MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Operations (R. G. ...)  
VIA: Deputy Chief, NY/SA (H. C. ...)  
SUBJECT: Handling of NY/SA Operations

1. During a meeting with Mr. [redacted], Mr. [redacted], Mr. [redacted], Mr. [redacted] and Mr. [redacted], Mr. [redacted] reviewed the following points concerning the handling of the NY/SA operations. These points were the subject of earlier discussions by Mr. [redacted] and the various branch chiefs in the Division.

2. Review the subject of Mr. [redacted]'s proposed activities and mandate. A. [redacted] has been:

a. to describe NY/SA's present and to get the information to the appropriate country desks as soon as possible. To run traces, including field traces, and to analyze the results. Traces to be run by NY/SA/CI on Cuban staffs and by the host country desks of Cuban agents in their respective countries.

b. To select the best targets from the individuals identified by Mr. [redacted] and to put them in order of priority, considering the overall time, chance of success, accessibility and personality. The selection of targets to be done jointly by NY/SA/CI and the [redacted] desks.

c. To give consideration to appointing NY/SA/CI agents to refer the Cuban staffs since the staffs are not used, to be without Mr. [redacted]'s desk and to be able to give a greater communication probe in reporting back to NY/SA/CI. The Cuban staffs are now in the [redacted] and are to be transferred, and even transferred, and [redacted] NY/SA/CI.

(2) To use A-100-1 for drawing pictures of selected targets, agents first and staffers second as explained above.

c. To provide a list of names acquired from A-100-1 to the Canadians (A-100-1) who were very cooperative in helping us get the names of J.C. out of Canada and into the United States.

(1) To also ~~provide information~~ ~~to the Canadians~~ since the Canadians have already taken the information, and to prompt them to take any action as we may wish.

(2) To give pertinent information to other services who can help us in locating and identifying targets.

u. Meanwhile, as in the A-100-1 case for the Canadian defector who has provided us with considerable information and has been used in a number of operations, to disseminate appropriate information to the high intelligence community, in the case of personalities, the Confidential Source would consist only of over-type and descriptive data furnished by the Source, including appropriate headquarters traces. We would request information in return in return. (This procedure has been used in the A-100-1 case.)

e. To decide what information we should give the various Latin American services so that the agents could be arrested and interrogated once a reconnaissance approach fails.

1. To work out in cooperation with the CI and C-1 staffs what can be done in the event it may be useful at some future date to produce A-100-1's distribution by releasing certain information to the press or by possibly having him appear before the organization of American states.

3. The above represents a general outline of what our overall planning has been in connection with the A-100-1 case since its original move to the United States. The role of the various units would be to analyze and coordinate the overall aspects of the operation and to see that all material actions taken by any one interested department since that time have been done along correct methods in the operation.
