RETURN TO CIA
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## IDENTIFYING DATA

1. Subject of this report is a thirty-three-year-old fessile Asserican citizen born in Ponca City, Oklahoma, in August 1927. Subject was previously interviewed on 7 June 1960 under unsatisfactory conditions in that there was not sufficient time to interrogate Subject on reactions to specific questions.

- 2. During the interview with Subject on 7 June 1960, she constantly supplied voluminous information regarding many personalities in Cubs and in the United States, all of whom were involved in the present Cuber situation. It was felt by the interrogator that Subject, because of her position in Cubs, associates, and memouvers, as well as her emotional feelings for the Cuben people and her stated strong belief and love of Fidel Castro's 26th of July Progress, would undoubtedly be a Security risk if another interrogation and polygraph testing could not be afforded.
- 3. It was agreed by all concerned, after review of the entire interrogation of Subject, that there were many present and future Security remifications involving Subject and that as much investigation and research as possible would be done and plans would be made for the undersigned to reinterview and interrogate Subject.
- 4. Before Subject departed in June to return to Cuba, also was advised that the United States Covernment would no doubt want to talk to her as a later date and that she would be advised as to how to go about this. She was also advised that should also so a meed to return to the United States she should do so and was given a means of contact with the appropriate officials on her return to the United States. On 16 September 1960, Subject made the decision to return to the United States. She obtained a two-much have of absence without pay from her superior, Mr. Juan CRTA (NR/IRD), when she gave the understanding that she was coming to the United States to see her father and for a rest. When Subject arrived in New York, she was contacted by JMARC representatives.
- 5. Arrangements were made for Subject to be interrogated by the undersigned and polygraphed at a covert site in moston, Hassackusstts, on or about 11 October 1960.

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#### DETAILS OF THE REPORT

- 1. Subject was interviewed on the 11th and 12th of October in Boston, Essechments. During the afternoon of 11 October 1950, Jubject was interviewed during which time the following portinent information was obtained. Subject began by edvising the undersigned that she was most concerned about what she felt was a breach of Security regarding herself and gave the following information.
- 2. Subject edvised that one Diana ALEXAMERIA (NEVIRD), 120 Fact 72nd Street, Rev York City, New York, made contact with her sometime during the end of September. Subject stated that Diana had obtained Subject's telephone number from the LORENZ family and, upon obtaining her taluptime masher, called Subject. Contact was made with Diana by Subject; and since tist time, they have had several social engagements with each other. During these associations with Mana, Subject was advised by Diana that abe had a a sale friend who was seeing her frequently that worked for CIA. This male friend, Dick DAKINIA (NR/IND), had told Diona that Jung COME was a very questionable person in the eyes of CIA and that if Diana should have contact with June COES she should be very careful of her. Subject advised that Mana further stated that DABLELS was apparently in love with her and that an intimate relationship was in progress. DASTAIN was inviting her, Diana, on occasions to his home in Connecticut. Diana further advised that this relationship between the and DANIELS and resulted in DANIELS obtaining a secretarial job for her with the welfare organization, MINIO.
- 3. Subject stated that upon hearing this information she was quite concerned and reported this information to her case officer, "Aunt Elizabeth." Approximately two days later, Subject bers Biana again and she advised Subject that she had received a telephone call from Dick DANIELS accusing her of blabbing too such because he had received a telephone call from Washington reading the riot act to him for having told Diana about June CCES.
- h. As a result of this, Subject is confirmed in her our mind that she is in touch with CIA. Up to this time, Subject had only assumed that it was CIA that was in contact with her. Subject, in essence, stated that to her may of thinking this was very poor Security on the part of CIA and she was awared that such an incident as this could happen. Further information and details regarding this specific incident are subject of recording and can be reviewed for more details.
- 5. Subject advised the undersigned of another incident that has caused her great concern. This incident involves estelle SCROLOV (EN/IED), secretary for Doctor I. SHAPPER (ER/IED), living at the Barbison Plaza Botel

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in New York. Doctor I. ShiPPA is a very dear friend of Debject's. He is approximately 70 years of age. Assist stated that she deeply leves Doctor FAPPaR and his wife and has considered then as second parents. Minoe Subject's rature to New York in September/ Satelle SCKCLCV has seen Abject and adviced her that also had been interviewed by representatives of the FRI in their offices located at 69th and 3rd Street, New York City. BCHCLOV was interviewed once in Nebruary and the second time sometime thereafter. Estelle, referred to by Dublect as Sasha, adviced Subject that the FAI can interviewing ber told her that June COHS was a dope addlet, a Communist, and involved in an abortion racket. Subject stated that furing her visit in June 1960 she had attempted to contact Doctor SCAPTER and found him very alcof. He later told her that he did not want to have anything to do with her. Since this contact in June, Subject has attempted to deturnine why this very door friend no longer wanted to see her. Since Subject's arrival in September, she has attempted to see Doctor SKAPPE, but he still refuses to have enything to do with her. As a result of the information that Estelle SCKCICV has revealed to Subject, Subject nov knows the recome why Doctor SKAPP.R will have nothing to do with her. Subject is most disturbed and put out as a result of this incident and insists that steps be taken to rectify the defamation of her character; or, at any rate, to confirm in Doctor GLAPPER's mind that she is not considered by the United States Government a person as described by the FBI. As a result of these two incidents, Subject has stated that before she can agree to return to Cuba she wante the records straightened not only to her own satisfaction but to mainly reestablish her reputation with Doctor SHAPPER and also confirm in her father's own wind that she is attempting to perform a vital service for the inited States Government.

