that [VAPID], who speaks Finnish well, should not use that language in speaking to Torreyson, who also has a fair command of Finnish.

Subject, Soviet Consul who replaced P.F. SEMENOV, joined the Helsinki Consular Corps, which had previously had no Sino-Soviet bloc representation in the fall of 1957. Since the Consular Corps is not specifically a "western" body, the Corps had no valid reason to refuse his entry. As far as is known, no other Sino-Soviet bloc representatives have followed OLUB into the Corps.

Regarding Grigory Ye GOLUB whose name came up again [VACCINE/5] reversed his field from last time and said he does think he is up to some funny business and his opinion is based on, 1) the man knew Finnish well when he came here which is unusual among the Soviets, 2) the man is not accredited by the Finnish Foreign Office as Consul anymore than his predecessor, I.E. S. ROMYEV, was. Incidentally, he added that Golub had been advised by the Foreign Office that he was not accredited and should take care of this matter but up to now GOLUB has paid no attention to it.
