On 4/24/69, [STEMT] advised that on 4/8/69 former NY 2524-S telephonically contacted LIN, advising LIN that he had recently seen a New York Times article dealing with possible restoration of China-Canada Relations and in which LIN's name appeared and he wished to interview LIN. By way of documentation, former NY 2524-S advised LIN that he had interviewed CHOU En-lai in New Delhi in 1955 and he was personally acquainted with SZENIO KUNG, a New China News Agency representative in Hong Kong. Former NY 2524-S was advised by LIN to contact him later at which time he would have a definite answer. On 4/18/69, former NY 2524-S recontacted LIN, telephonically, at which time LIN stated that he would not submit to an interview however, he would be very much interested in talking to former NY 2524-S. A luncheon date with former NY 2524-S was set for April 29, 1969, at the faculty lounge at McGill University, Montreal, Canada.

On 4/29/69, [REDACTED] contacted WFO and advised as follows:

On 4/29/69, he met with PAUL LIN at the faculty lounge at McGill University, Montreal, Canada, as previously arranged through telephonic contact with LIN. (He had been furnished LIN's name by [REDACTED] and prior to that had never heard of LIN.) He spent approximately two hours with LIN and LIN was very receptive and friendly towards [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] indicated his desire of visiting the China Mainland, possibly during the October celebrations; however, LIN suggested that [REDACTED] may not have to wait that long. LIN suggested that a letter be directed to CHOU En-lai indicating his desires. When [REDACTED] suggested that the letter may never reach CHOU if sent directly, LIN suggested the possibility of sending it through the Chinese Embassy, Paris. [REDACTED] suggested that it

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
