On 6/7/65, MIKHAIL STEFAN SOLOVIEV, Translator, Institute of Modern Languages, Incorporated, 1322 18th Street, N. W., advised SA W. SCOTT JARRETT, JR. that during 1946-47 while a displaced person at Salzburg, Austria, he was the editor of an anti-communist publication called the "Flame."

SOLOVIEV recalled that during this time subject was on the staff of this publication and contributed anti-communist articles designed to discourage displaced persons from returning to Russia. SOLOVIEV commented that the Russians in the Soviet Sector made strong protests to the Americans regarding these publications.

SOLOVIEV stated that in about 1948 subject immigrated to Chile. SOLOVIEV did not know subject prior to 1946-47 and knows nothing of his background prior to this time. SOLOVIEV subsequently immigrated to the U. S. and did not hear of or from subject until about two years ago when he corresponded with the subject. During this correspondence subject asked him if he would recommend that subject come to the U. S. SOLOVIEV told him it would not be easy but that he would find a place.

SOLOVIEV stated that after immigration to U. S. and while subject was at the University of Maryland, about two years ago, he had occasion to meet and talk with subject. At this time subject stated he had been associated with the University of Chile in research work as a Professor of Physics. SOLOVIEV also understood that subject did research work for the Government of Brazil and would spend three or four months a year in Brazil on this research.

SOLOVIEV again saw subject in March, 1965, at which time subject stated he was working in Cleveland. Subject commented he enjoyed his work but was somewhat remorseful that he is the oldest man in the project.

As a result of his association with the subject, SOLOVIEV was of the opinion subject is strongly anti-communist, hated the communist system and most certainly would have no association or connection with organizations attempting to repatriate persons to the USSR. He stated he felt certain subject would report to the FBI any contacts or approaches which might be made to him by Soviet intelligence personnel or otherwise.

By way of background SOLOVIEV was associated with [redacted] in Washington, D. C., and overseas [CS] for a period of about nine years since the 1950's.
