On 1 January Mr. FIDEL CASTRO granted an interview by telephone to a newsman from the ABC radio and television network. The Cuban leader repeated that he hoped to normalize relations between his country and the United States, and he added: "Henceforth it is up to the United States to take a step in that direction." Mr. CASTRO stated that. "until the tragic death of President KENNEDY," he thought that "the normalization of Cuban relations with the American administration was possible." While acknowledging that public opinion in the United States is still hostile to Cuba and wants the naval blocade of the island strengthened, he appeared "full of hope" as to the future of his relations with President JOHNSON.
