Headquarters Comments

The following report is one of a series containing personality information provided by the source and includes supplemental information from the records of this Agency.

It is requested that the addressees take no action on any of the individuals mentioned in the personality reports without first checking with this Agency.

1. Source identified a photograph of Teudys TRUTIE Matilla as being that of the person known to him as "Teobaldo" (true full name not known to source) and the same individual who was chief, also an instructor, of the Seccion Tecnica (Technical Training Section - ST) in the MI Department (Department of Technical Operational Support) in the Direccion General de Inteligencia (General Directorate of Intelligence - DGI). His offices are located in Marianao.

2. Source described "Teobaldo" as being a Cuban citizen born about 1940. He is about five feet seven inches tall, weighs approximately 135 pounds, and has a slim build. He has a white complexion, light brown hair, a small, straight nose, a slim face, and is clean shaven. "Teobaldo" walks with a slight limp in his left leg and speaks with a nasal twang. 1,2

1. A former Cuban diplomat and Cuban Intelligence (CIS) staff officer who defected in 1963 reported that one Teovaldo TRUTIE (possibly identical with subject), born circa 1938, was a

second lieutenant in the Rebel Army and a member of the CIS training staff. Source was a student in TRUTIE's intelligence course from early December 1962 to late January 1963. Part of the course was conducted in TRUTIE's apartment on the twelfth floor at the corner of Calle 13 and Calle N, Vedado, Habana, Cuba. Source described TRUTIE as being approximately five feet three inches tall, weighing 130 pounds, with fair skin, small black eyes, black hair, thin features, and a slight build. He appeared to be well trained in Communist doctrine.

2. Teudys TRUTIE Matilla was due to transit Mexico enroute to New York City on 15 January 1965 to become the new 2nd Secretary of the Cuban Mission to the United Nations.
