CIA CONTACTED NIGHT OF MAY 4 RE THEIR VIEW TOWARD INTERVIEW
 OF SUBJECT RODRIGUEZ BY BUAGENTS. CIA BELIEVES [THE FUTURE
 VALUE OF THEIR SOURCE, LUIS POSADA] WOULD PROBABLY BE LOST
 AND NEGATIVE RESULTS OBTAINED IF RODRIGUEZ INTERVIEWED. CIA
 UNABLE TO CONTACT [POSADA] AS OF 9:30 PM, MAY 4, BUT WILL PROMPTLY