- 6. During the interview, Subject subsitted voluntaries information regarding personalities, FICOPP, and FM topics. These matters have been orally reported to kr. Clark SIECON of WH/4. The items mentioned above are subsitted because of their Security resifications. The other operational information gleaned from Subject will be the subject of a separate report and appropriately distributed.
- 7. Subject was given polygraph testing beginning at 1400 hours on 12 October 1960. During the polygraph interview the following questions were presented to Subject, discussed, and then polygraphically presented to her.

- 3. During polygraph testing, Subject had this interregator stop the test to advise him that she could not answer this question (Vil) truthfully without first explaining two things. Pirst Subject admitted that she had at some time in the past, the date she cannot specifically recall, filled out form in the Department of State in which she had sworn that the lost har first passport. Subject stated that she did not lose her first passport; she still has it in her possession. She stated that she manted to keep it for a souwenir and that when she went to the Department of State to report her lose of a passport she had a close friend with her. She said that she felt it would be nest enhanceshing when the Department of State representative said will you please fill out those forms confirming the statement that you lost your passport if she had refused to do so in front of her friend. The stated that this is the reason shy she falsified her statement.

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- 9. Indicat advised that the second thing which the had does and is provenly as undertected crum is giving, as she reported in her provious in terview, a copy of her birth certificate in the case of Viola CODI to her chose friend and associate, ROVILLA, when subject has proviously continued. At this point, obliged advised that as a matter of fact the day that the United States as June CODD. Disject stated that a few days later she heared to her associant that RODALEA had also arrived in her fork at the case custom's point at the airport under the rank of Viola CODD. RODALEA told Subject that the custom's inspector had questioned her as to whether or not she had a sister since another CODD had also arrived that some day.
- 10. Subject was instructed to obtain this birth certificate from ROMAIAA immanate upon mer return to how York and also to submit the original passport which she claims she has lost to Aust\_llimabeth as soon as possible.
- 11. During the testing, Subject stopped the term when confrontial with the question: "Dave you told SCGALDA anything about your contacts with us that you should not have told her?" Subject stated that on her day of departure from New York to meet Aunt Minabeth at the airport she . was under cootional strain because of the Dortor WAFE incident and because of her father's feelings and because, shortly after a phone call from Aunt Clizaboth, she was questioned by MUNICA by a statement didn't know you had an Aust Elizabeth." Subject come back at her in a fit of temper stating 'Ch Desmit, you know I don't have an Aunt Mizabeth. Please leave me alone and don't question me any further." Subject feels thet as a result of this anotional indiscretion, she has indicated to ROWLEA beyond a shadow of a doubt that she is comling with American Intelligence. This is also based on the fact that in Jave, when Subject was first in the United States, she, EGALEA, and L. ANIED attempted to evaluate who was trying to interview Judget. It was the considered opinion of the three that is must be CIA and that Beary was a representative of CIA.

#### CHICHBICA

1. It is the opinion of the undersigned that Subject has not and in not serving Servict or Satellite Intelligence organizations; that she is not serving intelligence organizations of Caba; and that she has not revealed her associations with newbors of this Agency to sembors of the Cuban Government or Intelligence Services.

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- 2. With reference to her sympathies or beliefs in the theories or principles of Communism, it was established during the interview that Subject does not study nor does she make it a point to read Communist periodicals or publications. She was asked specifically: "Do you know and understand the besic theories and principles of Communism?" Subject answered that she did not, and it is believed that this is a trutiful answer. Subject did admit, however, that Castro's famous dissertation "History Will Absolve Me" was besically the inspiration for her to go to Cuba and do what she is doing today. It is, therefore, indicative that Subject's intellectual vain is most sympethetic in this direction. It is felt that Subject is not a masher of the Communist Party; that she is not a leabien, in support of this there is not any indication that she has ever engaged in homosemual activity; and that she is not a dope addict nor has she ever indulged in the use of narcotics.
- 3. It is not believed that Subject has committed any serious undetected crimes other than also has mentioned in the details above; that she is attempting to deliberately hide any information about her pent; that she has ever received any intelligence training; and that she is an intelligence agent for any foreign government.

#### INTERROGATOR'S COMMENTS

- 1. Describe as the undersigned has been requested by Mr. Simmons of BMARC to provide guidance and consultation to Mrs. Pearson of his staff during the contacts that have been made by her in the United States, the following comments are submitted for whatever value they may be worth.
- (1) It is fult that Subject will be considered by the Castro Covernment as an attempt of American penetration into their circles should the return to Caba. This opinion is based on the previous suspicious by the G2 in Cuba of her activities the recorded long-distance telephone calls in Cuba made to her and by her between her and Eccary.
- (2) The utilization of a telegram from her father from New York City in May or June 1960 requesting her to come to New York when her father never left Panca City, Cklehoms. In other words this arrangement was not appropriately backstopped for any possible questioning or surveillance by the Cuben Intelligence.

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(3) The recent revelation by Abject that cortain associates of hers in New York City assume she is in contact with CiA. The persons knowledgeable of this information are in direct contact, as the interregation will reveal, with supprivers of Fidel and the present Cuban Covernment, and there is no way to insure that this information is not or will not be in the hards of the Cuban Intelligence at this time. It is believed that a thorough evaluation of Subject's activation, ideals, and concern for the Cuban people as well as her strong belief in Fidel's original History Will Absolve Me would indicate that Subject is highly susceptible to the Cusamist propagada line; and, in her present frame of sind, she should be considered a person whose beliefs and ideals are far to the left and could be unknowingly to her, a staught follower and supporter of Cusamism. Because of this, it is further believed that Subject could be used as a tool of the Curamists without her knowledge to achieve their means.
