Davidson claims that through his friendliness with the Henriques family he has become acquainted with Vicente Tolodano and is sufficiently close to him to obtain important information concerning activities of the Communist Party in Mexico. He also advised that Vicente Tolodano frequently sees Enrique Henriques and counsels him, which is the basis for his belief that the Communists will eventually infiltrate and take over the Confederation of Cuban Farmers.

Davidson indicated that about six or eight months ago a prominent Communist in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, whose name he did not disclose, also had contacted him and inquired about the possibility of having a Pittsburgh family brought from behind the Iron Curtain. According to him, this Communist in Pittsburgh was acting as the intermediary for a wealthy family in West Virginia and Pittsburgh and that the individuals behind the Iron Curtain were members of this family. Davidson claimed that Herman (S. C.) Henrichs in Cuba advised him that this could be accomplished through his sister in Mexico for \$10,000, and Herman would receive \$2,000 for his part in the transaction. Davidson then advised the intermediary that the family could be raised for \$20,000 but this arrangement was never completed as the family would not pay that sum.
